# FILM STUDIO: IT'S A WRAP

## Silvercup North opens in Port Morris

In recent weeks the Bronx has been the focus of media attention for its past, with the critically-acclaimed Netflix hit series 'The Get Down,' which follows a fictional aspiring rapper in the tumultous Bronx of 1977.

But last week the borough got an investment in its media future, as Silvercup Studios expanded from its longtime home base in Long Island City with a \$35 million facility in Port Morris at 295 Locust Avenue.

Silvercup management was joined by Governor Cuomo, Council Speaker Carl Heastie and Bronx Borough President Ruben Diaz. Jr. and other city and state leaders at a Wednesday. August 17 ribbon cutting ceremony at the site.

Diaz said his borough had historically not benefitted from the film industry, and had long been portrayed in a negative light by Hollywood.

"The film industry is booming in the city and the state thanks to the tax credits," Diaz said. "But the reality is, for too many years, the Bronx has not participated in that," he said. "Recently though, you've seen shows like Gotham, Boardwalk Empire, working with the state, and more and more the film industry is looking at us to film not only in our streets, but in this 115,000-squarefoot studio thanks to the Suna brothers."

Cuomo told those on hand the Bronx, like the other outer

borough, struggled for years as manufacturing jobs left.

Those struggles had often been overlooked as Manhattan prospered, he added.

But the film industry was among the businesses helping to replace those lost jobs, he said.

"The Bronx is back," he said. "This is a much different place."

The new facility, dubbed Silvercup North, features four production studios with 50-foot-high ceilings that can accommodate two-story sets.

The building also houses on-site production offices, grip and lighting departments and prop and wardrobe storage ar-

## WW II soldier's rifle to return from France

roots is looking forward to reconnecting with a part of their family's military past.

Bronx native Jimmy Farrell is awaiting the return of an M-1 rifle that belonged to his uncle Martin Teahan who served in World War II as part of the 508 Parachute Infantry Regiment (PIR).

Teahan, an Irish-American, was killed on June 6, 1944 in Picauville, Normandy after he had been scouting a position.

After his capture, a German soldier killed him.

A family with south Bronx nel Patrick Collet, a French Army Paratrooper commander, contacted his sister Liv Teahan on March 17, St. Patrick's Day, to let them know the uncle's rifle was recovered.

"It was the luck of the Irish," Farrell said with a laugh.

Collet, while visitng a French farmer, had noticed that a rifle the farmer had was engraved with the name "Martin Teahan".

He then made an effort to contact the family.

Farrell, who served in the


Farrell, 60, said Colo- U.S. Army from 1974-1977. said that in June he and his wife Monica visited the colonel in Normandy and got a chance to hold the rifle.

"I felt the cold metal of the weapon on my fingertips, and envisioned my uncle, bravely marching forward through enemy territory," said Far-

Afterwards, Farrell said he and his wife got a chance to visit Teahan's grave site where they met U.S. Army Chief of Staff General Mark Milley.

# 49th Pct. honors child who lost parents

The 49th Precinct recently held an event for a boy who lost both of his parents during a murder-suicide.

On Thursday, August 18, the 49th Precinct honored sevenyear-old Tyrone Lowe, Jr. with a Disney-themed surprise party after losing his mother and father over a week's span back in December.

Tyrone arrived at the precinct in a squad car and was greeted by fellow officers, community leaders and Mickey Mouse and Minnie Mouse.

Following the warm welcome, all in attendance stepped inside the precinct for the ceremony, which included a moment of silence for his late parents, Shoshane Rattigan and Tyrone Lowe, Sr., and statements by the 49th Precinct along with other neighborhood advocates who showed that they were on Tyrone's side after experiencing the two horrendous incidents.

The precinct also allocated \$5,000 towards Tyrone's college scholarship fund, as well as announced that they were sending him and his aunt

to Disneyland for an entire week.

The money was raised by local donations through social media.

"The 49th Precinct worked extremely hard to put this event together - and with it, we wanted to create a brand new life start for Tyrone," said captain Keith Walton, commanding officer for the 49th Pre-

cinct.

"Tyrone is a bright kid and there was nothing better at this event than seeing him happy," said community affairs officer David Lepore. "We (the 49th Precinct) decided to provide him and his aunt with the opportunity to go to Disney World. This is only a stepping stone for what we hope to do for him and other kids who

face similar situations in the future."

John Marano, a neighborhood advocate and former NYPD officer who aided troubled youth in Harlem by taking them to New York Yankee games and other festivities said, "Tyrone will remember all of the assistance he received from the 49th Precinct, and that will help him make

the right choices in life despite what has happened to him."

"You have godmothers and godfathers here at the 49th Precinct for the rest of your life - we all love you, Tyrone," said Tony Vitaliano, chairman of Community Board 11.

When asked about what he was looking forward to the most when he goes to Disneyland, Tyrone replied that he was most excited to go on the slides, the rides, and interact with the Disney characters. He also said he was looking forward to singing Disney songs on his trip.

On the morning of Tuesday, December 1, the precinct responded to the shooting of Rattigan (Tyrone's mom) at 1570 Bogart Avenue, who was pronounced dead when EMS arrived at the scene.

A week later, after being identified as a suspect, Lowe, Sr. was found dead inside his 2006 Honda Odyssey in the vicinity of Hollers Avenue and Hutchinson River Parkway.

He died from a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head. A handgun was found next to his body.







# CEOs named for Jacobi, North Central hospitals

Jacobi Medical Center and North Central Bronx Hospital have new leadership.

As part of a NYC Health + Hospitals restructuring, both of the public hospitals have new CEOs: Maureen Pode at NCBH and William Foley at Jacobi.

The North Bronx Health Network, which was a structure of the previous administration, is being phased out due to the Affordable Care Act, said

Originally both NCBH and Jacobi had the same leader. Now all NYC Health + Hospitals trauma centers will have their own CEOs, according to officials.

The changes are primary on the administrative level, said Pode.

Pode rose through the ranks as a front line nurse at several hospitals, eventually rising to Deputy Chief Financial Officer within NYC Health + Hospitals.

She assumed her current role on Monday, August 15.

"It is an honor and it is very humbling as well," she said about being selected as the CEO after serving as the acting CEO for months.

Pode's been a nurse for more than 30 years, and said she has had a very exciting career with mentors that have helped her move up the ladder.

## Soundview native showcases popular sneaker collector





# Broadway dancer charged in boyfriend's murder

A man charged in the Friday, August 19 strangulation murder of his boyfriend in the Bronx took to Facebook in the immediate aftermath of the violence with a series of posts that amounted to a cryptic confession of sorts.

"Forgive me father," Marcus Bellamy, a 32-year-old Broadway dancer. wrote at 3:57 p.m. that afternoon, just moments after he allegedly killed Bernardo Almonte, Jr., 27, whom the Daily News reported Bellamy told police was his boyfriend.

Forgive me. I did it because I love you. I love you all. I loved him also. He told me love and hate are the same emotion. Forgive me. I know not what I do. I did it for love. For god. On high. Marcus Bellamy

That post was followed in rapid succession by the following posts:

As of Tuesday, August 23, the Bronx district attorney's office had not yet indicted Bellamy.

Florida-born Bellamy was a backup dancer in the Broadway production of 'Spider-Man, Turn Off the Darkness,' and was in the ensemble of the 2006 production of 'Tarzan.' He also danced in the NBC show 'Smash,'

and the films 'Across the Universe' and 'A Midsummer Night's Dream.'

In the early morning of August 19, between 12 and 15 hours before the killing, Bellamy also made a series of bizarre and also cryptic Facebook

At 12:43 a.m., he wrote, "About a month ago.. God sent a thought to me. The thought continued to reoccure [sic] in my mind ... So. Now.. I am ... Asking god .. To let me know. If it's true.. God said to me not to worry about Donald Drumpf being elected into presidency.. Because he will pass away before the voting happens. He will pass away from an illness that no amount of money or medication will be able to save him from. That's what god said to me.. If it will happen.. I don't know. God"

About three hours later, he wrote, "I don't need to do anything. All I need to do is be. God will work out all the details. #relax#earthquake"

And then, at 4:12 a.m., he wrote, "Trust me. This is just the beginning. Of a whole new world."

In a written statement, Beverly Tillery, executive director of the New York City Anti-Violence Project, said, "We are deeply saddened by the homicide of Bernardo Almonte, and send our condolences to his friends and loved ones."







# **Tenants continue fight with Woodmansten landlord**

Residents at the Woodmansten building, 1541-51 Williamsbridge Road, are continuing their battle with real estate mogul Mark Scharfman.

On Monday, August 22, residents presented their complaints to Senator Jeff Klein's office as his representatives went door to door in the building.

Tenants have been upset by recent intrusive repairs and subpar apartment conditions for which they blame the landlord.

Resident Ann Ryan met with the representatives.

Ryan called Scharfman "a criminal" and said she can't understand how he keeps getting away with his crimes.

The landlord received a violation earlier this summer after Scharfman allegedly lied on a NYC Department of Buildings application for repairs - including electrical and plumbing work - to apartments in the building.

On the application, it stated that the 125-unit building was neither rent stabilized or rent controlled.

In addition, it stated there was no one living in the apartments.

Despite DOB's violation, work continued.

According to tenants association leader Paulette Sorg, after the violation was issued the landlord filed a corrected application.

Regardless, some residents don't trust the workers the landlord sends.

Prior to starting work in the building, Scharfman's employees told residents they must be home to let workers complete the work.

In addition, residents have been threatened with lawsuits if they choose not to let workers in their apartment.

Ryan and Sorg are among some of the residents who, nevertheless, have chosen not to let the workers into their apartment. Sorg.

Some residents are not as bold, but are still upset with the shoddy work that has been done.

One couple, who chose not to give their name, have a toddler at home who was present while some of the plumbing work was done.

They said the dust from the work was dangerous for their daughter.

They had a representative from the city's health department inspect their home.

In addition to issues with recent repairs, Sorg - a resident of the building for more than 70 years - said there are other long standing issues with the building.

For example, Shavonne Miller, a teacher in Brooklyn, said the elevator continues to be a problem in the building.

According to Miller, at times a resident will leave the building with a working elevator, go shopping, then be forced to carry their groceries up the stairs since the elevator has stopped functioning.

In addition, she said when the elevator breaks down residents leave their trash near the elevator until it works again.


Sometimes, she said, the trash sits in the hallways for days.

She added the building's conditions have caused some to move and five apartments have been vacated on her floor in the three years she's been a resident.

Representatives from Klein's office say they will return for one more visit to canvas apartments then will call a tenant meeting later this year.

Klein has already pushed for an investigation by the NYC Housing Preservation and Development department into the building.

"I am committed to ensuring that these tenants live in dignity and in the peace that they deserve," said Klein.

# Our Perspective Eliminate Tip Credit for Car Wash Workers

ar wash workers in New York City – or "carwasheros," as they call themselves – have made great strides since their campaign to unionize began in 2012. Hundreds of carwasheros at 10 car washes have won the dignity and respect that comes with union membership.

Union contracts have given carwasheros – for the first time – paid time off, the ability to return to their home countries for visits and have their jobs protected, and guaranteed wage and benefit improvements.

But throughout New York State, the so-called "tip credit" threatens to continue to undermine progress that workers are making in the car wash industry.

The tip credit is a part of New York State minimum wage law that allows industry operators to pay car wash workers a different, lower minimum wage. In theory, workers' tips are supposed to make up the difference, and possibly more. And, if workers' tips don't raise the level of pay to at least the minimum wage, car wash employers are supposed to make up the difference in additional hourly wages.

In actual practice, it's a flawed system that enables wage theft and contributes to systemic underpayment of car wash workers — exactly what the car wash unionizing campaign and carwasheros have been fighting against. Investigations have shown that employers don't always make up the extra pay for workers when tips are short, and carwasheros don't always receive the tips customers presume they are getting. We shouldn't be giving unscrupulous employers additional incentives to underpay their workers.

Earlier this summer, workers at one Queens car wash won a \$130,000 settlement against an owner who was paying below minimum wage, withholding overtime pay, and committing other wage and hour violations. And that's just the latest settlement of many, including one that saw a New York carwash operator pay almost \$4 million in 2014. Wage theft is still rampant in the industry, and the tip credit helps create an environment where it happens.

The Cuomo Administration has done a good job prosecuting wage theft, and helping win justice for workers across New York. But we need to do more. We call upon the Governor and the state legislature to eliminate the car wash tip credit, and bring the base pay for all car wash workers in New York up to the minimum wage.

It's an important move that will show New York's commitment to fighting for worker rights, and protect worker pay.

# Bronxchester Houses see results from PACT program

Residents at 520 E. 156th Street are seeing the results of the NYC Housing Authority's Permanent Affordability Commitment Together, or PACT, program.

It is based on President Obama's Rental Assistance Demonstration program.

The program is a way for NYCHA to make improvements to public housing and obtain funding for those improvements.

One portion of the PACT program is partnering with private companies to renovate Section 8 housing.

At the property known as the Bronxchester Houses, NYCHA partnered with L+M Development.

NYCHA chairwoman Shola Olatoye said these types of partnerships provide funding and resources to the department that they would otherwise not have.

At this particular building, upgrades are noticeable as soon as residents step into the building.

The walls no longer have a yellow cinderblock look.

Instead, they look tiled with brush-strokes of gray and white paint.

In addition, pipes in the hall-ways are no longer green but are now painted white.

In the apartments, residents now have central air. In addition they have energy efficient stoves and new cupboards.

In the bathrooms there have also been upgrades to the showers and sinks.

Olatoye said some of the buildings in the program have not been upgraded for more than 30 years.

Patricia Lamonde, tenant association leader and 33-year resident of the Bronxchester houses echoed Olatoye's sentiments.

She emphasized the word 'years' when asked how long residents had been waiting for repairs.

Lamonde also beamed at Bronxchester's new outdoor facilities, saying the neighbors in the apartments next door are now trying to get over to her building to use those facilties.

Previously in the back of the building, there was mainly cracked concrete slabs. In addition there was only one slide for the kids to play

Now, there is a green space in the center of the new facilities. Also, there are new swings and a basketball court with bleachers.

Lisa Gomez, chief operating officer at L+M Development, said she knows that at times it can be a scary situation for residents when they hear a new developer and new management is coming to their building.

She said 'it is natural' for them to be anxious about change.

However, the company is 'proud' when they see families enjoying the new facilities such as the renovated courtyard and community garden.

Gomez also said she had met some of the residents who were skeptical of the plan.

She said now those residents are "extremely supportive" and pleased with the finished product.

Gomez, like Olatoye, believes the Bronxchester renovations are a picture of what a public/private partnership can achieve.

NYCHA is hoping to upgrade 5,200 units across the Bronx, Manhattan and Brooklyn within the next three to four years.

Currently, NYCHA is working to upgrade 1,400 units at the Ocean Bay Apartments in Averne.

# FVCP worry about Tibbetts Brook's water pollutants

The mysterious source of pollution emptying into Van Cortlandt Park brook has advocates for the park searching for answers.

The Friends of Van Cortlandt Park reported to the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation what they believe to be an 'illicit discharge' of fecal bacteria into Tibbetts Brook from a pipe just north of the park in Westchester County.

As part of their ongoing weekly testing of the water quality in the brook, which runs from Yonkers and pools in Van Cortlandt Lake, FVCP personnel said they have found very high levels of fecal coliform, bacteria found in the stomachs of mammals, just downstream from the

The levels are well above U.S. Environmental Protection Agency standards, according to their tests.

They have also observed a detergent-like, green-blue substance being discharged through the pipe.

The four-foot pipe is less

than a mile from the park, said John Butler, FVCP ecological project manager, just off the South County Trail for biking and walking, near Lawton Street in Yonkers.

A DEC spokeswoman stated that they are "working with the City of Yonkers to investigate this discharge and develop a plan of action to address the situation."

A NYC Parks Department spokesman said that the agency is currently investigating the pipe's origination

"We are grateful to Friends of Van Cortlandt Park for their continued work in helping us to care for one of the Bronx's largest and most beloved parks," stated the spokesman.

Christina Taylor, FVCP president, said that eating fish caught in the park is prohibited, but that has not lessened concern about the water qual-

"It is a concern for the health of an ecosystem," said Taylor, adding that Van Cortlandt Lake is an impaired wetland that is not meeting the standards it should.

She said that FVCP is trying to draw attention to the situation as part of an overall effort to raise water quality.

Other discharges are also affecting the water quality, said Taylor.


Among these are possible runoff of fertilizer used at an upstream golf course, runoff from the expressways and parkways, and what could be additional seepage of pollutants near Broadway, said FVCP staff.

FVCP has been continuously monitoring the water in the park on a weekly basis since December 2015.

"Tibbetts Brook is one of the last above ground streams in the city," said John Butler, adding that one of the reasons ongoing testing is necessary is because lake water in the park is 'eutrophic' in summer.

This means that water is so rich in nutrients that the excess plant life deprives animal life of oxygen, according to sources.

"Our concern is that this pipe is pouring bacteria and possibly nutrients into the system, and it could be one of the
















"We have good food there, but people walk by the restaurant and they have no knowledge of our food," Ramos said.

Cabo executive chef Fernando Avelino will offer up a new threecourse prix fixe menu special every night for restaurant week, in addition to the regular menu, Ramos added.

"We have pork chops, we have churrasco skirt steaks, we have salmon a la plancha, a lot of stuff - not just tacos and burritos."

Association technology director Hussein Nouri said the official poster featuring participants would soon be all over the neighborhood.

"We're going to start putting them out in all the neighborhoods and putting them in windows," he said. "We advertise on Facebook and so far we have over 2,000 people who have signed up for our updates."



# CB 10 street co-named for advocate of the disabled

A Waterbury-LaSalle resident who advocated for better services for the developmentally disabled will have his work immortalized with a street co-named in his honor.

NYC Council recently approved the naming of a por-Mayflower Avenue as Alfonse Agovino Sr. Way, commemorating the life of a trailblazing disability advocate who was a long-time volunteer board member at the AHRC.

Councilman James Vacca, who initiated the honor, said that Agovino was defending the rights of the developmentally disabled community at a time when many people did not fully understand the con-

"He was advocating for residents with developmentally disabled people way before it was popular," said Vacca, adding that he got to know Agovino, who he described as a soft-spoken man, when the councilman was Community Board 10 district manager in the 1980s.

Agovino's activism stemmed from his daughter, Elena, who was born in 1957 with cerebral palsy and autism, said his daughter Toni Agovino.

Toni Agovino began the street co-naming process in her father's honor after he passed away in January 2015 after learning more about all the people he helped during his life, she said.

He served as an AHRC board member for 25 years, from 1977 to 2002, and at host of organizations supporting the developmentally disabled, she added.

"Seeing all of his awards in the house, I wanted to have his name live in perpetuity because he advocated for people who cannot help themselves: people like my

"Back then, there was sister," said Toni Agovino, adding that the family's experience with Elena taught them unconditional love and was a blessing.

> Her father served as AHRC board president from 1999 to 2001, and Toni Agovino continues to volunteer as a board member at AHRC today, she said.

> When the fight for services first began, it was a movement, she said.

> "He spoke his mind, fought when he believed in something and he loved unconditionally," said Toni of her father.

In addition to AHRC, he served on the New York State Advisory Council on Quality Care for the Developmentally Disabled, Bronx Developmental Disabilities Service Office Parent Association, Board of Visitors Metro NY, and he received numerous awards.

He served in the U.S. Navy during World War II and was proud of that service, Agovino's daughter said.

## Easco Boilers, early black-owned business, turns 90

#### BY ROBERT CHRIST

Easco Boiler Company 1175 Leggett Avenue, celebrated its 90th year this month, making it one of the oldest black-owned businesses in the country.

At a celebration on Tuesday, August 16, members of the community, including clergy and elected officials, commemorated the company's, that moved from Harlem to the Bronx in 1974, historic anniversary.

Tyren Eastmond, now president of the company, recalls stories he heard from his great grandfather, Arlington Eastmond, who founded the company in 1926. The company was not incorporated until 1948.

Arlington, who was from Barbados, began the company at a time when living in the United States was not comfortable for most African-Americans.

However, Tyren said that did not affect his great grand-father.

He said Arlington had come to the country with little money and was not going to let that stop him.

"He came with the mindset he was going to do something,"

said Tyren.

According to his great grandson, Arlington began making a name for himself by taking boilermaking jobs that no one would else wanted.

Tyren recalled a story about one job in which a man wanted Arlington to build a boiler on a hill.

Tyren said his great grandfather pleaded with the man that this was not a good idea. However, Arlington did it anyway.

In addition, said Tyren, his great grandfather also worked in other difficult environments.

Tyren said these conditions would "discourage most and somehow my great grandfather would go there and say, 'Don't worry I can do it."

Arlington Eastmond Jr, Tyren's grandfather, also known as 'Leon', only recently handed over the reigns to his 32-year old grandson.

Leon said black and Latino communities and residents of the Bronx "deserve a fair chance to work, gain skills and reinvest in their community."

He added elected officials need to create more opportunities for Bronx communities.

Tyren echoed his grandfather's sentiments and said Easco has been "a staple in the black community and a model for the nation." At Easco, there

is an emphasis on investing in their workers.

Some of Easco's employment practices include starting wages of \$15 an hour, job traning for former convicts, and a scholarship fund for people who can't support themselves while learning a trade.

Tyren said "making a better life for the people around us" has been a focal point for the company.

"How do we provide jobs, how do we help the community," are some of the questions Tyren said members of the company ask themselves.


He said the company is like a family.

He recalls that as a kid he worked in the warehouse and in the offices.

Tyren said over the years while the staff watched him grow up he in turn watched the company change their lives.

He adds he's not focused on the pressure of running one of the oldest black-owned companies in the United States.

Instead, he is focused on the "opportunity to empower people" and taking the "focus off yourself and putting it on everyone else."

# Public forum called to empower Bronx Muslims

A public forum was held to empower Bronx Muslims to persevere against fear and discrimination.

Assemblyman Luis Sepulveda and Mayor de Blasio co-sponsored a public safety meeting for the Bronx Muslim community on Monday, August 15 at M.S. 127's auditorium on 1560 Purdy Street.

NYPD and city officials met with local Muslims to discuss public safety and human rights, reporting discriminatory incidents, provide a directory of city services and listen to their input on improving services.

Assemblyman Sepulveda, District Attorney Darcel Clark and Councilwoman Annabel Palma were keynote speakers.

Panelists included Dr. Sarah Sayeed, Mayor de Blasio's senior Muslim advisor; Sapna Raj from NYC Commission on Human Rights; sergeant Lonergan from NYPD Hate Crimes Unit; inspector Fausto Pichardo, 43rd Precinct commanding officer and Marian Taylor-Martinez, NYC Department of Education family leadership coordinator.

The forum was in response to an anti-Muslim hate crime that targeted Bengali Mujibur Rahman on Friday, January 15 by two male teens, ages 14 and 15, who allegedly shouted 'ISIS' while pummeling him.

Coincidentally, the meeting came two days after a Queens mosque imam, Maulama Akonjee, 55, and mosque assistant Thara Uddin, 65, were murdered at Liberty Avenue and 79th Street in Ozone Park and ten days after 49-year-old Muhammad Ali Haider was assaulted on Westchester Square.

A NYPD spokeswoman said, Andrews Hernandez, 20, of 28 Metropolitan Oval, allegedly attacked Haider as he walked with his girlfriend in front of 1570 Overing Street on Friday, August 5

at 10:38 p.m.

Another man and two women were with Hernandez when he punched Haider in the face causing him to fall to the ground, according to the police report.

Haider was rushed to Jacobi Medical Center in critical condition with multiple facial fractures.

Haider's girlfriend was left unharmed, however he remains hospitalized following surgery.

The 45th Precinct arrested Hernandez on Sunday, August 7 and charged him with assault in the second degree.

Hernandez's companions were not charged because the were not aware of his intentions.

Hernandez, who had no prior arrests, was intoxicated at the time, so the assault was not ruled as a hate crime.

Sepulveda explained most crimes against Muslim and Bangladeshi communities go unreported due to language barriers and cultural fear of authority.

"People should be able to practice their religion without fear of retribution or persecution," he expressed.

Dr. Sayeed said the NYPD has increased its outreach with Muslims and has stationed patrols outside of mosques during services.

Sepulveda said Muslim and Bangladeshi residents are interested in creating a neighborhood patrol similar to Morris Park Community Association's Civilian Patrol, to work closely with the 43rd Precinct.

The forum was co-sponsored by Sepulveda's office, the Mayor's Community Affairs Unit, NYC Human Rights Commission, the Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs, 43rd Precinct Community Council, Bangladeshi American Community Council, Bangladeshi American National Democratic Society, Peace December/Islamic Leadership School and Sapna NYC.

# After NYPD rejection, planned patrol to go solo

Last year Country Club resident Niko Kritikos began a fundraising effort for the new 45th Precinct Civilian Observation Patrol to fight petty crime in the area, something he knows about from first hand experience.

We don't want our volunteers doing anything more than if you see something say something.

"I was the victim of a drunk hit-andrun driver," he recalled. "I didn't have any police backup because all five cars on shift were at a shooting in Co-op City. So I was holding down a drunk hit and run driver for hours, and I thought to myself, 'wow we don't have enough resources even though we're the biggest (Bronx) police precinct."

But Kritikos, who runs a surveillance and security company, said that while the 45th Precinct had been supportive of his idea, NYPD brass at 1 Police Plaza decided against supporting any new patrols due to liability

"I had to switch gears," he said. "We're getting our (own) license to become a corporation and we are getting our own insurance and getting everything done privately. The only difference is that we won't be backed by the NYPD, we're not officially trained by the NYPD, we don't get NYPD cards."

Kritikos said he hoped that after a

few years the patrol will be respected enough to make the NYPD change its tune and work with them.

An online fundraising page, www. gofundme.com/CivilianPatrol been established to collect private donations for the endeavor.

Kritikos said most of the patrol work would be overnight, since NYPD Auxiliary Police are not allowed to do patrols after midnight.

"That's when the kids ride around on their bikes stealing car rims and tires and go into people's backyards to steal bikes and change from people's vehicles. That's the kind of little crime that we are focusing on," he said.

Kritikos stressed that patrol members would not be armed.

"We don't want our volunteers doing anything more than if you see something say something," he sad, "We're going to be calling it in (to police) and making sure nothing gets violent - I don't want these volunteers in any dan-

Kritikos said he received significant assistance from John Cerini, an accountant by trade and treasurer of the Throggs Neck Merchant Association.

Cerini said he is completing the group's paperwork at no cost, charging them only the \$700 501c3 filing fee and \$275 IRS fee.

"He's been helping up out with fliers and getting donations and marketing and we've been using his office space," Kritikos said. "He's really been doing a lot for us."

Kritikos is hoping to get grant funding after being incorporated and said local elected officials have offered to help the group identify funding.






#### Leave it to the kids





# Backpack safety goes beyond back pain

hen it comes to backpack safety, most people tend to think about injuries caused by a heavy backpack or one worn improperly. However, there are other dangers associated with backpacks, and caution should be used.

Backpacks come in all shapes and sizes and can be a handy tool for students or adults. When worn correctly, with weight evenly distributed across the back and shoulders, backpacks can be safer and more effective than using a purse or briefcase. But many people wear overly-loaded backpacks slung over one shoulder, which can pose problems with posture and lead to back issues.

In addition to the physical strain backpacks can cause, they can be a danger in other ways. Many people fail to recognize how much space a backpack can take up. Entering the tight quarters of a school bus or commuting on a train or

bus means a bulky backpack can knock into other people. If that backpack is full of heavy, cumbersome books — or even a laptop computer — an inadvertent bump by the pack can cause injuries. Also, backpacks taken off and placed in bus aisles can be a tripping hazard.

Students can also be injured if a heavy pack falls on them. Children tucking backpacks into lockers or classroom cubbies may find that they slide out and hit another class-

Backpacks change the way individuals walk. Because the person is carrying around extra weight, she may lose balance or trip and fall, especially when going down steps.

To avoid these secondary hazards from backpacks, consider these tips:

Don't overload a backpack. Carry only what is necessary. If too many books are the issue, parents should talk to the school administrators and teachers to reach a happy medium regarding textbook usage.

Safely store it on a lap or under bus seat. Be sure straps, or the pack itself, are not extending into the aisle.

Avoid rolling backpacks. These can actually be difficult to roll, and some schools ban these styles because of tripping hazards.

Know how much space the bag takes up when worn. Be conscious of others when turning around or entering a confined space.

Take care on stairs. To help avoid slips and falls, hold on to stair rails and do not run with a heavy backpack.

Choose lightweight bag. Canvas backpacks are generally lighter in weight than leather backpacks. Do not add extra weight unnecessarily.



# **How to help distracted students**

odav's students have more gadgets at their disposal than ever before. As technology like tablets and smartphones have become more prevalent in the lives of adults, such devices also have become more commonplace in the classroom. Some kids thrive when teachers utilize technology to enhance lesson plans, while others may be distracted by access to technol-

According to the National Institute of Mental Health, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder is one of the most common childhood disorders. It can make it difficult for kids to maintain focus in the classroom, and that focus may be enhanced or further compromised by technology that's capable of serving many different functions. Kids who use the technology to their advantage may find it improves their ability to grasp lessons, but some kids may be distracted by devices or even other items in the classroom that make it difficult for them to absorb lessons. Parents concerned about their kids' ability to cope with



distractions in the classroom and at home can take the following steps in an effort to help youngsters improve their academic performance:

#### Speak to vour child's teacher about seating assignments

Students who find it difficult to focus in the classroom may benefit from new seating assignments. Windows or high-traffic areas of the classroom, such as doorways, can compromise a student's ability to focus.

classroom is not the ideal spot for youngsters who find it difficult to focus on the teacher, as teachers may not notice kids in the back of the class as readily as they might with students sitting in the front of the room.

#### **Encourage** participation

Many teachers recognize the value of active participation in the classroom, but kids who are struggling to focus may shy away from participating because they are worried about embarrassing themselves in front of their classcan work with students to encourage them to participate, reassuring them that they don't need to be experts on a given subject to contribute to lessons.

Even if students' participation is limited to asking questions rather than answering them, encouraging kids to raise their hands and participate in class may help them focus more on the lessons being discussed.

# **Minimize** distractions at


Kids who have no trouble focusing in the classroom may find it's a whole different ballgame when they arrive home to study or do their homework. Mom and Dad no doubt have their own gadgets around the house, and such devices as well as television may be too difficult for youngsters to ignore.

At home, parents can create a safe haven from distraction by designating a room or area of the house for schoolwork. Such areas should be clear of distractions like television, telephones, video game consoles, and other gadgets that can compromise a student's focus. Make such areas off limits to cellphones and block social media websites from computers in such rooms so kids aren't tempted to spend study time chatting with friends online. If a child's study area is not in a separate room of the house, parents should avoid turning on the television until kids have finished their studies for the night.


#### Consider playing games designed to improve attention and focus

Games designed to improve attention can be a fun way for parents to help their youngsters conquer their concentration issues. For example, the creators behind Lumosity.com collaborated with researchers from universities around the world in an effort to design games to improve visual attention in people of various ages and backgrounds.

Few kids are not enamored with games, and games to improve focus and attention may help kids without making them feel as though they are back in a classroom. Parents can speak with their child's teacher to determine which games might be best suited for their youngsters.







# Albanian-Americans celebrate Mother Teresa birthday and canonization

Albanians throughout the United States in general and New York in particular are currently celebrating two milestones related to the late Mother Teresa.

As religious and ethnic strife expands exponentially across the globe, the August 26 commemoration of her birthday (she was born August 26, 1910 and died in 1997) and her upcoming canonization as a Catholic saint on September 4 offer an alternative vision. The soon-to-be saints' legacy is emblematic of Albania, the nation that gave her birth, a country that, like America, offers an optimistic view of how people of different faiths can live together.

Mother Teresa's extraordinary dedication to the poor and downtrodden was based on her profound belief in the concepts of right and wrong, the personal obligations each human has to others, and that every man and woman, no matter how great or hummake a difference.

It is not a coincidence that Mother Teresa was born in Albania, a nation with a population that served as a figurative island of heroism and tolerance during a period when it's oppressed population was held captive by Nazis and Commu-

That belief in personal responsibility and not just tolerance but true affection for others has made America's growing and thriving Albanian community a major asset for the nation.

Organizations such as the Albanian American Society Foundation, Inc., led by founder and President Esad A. Rizai, have spearheaded the drive to make Mother Teresa's vision a reality in the United States. The unique organization boasts a board of directors that includes representatives and supporters from almost all ethnic groups and religious faiths. Many well-known Bronxites such as

ble their circumstances, can former legislator and prominent attorney Stephen Kaufman and entrepreneur/educator Professor Paul Palombo, who are not of Albanian background, proudly serve on the groups' Board.

> The organization works alongside other groups such as the Sons and Daughters of Albania, and the Albanian American Community.

> Poverty, caused by decades of Communist government, had driven many to leave Albania and Kosovo, although the switch fairly recently to a market system has improved the quality of life. That loss to their native land has been America's-and New York'sgain. Many of the over 200,000 ethnic Albanians who have moved to New York City have settled in The Bronx, revitalizing neighborhoods and opening businesses

> Albanian restaurants, shops, and services have revitalized many New York communities, as this vibrant community rises to a well-de

served prominence in the region.

Elected officials have taken notice. Public figures, including Borough President Reuben Diaz, Jr., State Senator Reuben Diaz, Council Member James Vacca, and others have frequently mentioned and celebrated the contributions of Albanian-Americans.The Bronx Times Reporter has frequently highlighted the Albanian community's activities.

The harsh history endured by Albanians has given them the will to succeed, and to do so in a manner that cherishes peoples of all backgrounds. Despite cruel rule by outsiders, the inherent decency and heroism of the Albanian people survived. Christians, Jews and Moslems came together to battle the atrocities, subjugation, and hatred that foreign powers imposed on them.

During World War II, Albanians distinguished themselves in their efforts to protect Jews from Nazi invaders.

A CNN report notes that "According to Yad Vashem, the Israeli museum that holds the world's largest repository of documents and information related to the Holocaust, there is not a single known case of a Jew being turned over to Nazi authorities in Albania during occupation...Incredibly, Albania's Jewish population actually grew during World War II. The reason so little is known about Albania's unique role during the Holocaust has a lot to do with the country's post-war history. Once the war was over, Albania fell under communist control and spent the next half-century behind the Iron Curtain."

It would be difficult to find a people more favorable towards America than Albanians. The love affair extends back to the end of the First World War, when President Wilson vigorously, but without success, sought to insure the territorial integrity of an independent homeland for Al-

# Is the walk to school really so terrifying?

Can we please stop telling parents that it is normal to be terrified for even the shortest periods of time when kids are doing the most mundane of activities: Walking to or from school?

Because here's what NBC's Alyssa Newcomb reported the other day in an piece on "Back-to-School Safety Tech That Helps Keep Kids Safe" (The title alone reinforcing the idea that kids are not safe without us taking new, techassisted precautions): "No matter how mature and responsible a child is, those few blocks without adult supervision are enough to make most parents worry."

Since when? Since crime is back to the level it was in 1963? Since we are living in the safest times in human history according to Harvard's Steven Pinker? Since even child deaths at the hand of a kidnapper — already extremely rare — are now one-fifth of what they were just 20 years ago? "Most parents worry" about a few block walk, in these particularly safe times, even if they know their kids are mature and responsible?

That seems like some kind of illness. Yes, it is normal to worry if the neighborhood is truly crime-ridden. And naturally it can be worrying if a child is late getting home, or if it is the first week of school and the child is just getting used to the walk. But for parents to worry no matter how mature their kid, how short the walk, and how safe the neighborhood does not make sense.

Igniting the fuse of fear makes sense for only two groups of people: The media, who depend on fear to keep us engaged; and the makers of tech tracking devices, who depend on our dollars to stay in business. After all, if they can convince us that it is normal to fret any time we take our eyes off our kids, they can sell us products that keep our eyes

And so reporter Newcomb goes on to list four products that track kids and apprise the parents of their location. The Pocketfinder is one. It goes in the child's backpack "updates a parent's smartphone with

their location every two minutes."

Obsess much? It also alerts parents the second their child veers off the prescribed path. What a joy that makes walking home: Follow that squirrel for a block and mom calls 911.

Then there's Life 360, which is free and sounds like Harry Potter's Marauder's Map, showing every family member's location. But if you pay a premium (a ha!) you can get "expanded history data and a live adviser for urgent situations." Just suggesting "urgent situations" makes the walk sound dire.

The Canary, also profiled, is part of a \$199 home security system, allowing you "to see live video and hear audio from their home. Parents can even replay the video clip from when their child walked in the door, ensuring that they were with only authorized house guests.'

Maybe it should really be called the Stool Pigeon. It seems less like a normal household device and more like the closed-circuit television above the door at a 7-Eleven.

And finally there's the August Smart Lock which let's you "see and speak to whoever is at your door, even if you're not home." It also locks and unlocks your door, long distance "making it ideal if your kid forgets their key," according to Newcomb. At \$400 it might be more ideal to make your kid a few extra keys, or even hide one someplace clever.

So now I, too, have some advice on how to keep your kid safe on the way home from school — advice that the television report, in its haste to hail technological solutions to nearly non-existent dangers, forgot. Teach your children to:

·Look left, look right, look left again when crossing the street.

·Make sure that anyone turning sees them in the cross walk.

· Ask strangers for help if they need it. Teaching "Stranger danger" moves all the people who could help them in an emergency. (Remember that Utah Boy Scout who was lost for three days because every time he heard a search party member calling his name, he scampered off to hide from the "stranger"?)

However, teach your kids that they while they can talk to anyone, they cannot go off with anyone. And they should not get into someone's car.

Those are tips that make a lot of sense and, by golly, they are free! Of course, for a premium, I will add a new and pointless tip every month. Sign up now!

There should be little doubt that the U.S. economy is in significant trouble. Indeed, objective criteria, as well as spokespersons from both sides of the political spectrum, indicate an economy approaching crisis levels. A survey of views illustrates the challenge:

The latest report from the Bureau of Labor Statistics reveals that "Real hourly compensation decreased 0.4 percent..." The Bloomberg news service reports that "One in seven U.S. households has a negative net worth, as student loans and credit cards plunge a diverse group of peopleincluding those with good jobs—into the red...Almost 15 percent of Americans, or 47 million people, live below the poverty line, according to the U.S. Census Bureau. Then there are the people loaded up with debt. Even people with good jobs can owe so much on credit cards, student loans, or mortgages that, on paper, they're worth less than zero. About 14 percent of U.S. households fall into this category, with a negative net worth, according to an analysis this month by the New York Federal Reserve. Add up all their possessions—cash, property,

retirement accounts-and subtract all their debts, and one in seven Americans ends up in the red. Overall, U.S. households have \$12.3 trillion in debt, according to another New York Fedreport, released this week."

Progressive-oriented lapsed." truth-out.org notes that: "... the evidence shows that living-wage, family-sustaining positions are quickly being replaced by lower-wage and less secure forms of employment. These plentiful low-level jobs have padded the unemployment figures, leaving much of America believing in an overhyped recovery... New research is beginning to confirm the permanent nature of middle-income job loss. Based on analysis that one reviewer calls 'some of the most important work done by economists in the last twenty years,' a National Bureau of Economic Research study found that national employment levels have fallen in U.S. industries that are vulnerable to import competition, without offsetting job gains in other industries. Even the Wall Street Journal admits that 'many middlewage occupations, those with average earnings between \$32,000 and \$53,000, have col-

The financial source Profitconfidential notes that Washington is "hiding" inflationary statistics.

"According to government statistics, inflation was held to just 0.6% during the first seven months of 2015. Unfortunately, that data disregards the most basic items that everyone uses, including food and energy costs... (Alternative nongovernment measures of inflation tell a completely different story. The Chapwood Index is an alternative inflation indicator that looks at the unadjusted costs and price fluctuation of the top 500 items that Americans spend their money on in the 50 largest cities in the country.

The index looks at the fluctuations in the cost of items such as Advil, Starbucks coffee, insurance, gasoline, tolls, fast food restaurants, toothpaste, oil changes, car washes, cable TV and Internet service,

cellphone service, dry cleaning, movie tickets, cosmetics, gym memberships, home repairs, piano lessons, laundry detergent, light bulbs, school supplies, parking meters, pet food, and People magazine. For example, in 2014, the [official consumer price index] CPI rose 0.8%. But according to the Chapwood Index, major cities like New York, Los Angeles, Chicago, San Diego, and Boston saw inflation for the trailing 12 months (through to June of this year) run over 10%."

Ignoring real inflationary numbers has a dire effect on senior citizens, who have suffered, during the Obama Administration, more years without a cost of living increase in their social security checks than at any other time in living memory.

Republicans have been sharply critical of the President's economic policies. A GOP source notes: "... let's look at what the Obama-Clinton policies have done nationally. Their policies produced 1.2% growth, the weakest socalled recovery since the Great Depression, and a doubling of the national debt."There are now 94.3 million Americans outside the labor force. It

was 80.5 million when President Obama took office, an increase of nearly 14 million people. Home ownership is at its lowest rate in 51 years... "Nearly 12 million have been added to the food stamp rolls since President Obama took office. Another nearly 7 million Americans were added to the ranks of those in poverty.

"We have the lowest labor force participation rates in four decades. 58 percent of African-American youth are either outside the labor force or not employed. 1 in 5 American households do not have a single member in the labor force...Meanwhile, American households are earning more than \$4,000 less today than they were sixteen years ago."

While substantial disagreement exists about the remedies that should be applied to America's broken economy. the reality that the crisis is real is one which has fairly widespread support.

#### **Scams**

Here are the latest scam calls for this year according to AARP Magazine...

To determine the top robocall scams of 2016 so far, Pindrop analyzed fraud calls made between January and June to more than 90,000 landline numbers it operates as a 'honeypot,' a security technique used to attract swindlers and learn their practices. Up to 500,000 calls per month reached honeypot phones, primarily consisting of numbers previously dropped by customers because they were relocating, no longer wanted a landline or wanted a new number to stop incessant robocalls, explains Pindrop spokesman Kenneth Shuman.

The first surprise in this comprehensive research: The notorious IRS impostor phone scam didn't make the list. "I was as shocked as you," Shuman tells us. "But like other phone scams, it ebbs and flows. And during the first six months of 2016, other robocall scams were much more prevalent." (Also, this report is spe-fraudsters tell victims they

cific to schemes exclusively starting as robocalls; threats by IRS impostors can be 'live' or automated.)

Ordered by rank, here are what Pindrop reports as the top robocall scams so far this

- 1. Google business-listing scam: Swindlers warn business owners that their listings on Google are out of date or at risk of being removed from the top page of search results. When the entrepreneurs are connected to a call center, fraudsters with no Google affiliation promise help — for a fee payable by credit card. Variations of this scam include selfdescribed 'search consultants' for Yahoo and Bing.
- 2. Loan scams: These either promise intended victims help in lowering their interest rates (at high service fees) or threaten them that loans are past due, for a quick shakedown. Callers sometimes use information they've gotten from legitimate online loan applications, to fool targets into believing they are the bona fide loan provider.
- 3. Free vacations: If not used as bait to enlist targeted consumers to sit through a high-pressure sales pitch for a time-share or vacation club,

- 4. Political calls: Under the guise of doing political surveys or voter registration, scammers seek personal information that could be used for identity theft.
- 5. Local map verification: The caller claims that a business has been flagged by online maps verification and that personal information must be confirmed.

Rounding out the top 10 robocall scams: bogus programs to lower electricity bills; an 'important personal message' that attempts to glean sensitive information, often used by fake debt collectors; claims that you can lower your credit card interest rate; offers for a 'free' home security system; and calls specifically aimed at seniors to pitch antiaging products, cemetery plots, health insurance and Medicare scams."

# Early dirigible was constructed in Morris Park

# by Bill Twomey remember

DiBrino's book "The History of the Morris Park Racecourse and the Morris Family" when I came across this photograph of the Rice-Riggs Airship, "The American Eagle." Joel Rice had been working with airships for years and by 1901 already had two patents in his name.

Joel Troutt Rice and John A. Riggs formed the Hot Springs Airship Company in Arkansas on February 24, 1908. Rice's first dirigible was dubbed "The Arkansas Traveler" and had a single engine and steel frame to support its frame which was in excess of 50 feet in length. Steering was achieved via three swiveling propellers.

It was not very successful, rising only about ten feet or so when Riggs suggested that they move to Morris Park which was already well-known for their work with experimental



> Riggs and Rice developed quite a reputation and built the largest steel-framed diri-

gible in the world here in the Bronx at Morris Park. It cost them over \$5,000 but, unfortunately was destroyed in a gale. Joel Rice was the mechanical genius that developed the dirigible while John Riggs was the capitalist who kept the funding coming in.

When Riggs asked for a greater controling interest, evolved effectively breaking up the partnership. Riggs would later establish a newspaper which also proved successful.

Mentioning John A. Riggs (1867-1936) by the way, reminds me that he was a pioneer in woman's suffrage.

He was, in fact, called the father of women's suffrage in

Rice balked and a law suit Arkansas. He was successful in almost every undertaking from ranching to patent medicine and politics. He served in the Arkansas House of Representatives and in 1917 introduced the bill granting women the right to vote which in turn led to that state's ratification of the Nineteenth Amendment to the Constitution.



The new studio is expected to create 400 film industry jobs, according to the governor's office.

"Port Morris is the perfect location for our newest studio," said company president Stuart Suna. "With easy access to transportation, and the many offerings in this burgeoning neighborhood, as well as the incredible support from the state, the city and the Bronx, we expect Silvercup North to be a big success for us, the productions we support, and the local community."

The company received a \$1.6 million performance-based grant through the New York City Regional Economic Development Council to help fund construction and equipment.

He fondly recalled stories of how his uncle could sing, dance and was a bit of a ladies' man.

> Teahan, born Dec, 3, 1923 died at the age of 20 in 1944.


> Farrell said Teahan shipped out of New York Harbor in December 1943 as Farrell's mother Anne watched her brother leave.





Rhoomes will head to Saint-These Rams are ready to Quentin Aisne in France while guard Mandell Thomas will play for BC Tartu in Estonia.

> "Signing a professional contract is a dream come true for me," Rhoomes said in a release from Fordham athletics. "But I know none of this would have been possible if not for

the opportunity that I was given at Fordham and I will forever grateful to all those at Fordham who helped me get to where I am."

Rhoomes is fresh off a solid senior season in the Bronx, where he averaged 14.6 points per game and 9.7 rebounds per game, both team highs, while recording a team-best 13 dou-

bles-doubles. The forward led the Atlantic 10 and was sixth in the NCAA in field goal percentage, connecting on just over 67 percent of his shots – a school record.

The Queens native – who played his high school ball at Cardozo high school-wrapped up his college career ranked sixth on Fordham's all-time

rebounding list (936) and fifth on the school's career blocked shots list (146).

"Ryan Rhoomes has improved as a basketball player at an amazing rate over the last 16 months," Fordham head coach Jeff Neubauer said. "Ryan deserves this opportunity to compete as a pro-

fessional on the basketball court. We are really proud of the season that Ryan had and the career that he will have."

While Rhoomes is anxious to take his talent on the block overseas, Thomas is simply looking to continue his recent bounceback after being hampered by injuries last season.

The 6-foot-2 guard still managed to hit his stride on the court, however, averaging 12.3 ppg and 3.6 rpg while also recording 54 steals and 50 assists. He walked away from the program as 13th on the Fordham's career point list (1,385) while also ranking fifth in career steals (198) and eighth in career three-pointers made (164).

Thomas also led the A-10 in assists during both his junior and senior seasons and was second in the league in steals during his final season on the hardwood. Now, he's ready to test his skills overseas.

"I'm excited to finally begin my professionally career in Estonia with my new team," Thomas said. "I know it'll be a bit of an adjustment at first, but I'm looking forward to it and happy to be continuing my basketball career. I am thankful to everyone at Fordham for helping me lay a foundation to build off of moving forward. I wish everyone nothing but the best."

Both Rhoomes and Thomas will be missed on the court this season as the Rams boast just one senior on this year's roster. Fordham returns to action on November 11, taking on East Tennessee State University before the home opener at Rose Hill Gym against New York Institute of Technology on November 14.

Years from now, Isaiah Washington will think back to this summer and remember – this was the moment everything changed.

The St. Raymond's guard had been courting interest from a handful of Division I programs after a successful junior year last season, but over the last few months the Ravens star has become a sensation.

He's picked up dozens of offers, competed on the AAU circuit and at big-name camps and, on August 20, cemented himself as one of the top players in the country with a dominant performance in the Under Armour Elite 24 game at Brooklyn Bridge Park.

"It's crazy to see to see what a little bit of hard work and patience does for you," Washington said. "That's what it's all been about."

While Washington was anxious for the competition the game presented, he also relished the opportunity to play one more game with Sidney Wilson.

The former St. Raymond's forward announced his decision to transfer to Brewster Academy in New Hampshire earlier this summer. The Elite 24 game was another chance for the duo to play together and a moment Washington enjoyed just as much as being named to the roster.

"That's like my brother out there and it's going to be tough not having him around," Washington said. "But I know he's got to do what he's got to do."

Washington played with a bit of a chip on his shoulder throughout the event, but he also knows that competing in the game is a sign of everything he's been able to accomplish over the last few years.

The Elite 24 game features a handful of big-name alums, including Washington Wizards point guard John Wall and Charlotte Hornets point guard Kemba Walker as well as Cleveland Cavaliers stars Tristan Thompson and Kyrie Irving.

Washington is hoping to, eventually, had his name to that list.

For those few hours Ziggler and his fellow Superstars weren't bigger-thanlife figures. They were normal people, simply looking to let a few kids feel like kids if only for a few hours.

"The kids are having fun, luckily, they're happy to see us. And, as always, we're happy to see them," Ziggler said. "Any time we get to be in a city for a few days, we get chance to give back to the community and it's very cool for us, not just to be here but to actually

see some kids. Our entire job is putting smiles on kids faces and this is one of our favorite things to do."

The WWE Superstars - which also included Darren Young, Zack Ryder and NXT star Bayley - and McMahon were in the city throughout the week ahead of the SummerSlam pay-perview event at Barclays Center on Aug. 21. As far as McMahon is concerned, that work is far more important than anything she's ever done in the ring.




