

SV FERRY LAUNCHED

Riders will arrive at Wall Street in 45 minutes

Ferry service linking the borough and Manhattan is now a reality.

The ferry operating between Soundview and destinations in Manhattan officially launched on Wednesday, August 15, with many elected officials and the public enjoying the maiden voyage and the start of regular service.

The NYC Ferry route takes approximately 45 minutes from the landing in Clason Point Park to Pier 11/Wall Street and East 90th Street in Manhattan.

Mayor de Blasio joined Borough President Ruben Diaz Jr. but of Bronxites in every com-

Crespo at Clason Point Park after the maiden trip, where all three officials spoke to a crowd ferry riders and local residents

Diaz said that the ferry service would provide critical transportation and another alternative for commuters, while noting four new Metro-North stations are being planned and that dock-less bicycle sharing has arrived in the borough.

"This long-awaited, much-Street, with stops at East 34th anticipated ferry service has the potential to dramatically improve the commutes not only of Soundview residents,

and Assemblyman Marcos munity," said Diaz. "The people of my borough are always looking for new mass transit options, and I congratulate Mayor de Blasio and his administration on today's launch and for making this new service a top priority."

The mayor said that the last time the borough had ferry service was in 1930s and that it was overdue.

"The new Soundview ferry will cut commute times in half for thousands of Bronxites." said de Blasio. "Our all-of-theabove approach to transit

He takes a deep interest in destruction and deterioratic spin.



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

Pinstripe Pilsner ale hits a home run at Yankee Stadium

been slumping lately, but their Pinstripe Pilsner has been on a winning streak at the stadium.

Collaborating with Long Islandbased Blue Point Brewing Co., the Yankee Stadium exclusive beer that started as just a single-location draft is now being canned and sold all around Yankee Stadium.

Pinstripe Pilsner is a golden lager brewed with Pilsner malt and Motueka hops, which gives it a lime aroma.

While Blue Point suggests having a bag of peanuts with this brew on a hot day, this reporter found that popcorn is an appropriate substitute as well.

The light beer was first introduced on-draft only at the Blue Point Bleachers bar during Opening Day of this season.

The new 16-ounce cans were first sold during a rough outing against the New York Mets on Monday, August 13.

Let's just say fans needed a few after the 8 to 5 loss.

Now, they're being distributed all around the stadium rather than the one location in the left field bleachers.

Grab-and-go stands carry Pinstripe Pilsner while they've also made a presence at field level in sections 110 and 121, section 211 behind home plate and on the stadium's main level, in addition section 202 in the bleachers.

You can also flag one down from your seat because vendors are peddling them too.

One vendor explained how the beer The New York Yankees may have dynamic works at Yankee Stadium.

"Tourists don't usually stray away from Bud Light, New Yorkers are the ones that get the good stuff," he said while selling the Pinstripe Pilsner for

He went on to explain that a highquality beer like this is better off in a 16 ounce can rather than a 'tall boy' and 25 ounces.

"For me personally it's just too much, especially if you're drinking a real beer, you really don't need 25 ounces. It just makes you feel full," the vendor added.

Blue Point has heard nothing but good news about their collaborative

"We're honored to partner with the New York Yankees to bring NY Pinstripe Pilsner to life. NY Pinstripe Pils was brewed to be best enjoyed on a hot day at the ballpark and the feedback we've received thus far has been nothing short of amazing. We hope that Yankees fans will appreciate this new offering as a way to proudly show their Pinstripe pride," said Blue Point Brewing Company president Jenna Lally.

A large Pinstripe Pilsner goes for \$12.89, only a dollar more than any other imported beer at Yankee Stadium and just over double the price of a bottle of water.

It's safe to say that both the New York Yankees and Blue Point are hoping to keep this brew selling until the very end of October.



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
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


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NYPD, City Island leaders meet on security camera plan

Local community members sat down with police personnel to discuss unresolved traffic concerns.

City Island Civic Association leaders met with NYPD officials to discuss plans to better handle traffic flow during peek months when visitors enjoy the island's many restaurants by using camera technology.

The meeting took place at the 45th Precinct in mid-July.

Councilman Mark Gjonaj told the Bronx Times that he had allocated funding for several Argus traffic cameras, which can capture the license plates of automobiles to aid police investigations.

One of the cameras is slated for the City Island Bridge – the island's only entry and exit point, he said.

"Just knowing that it is there and that 'big brother' is watching is going to be a [crime] deterrent," said Gjonaj.

An Argus camera at the bridge could also be used to access traffic needs in real time from the precinct commanding officer's desktop,

said Gjonaj.

Bill Stanton, CICA president, said he is advocating for the placement of one of the Argus cameras at the bridge, where the plate reading mechanism would be a boon to police work.

Stanton said he believes that a plate reading camera at the City Island Bridge could be a crime deterrent.

"Regardless of my background in safety and security, I totally defer the placement of the camera to the precinct commander," said Stanton. "I believe the decision has yet to be made, but I believe the entry and exit point onto City Island would be the obvious choice."

The civic president said he believes that an Argus camera at the City Island Bridge would be a "gamechanger" in terms of public safety.

"Let's say there is an armed robbery or an assault, this camera will aid in the police investigation and allow them to affect an arrest that much quicker," explained Stanton.

The councilman said that a facial recognition feature-could also be a part of the Argus camera.

Stanton and Tom Smith, CICA treasurer, said the NYPD, which has had a strong traffic control presence on the island this summer, would continue posting six traffic control officers for the remaining weekends in August, and two Smart cars to maintain traffic flow on City Island Avenue.

Islander Dan Treiber, who started a petition calling for traffic agents on City Island for all of its busy seasons, from May to September, said more needs to be done.

"It is still a two-month solution to a five-month problem," said Treiber of the traffic agent arrangement, adding "What happens when it is September 3rd and 85 degrees outside?"

The safety discussion comes on the heels of the recent installation of permanent bollards at the entrance to City Island Road from the Pelham Bay Park traffic circle, which will prevent drivers from cutting into the line of cars heading to the island.

John Doyle, CICA corresponding secretary, said that bollards were installed as part of a larger number of requests by the organization, and were originally recommended by Lauren Briggs.

"Sometimes there are three lanes of traffic trying to merge into one," said Briggs of the spot where the bollards were installed, adding that when police are not present to put out traffic cones, the bollards will come in handy.

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Ground broken on Black Rock Park's \$1.5 mil. renovation

Bronx Parks Commissioner Iris Rodriguez-Rosa joined Councilman Ruben Diaz ,Sr., Assemblyman Marcos Crespo, Senator Luis Sepulveda, Senator Jeff Klein, Community Board 9 and students from nearby P.S. 119 to break ground on a \$1.5 million reconstruction of Black Rock Playground on Thursday, July 26.

Funded entirely by Mayor de Blasio as part of the Community Parks Initiative, construction is expected to be complete in winter 2019.

The new design for Black Rock Playground was created with input from the Parkchester community, who shared their needs and wants with Parks at a community visioning session in 2016.

The playground will be revamped with new play equipment; swings and water play features to keep kids cool in the summer.

Black Rock is to also receive new benches, water fountains, trees, plants and lighting.

Additionally, some of the fencing will be lowered to

make the park more open and welcoming, and the drainage systems will be rebuilt to ease rain runoff.

"The students of P.S. 119 use Black Rock Playground every day," said NYC Parks Commissioner Mitchell J. Silver. "Yet, this playground hasn't seen meaningful improvements since 1997. Today, we are changing that. We are giving this playground a complete makeover to ensure the kids and families of Parkchester have the kind of modern playground they deserve," he added.

The mayor's Community Parks Initiative has been striving to create a more equitable and accessible parks system by investing in smaller parks that are located in New York City's densely populated neighborhoods.

"Our parks are an essential resource that bring Bronx families and communities together," said Klein. "The children of Parkchester and surrounding neighborhoods need and deserve a wonderful space to play and thrive, and that's what the Black Rock Playground will become

thanks to Mayor de Blasio's Community Park's Initiative and the NYC Parks Department," Klein added.

Through this program, the city has been investing \$318 million in capital dollars to make renovations to 67 parks citywide including 18 in the Bronx—that have not undergone significant improvements in decades.

"This \$1.5 million reconstruction project is another step forward towards improving the quality of life for our

residents and the Bronx overall," said Crespo.

"I am proud to stand with my colleagues, with NYC Parks, the City of New York and Bronx Commissioner Iris Rodriguez-Rosa in their efforts to continue to beautify and make our parks safe and fun for children and families," he added.

The playground is named after the black rock outcroppings in the area, formed of gneiss--a coarse-grained, imperfectly layered metamorphic rock, characterized by alternating dark and light bands.

It was formed during the Hartland formation and dates back hundreds of millions of years, when an unknown land mass collided with North America and buried sedimentary rocks on the edge of the continent.

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




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Two Car Collission In Country Club

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Bronxite pens memoir depicting her victory over adversity

A borough author has penned a new memoir about her resiliency in the face of personal adversity.

Yolanda Alvarez, a Throggs Neck resident who is a volunteer in the borough's court system, recently released her memoir about coming-of-age with an abusive father and other challenges.


The literary treatment of the subject covers her upbringing in Tremont and Fordham in the 1960s and 1970s, as well as a period during high school in which she temporarily escaped the grip of her alcoholic and sexually abusive father and thrived while attending high school at Bayport, Long Island.

Alvarez hopes that the book conveys an uplifting message: that despite what challenges a person may have to endure, they can succeed.

The book's high point is reached when she becomes the first of her family to receive a high school diploma, while she was in foster care, shattering stereotypes of what she was capable of as a young Latina who had also been abused.

"I wrote the book to inspire others and to tell my story," said Alvarez. "I wanted others to see that anything was possible if you want it bad enough."

Alvarez hopes that No Excuses will be the first installment of an autobiographical trilogy. The other two books

would delve into different phases of her life

Many of the strong recollections she shares in No Excuses were culled from the diaries she kept religiously since she was 14-years-old.

"This book talks about the adults in my life failing me, including my mom and dad," she said, adding they were

both affected by alcoholism and men-

The crimes she accuses her dad of were never adequately punished.

Her father was never really taken to task by law enforcement for his pedophilia, said Alvarez, adding he would spend a day or two in jail and then be released.

"The laws were very different in the 1960s and 1970s," said Alvarez, adding that many times her father, who is now deceased, frequently had money for booze but not for food.

The author said she received a sort of catharsis in writing the book, believing that by writing about her trauma, she could set herself free, while at the same time help others.

"It was difficult to write about it because I had to re-live it all over again, but at the same time it set me free and I feel that if I can help someone else have a voice through my book then I have accomplished what I set out to do."

She feels that the borough definitely acts as more than a setting and is almost a character for most of the book.

"There are a lot of good things that come out of the Bronx," she said. "I love Throggs Neck – it is more of a village than a neighborhood – and there are so many wonderful places in the Bronx."

She holds a masters degree in history from Lehman College, and she gave a commencement address at the

college in 2009, she said.

Alvarez said she hopes to attend law school, and hopes that one day her grandson is able to read the book and be proud of his grandmother.

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Pet Resource Fair provides food, leashes for pet owners

A community-led effort helped pet owners obtain helpful necessities for their beloved animals.

Forgotten Chances Animal Rescue, a non-profit organization founded by Pelham Parkway local Gail Neuendorf, gave away approximately 4,000 pounds of food as well as 1,000 collars and 1,000 leashes to pet owners at their fifth annual Pet Resource Fair on Saturday, August 11.

The Pet Resource Fair had been held in Eastchester Gardens since 2014, but this year took place near Pelham Parkway on Paulding Avenue.

Flea and tick medication were also available, said Neuendorf.

"I asked for help and donations and the donors are really the ones who make it happen," she said.

The fair was co-sponsored by Assemblywoman Nathalia Fernandez.

Another co-sponsor was pet-advocacy group Nobody Starves on Long Island, which donated pet supplies, said organization founder Gary Kaufman. "The Bronx is only an hour and half away from me," said Kaufman, who sends pet food all over the metro area where its needed. "We took a truck load of supplies."

Donations were solicited from all over the country via social media, said Neuendorf, who added she has been a pet rescuer for 30 years.

"I just have a bunch of people donate every year for the past five years that I've held this event," said Neuendorf. "It is a network of animal rescuers and animal rights advocates."

Neuendorf's goal is to help disabled, elderly and lowerincome pet owners hang onto their animals so they don't have to surrender them to a shelter, she said.

"I really don't want to take animals and adopt them," she said. "I would like to help people keep their pets. If they tell me what their needs are...we can definitely get food and supplies out to them."

Councilman Mark Gjonaj stopped by the giveaway, making a small-dollar donation to FCAR, a registered 501(c)3 non-profit.

A Fernandez spokeswoman said she helped sponsor the Pet Resource Fair by providing a monetary sponsorship that went towards a table for the event.

The assemblywoman also helped spread the word throughout the Pelham Parkway community.

"It means a lot to me that I was able to help out and provide much needed pet resources to families," said Fernandez. "No

one should be forced to give up their pet just because they fall short on supplies."

A score of helpers made the food giveaway a success, including one group from the NYC Department of Youth and Community Development's Summer Youth Employment Program, said Neuendorf.

Bark & Purr, a boutique pet store in Yonkers, held a food drive for the giveaway, according to Neuendorf.

John Hill Jr. of Pelham Parkway, an event volunteer, said that he donated his time because he is an animal lover.

"I think events like this keep animals out of shelters," said Hill.

Neuendorf won't be holding another public event in the near future, but wants to redouble her efforts with monthly giveaways of pet food to verified disabled and elderly community members in need, she said.

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
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Woodlawn dedicates dog run in Van Cortlandt Park

Dog owners and their beloved pets now have a new place to run and play.

The NYC Parks Department dedicated a dog run for four-legged friends and their owners in Van Cortlandt Park on Tuesday, July 24, just footsteps away from the Woodlawn community.

The \$500,000 in capital improvements also included improvements to the eastern end of the John Muir Trail for hiking, which begins where the dog run is located at Van Cortlandt Park East and Oneida Avenue

There was previously a smaller, temporary dog run at the location, and the new permanent one is larger with more greenery, benches, boulders, a waste bag dispenser and a waste basket, stated a Parks Department spokeswoman.

Councilman Andy Cohen was heavily involved in advocating for the project, according to sources.

"This has been an area of the park where dog owners would let their dogs run 'illegally," said Cohen. "But after

many years of community input and careful planning, the dogs of Woodlawn will now have their own space to thoroughly enjoy one of the greatest parks in the city."

The councilman allocated \$400,000 to the project, and the mayor's office provided an additional \$100,000.

Parks made use of some of the cleared trees as mulch in repairs to the hiking trail.

The origins of the project date back to community activ-

ism seven or eight years ago, said George Torres, CB 12 district manager.

There had been some concern because the site is near a location of importance to the history of Native American peoples, and extra care was taken to make sure nothing was disturbed, explained the district manager.

Kenneth Nugent, Woodlawn Heights Taxpayers and Community Association president, said that the organization supported the dog run, and that the area was tested twice to make sure no remains of the Stockbridge Indian Massacre from 1778 were disturbed.

Kathleen Corrigan, the organization's first vice president, who started advocating for a permanent dog run in 2009, said that the project really gained momentum under Bronx Parks Commissioner Iris Rodriguez-Rosa.

She said that one of the

good things about the dog run is that it is right off the street, with no one having to go deep into the park's wooded areas.

Corrigan was also pleased that spaces were included for both larger and smaller dogs.

"It was a long time, but it was nice to see if finally come to fruition," said Corrigan.

Christina Taylor, Friends of Van Cortlandt Park executive director said roughly eight years ago the organization received a grant that involved surveying communities adjacent to the park about what they would like to see, and a dog run was a priority for Woodlawn back then.

Much more important to FVCP's mission are the natural areas of the parks, and she said she was glad to see improvements to the eastern end of the trail near the run as part of this project.

"There was an issue with a lot of erosion and run off (on the trail)...so it was difficult for people to walk on," she said of the eastern end of the Muir trail. "They put in some check steps and then filled in the area so it now has a nice even surface for people to walk on."

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Street renamed for community servant, J.W. Smith

A local leader who served God and his community received an incredible honor.

For five years, the couple sold the Kirby product and established Darlene's Area Dealership in Elmsford, NY.

In 1995, Smith became a member of Grace Baptist Church in Mount Vernon and served in many leadership roles under the direction of Rev. Franklyn Richardson.

"J.W. was one of my dearest friends, one of our longest serving members and we're still trying to find five more people to take his place," shared Richardson.

The U.S. Navy veteran was ordained into the Grace Deacons' Ministry in March 2005 and served multiple terms as the Men's Ministry president.

Smith was honored as one of the three men selected annually for their dedicated service.

His extensive resume included time as a charter member of the Men's Choir and the Peace Keepers, a Laymen's Unified Missionary Baptist Association member and an active member of the Usher's


In 2011, he served on Ujamaa Community Development Corporation's Board of Directors.

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

On my morning commute earlier this week I came across a group of homeless individuals gathered near the corner of Pelham Parkway South and White Plains Road, and on that corner I saw the hard times that our community is going through.

Nobody wants to be homeless or be forced to live with the stigmas and daily indignities that come along with it. Having said that, no community wants people out on the streets either. That is why we must work to improve the quality of life for every-

The first step in addressing the homeless crisis our city is facing begins with making sure those who are willing and able to work can find jobs. It is imperative that New York City be a place where 'mom-and-pop'

shops can flourish and hire from the appearance or cleanliness of the within the community.

In order to do this we have to ease the burdens small businesses face, so they won't have to decide between paying their ever growing property tax or water and sewer bills and being able to hire additional employ-

The second step in addressing this crisis is doing what we can to integrate these people back into society. Temporary shelters are not the solution to homelessness.

Once somebody finds a job and finds a home that is theirs, only then can they truly be productive members of a community.

People who know they are in a shelter for a short period of time have no long-term interest in maintaining

The city must also be very mindful to have an even distribution of supportive housing sites. Last year I filed a lawsuit against the city demanding that each borough gets their fair share of supportive housing units and I am still fighting for that today. Our borough gets a disproportionate amount of supportive housing units and that practice must

To put an end to this crisis we must make the common sense reforms needed that will make living and working in our communities possible again.

Klein announces \$100,000 for 'Bait Car' Program

nounced a \$100,000 grant to the Bronx District Attorney's Office to fund the expansion of the Bronx Anti-Auto Theft 'Bait Car' Program. The announcement took place at an event for 50th Precinct National Night Out Against Crime on W. 234th Street. Klein was joined by Bronx District Attorney Darcel Clark and 50th Precinct Deputy Inspector Terence O'Toole. The program, which began in the Bronx in 1995, in an effort to reduce vehicle break-ins, involves plain clothed NYPD officers positioning bait cars in high crime areas in order to catch criminals in the act.

The \$100,000 grant secured by Klein will be applied to the purchase of state-of-the art anti-auto theft tools and resources, including two 'bait vehicles,' a surveillance van, and other technical surveillance equipment that will aid officers in the investigation money on vehicles which they and prosecution of auto theft.

"Keeping our neighborhoods and streets safe is one of my top priorities. That is why I fought to secure \$100,000 for the Bronx District Attornev for their successful Bait Car program, which has been proven to both reduce and prevent auto theft. I am fully committed to ensuring our local law enforcement officers have all the tools and resources they need to crack down on crime," said Klein.

"Senator Jeff Klein has wholeheartedly supported my office in prevention and prosecution of crimes that greatly affect our communities. His latest grant to us-for \$100,000--is being used to purchase a surveillance van, technical equipment and two 'bait' vehicles to help my investigators catch those who steal or break into cars. Bronx residents spend their hard-earned need to get to work or transport their families. We will not tolerate these crimes that deprive people of something vital to their livelihood and everyday life," said Clark.

New York State and the Bronx have made great strides reducing auto theft over the years. Since 1994, the Bronx has seen an almost 91% reduction of motor vehicle theft. Yet that decline has tapered off in the last few vears. Between 2016 and 2017 the Bronx has seen less than a 1% decrease in auto crime rates in the Bronx, making it one of the worst performing boroughs. This demonstrates that the Bronx needs additional assistance to help combat motor vehicle theft.

All five boroughs saw the following decrease in motor vehicle theft: Bronx - 0.8% decrease of motor vehicle thefts; Manhattan - 0% decrease of motor vehicle thefts; Brooklyn - 8.1% decrease of motor vehicle thefts; Queens - 18.2% decrease of motor vehicle thefts; Staten Island - 5.3% decrease of motor vehicle thefts; and the City of New York (all five boroughs) - 10% decrease of motor vehicle thefts.

According to the State Division of Criminal Justice Services, in 2017 there were 1,356 motor vehicle thefts or attempted thefts in the Bronx. Just last week in the Bronx, there were 33 incidents of grand larceny of a vehicle. There are also certain locations in the Bronx that are targeted more than others. According to a 2018 study by the SpotAngels app, the parking areas around Van Cortlandt Park are the most susceptible in our community. That study found that there were 12.6 break-ins for every 100 spaces, which is the highest rate of break-ins in the Bronx.

Throughout the Bronx, police precincts in all communities are working hard to combat vehicle theft. Year to date, there have been 711 thefts in the Bronx alone. With autotheft crime failing to substantially decline. Klein joined the NYPD in their commitment to double down against anti-theft and to make our communities safer, and partnered with the Bronx District Attorney's Office to enhance the 'bait car' program.

In 2018, the Bronx District Attorney's Auto Crime team has recovered 52 vehicles, valued at approximately \$713,000. Enhancing the bait car program will allow the team to increase both prevention and recovery results. Bait cars are deployed to undisclosed locations throughout the community that have seen an uptick in crime, to lure criminals and catch them red handed in the act.

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Mental Attitude: Siblings Can Ease Pain of Family Conflict. In this study, researchers interviewed children from 236 families and found that teens who had good relationships with their siblings experienced less distress when answering questions about observed parental disagreements. Study co-author Dr. Meredith Martin writes, "We showed that having a good relationship with a brother or sister reduced heightened vulnerability for youth exposed to conflicts between their parents by decreasing their tendencies to experience distress in response to later disagreements between their parents." Exercise: Stronger Hips May Help Pitchers Stay on the Mound. In this study, researchers measured lower extremity performance in 18 collegiate pitchers before and after a simulated game. While researchers observed no change in jump squat performance following the 117-pitch session, the participants did experience a decline in their hip abduction and adduction strength that may have affected their pitching velocity. The research team concludes, "Our findings suggest that hip abduction and adduction strength are susceptible to fatigue owing to repetitive throwing motions and that hip adduction strength, especially, is an important physical fitness factor for maintaining ball velocity during a game in baseball pitchers." Chiropractic: Factors That Increase Risk for Degenerative Disk Disease. Disks degenerate when they become dehydrated, lose height, and the vertebrae on either side develop bony growths called osteophytes, which can cause or exacerbate lower back pain. It is disappointing that partisan politics has blocked widespread recognition that the reversal of Obama-era policies has led to significant gains for the U.S. economy. The disunity within the nation hampers additional progress that could be made from a united stance on Trump's attempt to finally address the unfair trade policies that have hampered the American economy for far too long.

Clearly, the numbers indicate success for the President's policies. A growth rate of 4.1% from April through June (Obama's average growth rate was 1.48%.) has been accomplished.

Conor Beck, writing for the Free Beacon, reports that even "Jason Furman, chair of the Council of Economic Advisers under President Barack Obama, argued on CNBC...that the economy is growing even faster than the commonly used government figure suggests. CNBC's Sara Eisen said people at the network were surprised to see the argument being argued by an Obama administration of-

ten cited for the good news, the Treasury Department reports that it has collected record amounts of individual income taxes. The math is simple. More people are working.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics reports that 213,000 jobs were added in June. A March analysis noted that 2.21 million jobs have come into being in Trump's first 15 months in office. Unemployment rates were lower in June in 9 states. higher in 3 states, and stable in 38 states and the District of Columbia. Ten states had jobless rate decreases from a vear earlier and 40 states and the District had little or no change. Bloomberg notes that "The monthly jobs report for June...is further evidence that this indicator has become more than just a snapshot of the health of a key part of the U.S. economy and the outlook for monetary policy."

CNBC reported that the manufacturing industry, which has been particularly hard hit since the Clinton Administration, has added roughly 293,000 jobs since President Trump's election, according to Department of Lahor data

"For the second quarter as a whole, industrial production advanced at an annual rate of 6.0 percent, its third consecutive quarterly increase. Manufacturing output moved up 0.8 percent in June. The production of motor vehicles and parts rebounded last month after truck assemblies fell sharply in May because of a disruption at a parts supplier. Factory output, aside from motor vehicles and parts, increased 0.3 percent in June. The index for mining rose 1.2 percent and surpassed the level of its previous historical peak (December 2014): the output of utilities moved down 1.5 percent. At 107.7 percent of its 2012 average, total industrial production was 3.8 percent higher in June than it was a year earlier. Capacity utilization for the industrial sector increased 0.3 percentage point in June to 78.0 percent, a rate that is 1.8 percentage points below its long-run (1972–2017) average."

Further improvements may arrive soon. As the New York Analysis reported in June, an 18 year decline in American manufacturing may be drawing to a close, a result of tougher trade stances by the Trump Administration. Within two months of President Trump's inauguration, AFL-CIO president Richard Trumka noted: "America's working families welcome the Department of Commerce's examination of China's economy. A thorough assessment is necessary to ensure American workers are competing on a level playing field. Any fair analysis of the facts will reaffirm that China's extensive government involvement merits 'nonmarket economy' treatment so that the U.S. can properly address dumped, underpriced goods and services that hurt U.S. workers and producers."

While Washington has the upper economic hand in its tariff dispute with China, the politics involved are not as favorable. Inevitably, there may be temporary pain in any battle, even one that is clearly going to result in a victory. That problem will affect the President and his party, due to several factors that his Chinese counterpart can, for his part, largely ignore. Xi doesn't have to worry about the next election, nor does he face a hostile media.


While both the belated tough stance on trade and the general economic progress should be welcomed, the fact is that partisan politics apparently takes precedence. Stephen Moore and Arthur Laffer wrote in The Wall Street Journal "Liberals have opposed virtually every move President Trump has taken on the economy, which makes it inconvenient for them that economic conditions are so universally positive. It is hard to find a single indicator that isn't pointed in a bullish direction. That's why the left is now forced to argue that Mr. Trump's economic success is really the continuation of a trend that began under President Obama... Mr. Trump has reversed nearly every Obama rule, edict and law that he can legally overturn. At its core, the Trump economic strategy wasn't complicated: systematically repeal Mr. Obama's 'accomplishments' - the tax increases, the regulatory blitz on business, the welfare expansions, the war on American fossil fuels, and so on.'



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

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



gives New Yorkers reliable options to get where they need to go."

He said that Bronx residents could now get to Wall Street in 45 minutes as opposed to 90 minutes.

Assemblyman Crespo said that a lot of advocacy went into making Soundview the site of the borough's first ferry landing, with the location making sense because of the many working families living in the nearby communities.

"I am hoping that ridership will grow and there will be an expansion of landings around the Bronx," said Crespo aboard the ferry, adding that he could foresee more landings as people get to see ferry service as a better option in many cases to other forms of transportation.

The assemblyman added that he hopes sooner rather than later passengers will have the ability to transfer using a MetroCard between the ferry and other forms of public transportation.

Marlene Cintron, Bronx Overall Bx27 bus line into Clason Point Park Economic Development Corporation president, said that the ferry offers opportunities to better connect the borough to the rest of the city and affords commuters the ability to get to and from Manhattan faster and with less aggravation.

Cintron said having the ferry in Soundview would make the community more accessible, and lead people to discover Soundview and possibly attract some to move there.

Passengers on the maiden NYC Ferry voyage were enthusiastic about the new service.

Sarwar Jahan of Parkchester said

that he and his children plan on utilizing the ferry from Soundview, noting that it was easily accessible via mass transit and avoids much of the traffic into Manhattan.

"It is a completely different atmosphere," said Jahan, as he took in the view. "You can see a lot. It is a very pleasant trip."

Debby Kawalick of Pelham Parkway said the ferry offers a nice quick commute and she hopes that ferry service expands in the borough, saying the only thing that she is disappointed with is an apparent lack of parking near the ferry slip.

The ferry boat on the maiden voyage featured two decks - a climatecontrolled enclosed lower deck and an outdoor upper deck - along with a snack bar and restroom.

Crespo said that based on his understanding many members of the crews of the city's ferries are graduates of SUNY Maritime College in Throggs Neck.

The district manager of Community Board 9, William Rivera, said that the community is elated about the Soundview ferry.

"The ferry will shorten commute time from the Bronx to Manhattan for our local residents and our hope is that it will alleviate mass transit traffic in our district," said Rivera.

Hornblower operates the route, which is part of NYC Ferry.

In a statement released on August 15, James Patchett, NYC Economic Development Corporation president and CEO, said that city's ferry network is a game changer for many.

Starting today, Bronxites now have a fast, comfortable and affordable way to get to major job centers and other opportunities along the East Side of Manhattan," said Patchett.

CUSP-NYC. He's even going to be featured in the publication ARTSY for his unique, texture driven style.

That unique style is a process to say the least. It begins with SinXero making his own ingredients mixed from marble dust, to chemicals, oils and acrylic paints and almost anything that the painter can get his hands on. Like a loaf of bread, his handmade mixtures cause rising and elevation within the paint, thus giving his works the texture that they're known for.

The process for painting is even more elaborate than that. SinXero works on multiple paintings at a time; partly because he's racing the clock against his handmade paint drying too quickly and also from having the right amount paint falling from one mounted work onto another, stationed floor-side.

SinXero's 'brushes' are more popu-

larly used for sweeping up dust or removing snow off a car during the win-

He uses brooms, scrapers, squeegees, exploding spray paint cans and many other household appliances to finish his work.

Although, 'finished,' has a different meaning to this artist.

"For me nothing is ever truly finished, once I have a painting completed I chisel the paint off and repurpose it for another work, I do this again and again until the painting tells me to stop," SinXero said.

People have been astonished at the paintings that SinXero created and then destroyed during his repurposing process

"That's what I mean by destruction, just like the Bronx, what was destroyed is now in that flux and being recreated, taking these elements of history that I keep digging up and repurposing them towards a new light is my intention."



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
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
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
