NYPD INSPECTS PIPE BOMBS

De Niro, CNN explosive devices sent to firing range

the NYPD bomb squad.

The special task force has been working around the clock at its Rodman's Neck facility after 56-year-old Floridian Cesar Sayoc allegedly sent a series explosive devices to CNN's Columbus Circle headquarters on Wednesday, October 24 as well as Robert De Niro's Tribeca Grill restaurant at 375 Greenwich Street on Thursday, October 25 in addition to many other targets nationwide.

The first challenge that the bomb squad faced was moving explosives from Manhattan to the Pelham Bay facility.

Needless to say that the bombs couldn't just sit on the passenger seat of a squad car during the ride over.

For situations like this, the It's been a busy few days for NYPD calls in a specialized, total containment vessel.

"It's designed to be able to withstand a blast if the explosive were to detonative while within the TCV," police sources explained. "If it were to explode in the TCV then the pressure would escape through a series of small vents around it's outside, which means that we don't have to worry about evacuating the people in the surrounding area while moving the device," the officer added.

After being loaded up, the TCV was given a police escort

to Rodman's Neck to get the explosives away from the unsuspecting public in case of an unintended detonation.

Once arrived, the detonation of the devices is done primarily as a last resort by the NYPD.

The purpose of the Rodman's Neck facility is to analyze and disassemble the explosive devices during the contingent investigation.

"It's essentially a CSI for bombs," said Bob Bieder, 45th Precinct Community Council president whom has toured the facility in the past. "If you end up detonating the device you can't find out much about it or its origin," he added.

Beider went on to explain that every single NYPD-recovered explosive device in

Ocasio-Cortez, Biaggi await voter nod

While many candidates for elective office across New York state scurry to make last minute preparations for Tuesday, November 6, the general election is just a formality for two Bronx candidates who upset the political landscape with surprise primary victories.

That's because 14th Congressional district candidate Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez and 34th senatorial district candidate Alessandra Biaggi did their heavy lifting on their respective primary days by separately upsetting 20year political backbones in

the Democratic Party, Congressman Joseph Crowley and 7-term state senator, Jeff

All that's left is for the general election voter to validate their earlier victories so they can officially claim their place in the Albany or Washington D.C. legislative chambers starting in January 2019.

Ocasio-Cortez's campaign, armed with clipboards in plastic bags, overcame being outspent 18 to 1 per vote to defeat establishment-based Crowley. "It's no secret he's very well financed," Ocasio-Cortez said days before her first primary election ever. "But people don't know him, especially the Bronx, so we aren't scared of big money because we have big people," the Parkchester native added.


While Crowley has spent more time strumming Bruce Springsteen hits on his guitar rather than campaigning this autumn, his name will still appear on the Working Families

Since that fateful Tuesday, June 26 the progressive wave began flooding the Bronx, leading to the rise of Biaggi

\$11 million for Jacobi hospital energy efficiency project

One the borough's largest institutions will be embarking on an upcoming energy conservation project expected to have a positive impact on patients, staff and visitors.

Jacobi Medical Center is undertaking a major \$11 million two-phase energy efficiency renovation project of its lighting and physical plant that will kick off with new roadway lamps so efficiently powered by both wind and solar that they don't need to be connected to the power grid.

It will later be moving on to larger, significant energy efficiency projects around the hospital.

The nifty new campus lights will be installed beginning within a month as part of the first phase of the twopart project, with 22 new exterior lights around the Pelham Parkway campus that have a photovoltaic solar panel and wind turbine atop each individual fixture.

They will replace 36 existing street lamps that brighten the hospital's sprawling campus with greener, cleaner and

much more luminous lighting, said Cyril Toussaint, director of Energy Management and Sustainably for NYC's Health + Hospitals corporation.

A similar installation of 11 of the innovative outdoor lamps at Kings County Hospital in Brooklyn is proving so successful that more are now being planned, said Toussaint.

Whether it's a windy or sunny day, energy is collected and stored in a battery located inside the individual lights, he said.

Toussaint added that the corporation conducted evaluations to make sure the lights would work at their intended locations.

"Jacobi is a great place to have these types of lights," said Toussaint.

Additionally, during the project's second phase that's expected to take place from early 2019 to mid 2020, the three tower lights that illuminate the hospital's parking lots near Building 6, from 18 high wattage panels, will be replaced with energy efficient LED lights.

energy usage by two-thirds compared to the current tower lamps, saving roughly 70,000 kilowatt hours annually while the solar/wind powered lamps will save even more.

The LED fixtures will cut alone, "we will be saving about 135,000 kilowatt hours annually, which is equivalent to moving 25 passenger cars off the road or equivalent to powering 15 homes," said Toussaiant.

In addition to these larger Between the two new out- lights, thousands of LED en-

installed over the full duration of the project, including inside the main hospital building, some of which haven't been updated since around World $\bar{\text{War}}$ II, said a Jacobi spokesman.

The larger project, expected to last 18 months, includes more energy efficient controls and lights inside hospital buildings, exterior lighting changes, upgrades to the hospital's chiller plant (which produces cold air and air conditioning), minor boiler plant upgrades, and the repair and/or replacement of three to four air handling units in order to make them more energy efficient.

"These energy efficient measures will have a definite impact on patient and staff well-being," said Toussaint. "Additionally, we will be working to reduce greenhouse emissions in New York City."

New York City Health + Hospitals is working aggressively towards reducing greenhouse gas emissions by 50% by 2025, and also meeting the mayor's goal of reducing emissions by 80% by 2050, said Toussaint.

Almost half a year after the horrendous and tragic murder of 15-yearold Lesandro 'Junior' Guzman-Feliz, the Justice for Junior movement has reached it's next, more powerful stage in the Bronx Hall of Justice on Thursday, October 25.

A packed basement courtroom held hearings for 13 of the 14 accused gang members behind the gruesome killing, all of which have plead "not guilty.'

People came from all over to observe the hearings, going to the extent of waiting on line outside of the courtroom for people to leave in between the multiple hearings to secure a seat inside.

While the court's proceedings did not extend past the prosecution's request for DNA sampled from all of the accused, it's what happened outside of the courthouse that was most captivating.

Once again, Bronxites and New Yorkers alike were rallying for Junior's cause before leading a march from the Hall of Justice to the infamous Bodega on East 183rd Street and Bathgate Avenue where Junior had been slashed to death.

Junior's parents, Leandra Feliz and Lisandro Guzman were there to address the crowd of mostly moms

and their children before the 3-mile long march.

"I just need justice for my son," Leandra told supporters. "They left me dead and my heart broken," she emotionally said in Spanish.

Just about every day now, she goes to her son's final resting place in St. Raymond's Cemetery to reflect on Junior's life and the years of memories that the mother and son had shared.

"I still can't believe what happened, it still doesn't feel real to me," said Leandra. "There's been so much to process with this that I simply haven't yet," the grieving mother added.

Leandra went on to share the final memories that her and Junior had shared, which came just moments before the gruesome attack.

"He called me right before, he said he was running downstairs to give a friend five dollars. But he was taking too long so I called him back and the last thing he said to me was "I'm coming back now mommy," that was the last thing that my son ever said to me," Leandra said.

While Leandra is overwhelmingly grateful for the support she and her family has received, the walk to the cursed bodega only holds pain for the grieving mother.

"This is a corner of death, nobody wants the store here. I don't want the store here. I've lived in this area for 17 years and this is a troubled intersection, we need a safe haven," Leandra said in August at one of many memorials for Junior.

The suspects: Jose Tavarez, Manuel Rivera, Danel Fernandez, Danilo Payamps Pacheco, Diego Suero, Gabriel Ramirez Concepcion, Ronald Urena, Frederick Then, Jonaiki Martinez Estrella, Antonio Rodriguez Hernandez Santiago, Jose Muniz, Elvin Garcia and Luis Cabrera Santos are scheduled to be back in court on Friday, December 21 for another hearing.

Mt. Eden scatter-site tenants sue landlord in Fed Court

Tenants at one Mount Eden building are taking their landlord to court for allegedly threatening to evict them.

The Bronx Legal Services' Tenant Coalition filed a Federal Discrimination Complaint in U.S. Federal Court on behalf of the tenants of 1555 Grand Concourse on Wednesday, October 24.

The tenants receive organizing support from Community Action for Safe Apartments (CASA) and legal representation by Bronx Legal Services' Tenant Rights Coalition funded by the NYC Human Resources Administration's Anti-Harassment and Tenant Protection program.

They demand their landlord, Pistilli Realty cease its evictions and be held accountable for damages caused to their families.

The tenants claim they are being discriminated by Pistilli Realty for participating in the HIV/AIDS Service Administration-funded, scatter-site housing programs.

Pistilli Realty announced mass evictions of all 'program apartments' earlier this year; less than five months after it purchased the 149-unit, 139,000 square foot building from the late Harry Silverstein's estate for approximately \$29.8 million in September

The Queens-based real estate group

has made many alterations, to the building, which the tenants have labeled 'cosmetic', but their complaints of poor living conditions and unfair treatment by management persists, they claim.

"When the landlord took over the building I noticed that they gave the building a facelift and then immediately started evicting people and renovating apartments and that's when I realized they had a bigger, money hungry agenda," said Robert White, tenant leader.

The various programs currently leasing apartments were given a May 31, 2018 deadline to remove all program tenants.

For decades, the 91-year-old, 6-story elevated building has housed dozens of families via scatter-site housing which provides stable housing for a vulnerable HIV affected population, CASA

According to NYC Housing Preservation and Development, as of Tuesday, October 30 the property has 146 open violations consisting of 16 Class A non-hazardous, 82 Class B hazardous and 48 Class C immediately hazardous violations.

Tenants live with chronic leaks, damaged floors and dangerously antiquated electrical systems, the complaint alleges.

"You'd think that my biggest prob-

lem would be my illness, but really what it is it's the landlord trying to take me out of my home and putting me somewhere where I don't know my neighbors," expressed Susan Guthridge.

Like Guthridge, many tenants suffer from chronic health issues and limited mobility, are elderly or have young working families.

Scatter-site housing is often criticized for depriving tenants their fundamental rights and for depleting the city's affordable housing stock by allowing rent regulated apartments' landlords to charge astronomically high rents and remove housing from rent regulation.

No eviction proceedings have started, however tenants state that management is allegedly using several tactics to force them out.

Pistilli Realty owns approximately 28 buildings and 2,000 apartments in

Pistilli did not return requests for comment.



P 'Diddy' pledges \$1 million to open Bronx charter school

Technically he's not from the Bronx, but that didn't stop rap legend Sean 'Diddy' Combs' from pledging one million dollars to open a charter school in the borough on Tuesday, October 23.

Diddy is partnering with Capital Preparatory Schools network, which operates many charter schools from New York to Bridgeport, CT. The new branch will be called Capital Prep Bronx with a location as yet to be se-

these kids live in every day," Combs said following the announcement.

The new location, approved to open September 2019, will continue the network's efforts to provide historically underserved communities' access to the same high quality, competitive curriculum seen in other places.

"I understand the importance of access to a great education, and the critical role it plays in a child's future. Our school provides historically disadvantaged students with the college and career skills needed to become responsible and engaged citizens for social

justice," Combs boasted.

Capital Prep Bronx will open to serve 160 students in 6th through 7th grade.

The school then plans to grow those numbers to eventually 650 students as 8th through 12th grades during an initial five-year term.

This announcement also represents an expansion in the partnership between Combs and renowned educator Dr. Steve Perry, founder of Capital Prep Schools.

"Mr. Combs' commitment and lead-"I came from the same environment ership continue to inspire us. On behalf of the Capital Prep students, parents and teachers I want to express our sincerest gratitude for such a generous gift," Dr. Perry said.

Perry went on to discuss that the families in the Bronx deserve a highquality academic alternative to the current system.

Forty percent of Capital Prep applicants, approximately 600 students, come from the Bronx.

'There is a real need to serve students in this area. Mr. Combs wanted to open schools to develop leaders. What he's done with his investment is

embody what we expect students to do, which is to invest their resources in our communities," Perry added.


Combs, a Harlem native and longtime proponent of education and opportunity for young people, worked closely with Dr. Perry to expand the school to new locations as well as build community support and enlist a team of educators, parents and business leaders to bring the idea to fruition. He attended Mount St. Michael High School

Morrison Ave. Bodega Owner Fatally Shot



Police are investigating an attempted robbery that left a suspect fatally shot by a bodega owner. According to the NYPD, 43rd Precinct police responded to a call of a robbery in progress inside of 1260 Morrison Avenue on Sunday, October 21 at 10:32 p.m. Upon entering J Market, police officers discovered Daniel Meeks, a 32-year-old Soundview resident, unconscious and unresponsive after sustaining a sunshot wound to his head. EMS responded to the scene and transported Meeks to Jacobi Hospital where he was pronounced deceased. Meeks allegedly entered the store and demanded cash from the owner before jumping over the counter. The owner allegedly produced a .357 Magnum revolver and shot Meeks. The investigation is ongoing and is being treated as a case of self-defense. The owner was taken to the 43rd Precinct for questioning and he is cooperating with law enforcment. No charges are pending against the owner who had a license to own the firearm. Police have been unable to recover another gun at the scene and believe Meeks may have been unarmed. No arrests were made following the incident.

OPED: by Alison Keller Are hate crimes becoming the norm?

"We live in a world in which we need to share responsibility. It's easy to say, 'It's not my child, not my community, not my world, not my problem.' Then there are those who see the need and respond." - Fred

I can't shake the massacre of this weekend. I feel so many things. Hopeless, sick to my stomach, angry, fearful, and so desperately sad that hate crimes are becoming a regular occurence.

How to respond to such evil? Such hatred? I don't have answers. But I do know that being silent on this forum of Facebook is no longer tenable for

Honestly, social media is the last place I want to be in these

moments of crisis. I long to share human, face to face connection during these moments of stunned outrage, grief, and sadness. I want to share a hug, share tears with friends, share rage and sorrow, and then make a plan of what we can do to respond.

I can't tell you how many posts I started to write — after the Charleston church shooting. the Pulse nightclub shooting, after the shooting of Philando Castile, after Charlottesville, after the Portland train attack. Each time I started to write, but I let my fears of expressing my vulnerability, my fear of saying it wrong, of not doing enough, of not being enough, fear of my privilege discrediting me, getting the better of me. Fear of reactions I would get, fear of the non-reactions. Fear of my post just dying in the faced paced world of social media. Fear of no one caring about what I had to say anyway.

Well, I just can't do that any more. I can't accept that. This is too big. This is bigger than my fear. I can't give in to my fear and silence any longer.

I say to my Jewish friends, colleagues, and neighbors — I am thinking of you, I am grieving with you, although I know it doesn't do anything to lessen the pain and the anguish you are experiencing.

I say to everyone who reads this post—no matter your religion, race, ethnicity, nationality, gender or background — what happened at the Tree end is everyone's problem. The problem is the growing fragmentation, isolation, fear, and hatred growing in our society. The problem is divisiveness and "othering" of whole groups of people for their thoughts, their beliefs, their identities, and how they express themselves. I will not tolerate this othering of people — at the macro level or at the micro level. I will not tolerate bigotry or hatred in any form, and I will not tolerate hate speech and demeaning speech in the many insidious ways in which it is expressed including jokes and many other subtle ways that we perpetuate bias and intolerance within our social groups.



Co-op City community leader Joe Boiko passes

A Bronxite who made an enormous impact on his own community while reaching out to neighboring ones was fondly remembered this past week.

Joseph Boiko, who passed away at 63 on Wednesday, October 24, was Riverbay Corporation's director of Special Projects. He also held other titles in Co-op City's management over the years, such as ombudsman, where he functioned as liaison between cooperators and management.

Boiko oversaw major improvement projects in the sprawling development such as the elevator modernization and laundry room contracts.

Boiko was the 45th Precinct Community Council vice president and a Community Board 10 member.

He spent more than two decades at the Riverbay Volunteer Ambulance Corps, his sister Betsy Boiko said.

He was trained as an Emergency Medical Technician and in CPR, and organized a bi-annual blood drive in Co-op City, according to friends.

Boiko is described as a go getter who was confident in his ability to get whatever needed doing done.

He was affectionately know as 'unca' to the children of family and friends, a nickname he first acquired decades ago when a friend's ninemonth-old daughter tried to call Joe 'uncle,' his sister Debbie Dolgin said.

He [Boiko] stayed on top of everything and was a great vice president in the sense that he would take care of whatever needed doing.

"My two kids were the light of my brother's life," said Dolgin, adding she recalled how they frequently called him for advice on all kinds of practical matters.

At Riverbay, which manages Co-op City, general manager Noel Ellison, recalled that Boiko had a 'can-do' attitude.

"I think working and living here gave him a clear sense of the cultural and social life of this community," said Ellison. "He took pride in what he did and did his work with a great deal of confidence."

Sonia Feliciano, a Riverbay board of director and a neighbor of Boiko's in Co-op City, where he lived since 1972,

said that when she and her daughters moved to the community Boiko taught her about the neighborhood.

"I will always be indebted to him because he embraced me and my children when I moved here," said Feliciano, adding "He introduced me to community service," and brought her onto the board of the 45th Precinct Community Council, where she is now board secretary.

"If you need to know something, you would ask Joe," said Feliciano.

At the 45th Precinct Community Council, he will be sorely missed for a variety of reasons, but perhaps especially because he worked behind the scenes to make the organization's annual gala breakfast run seamlessly, said council board members Annie Boller and John Doyle.

"He stayed on top of everything and was a great vice president in the sense that he would take care of whatever needed doing," said Bob Bieder, 45th Precinct Community Council president.

Matt Cruz, Community Board 10 district manager, said that Boiko knew so much about Co-op City and had a lot of knowledge to share.

Cruz said that when he was tasked with an assignment, he would do it very quickly.

"He was an even-tempered person, and about as organized and thoughtful as they come," said Cruz.

Long-time friend Barbara Penn recalled that Boiko was always giving of himself to anyone who needed assistance.

"He had such a big heart, and cared especially about the Co-op City community," she said.

34th Bronx Veterans Parade in Throggs Neck November 18

The 34th Annual Bronx Veterans Day Parade in Throggs Neck promises to be a fitting salute to veterans across our borough.

The parade kicks off at noon on Sunday, November 18 at Lafayette and East Tremont avenues and marches via Randall Avenue to Bicentennial Veterans Memorial Park, where there will be a reviewing stand and tribute to honor all those who served their country.

The grand marshal for the parade is Country Club's Robert Doonan, a retired U.S. Army Captain who was a helicopter pilot during the Vietnam War with the 101st Aviation Battalion.

Later, Doonan taught math at his alma matter Cardinal Spellman High School for 22 years.

Doonan is the recipient of the Bronze Star Medal, Air Medal with V (Valor), Army Commendation Medal, Army Good Conduct Medal, Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross, Vietnam Service Medal, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, as well as Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross and Republic of Vietnam Civil Action ribbons.

Doonan credits his upbringing in the borough and a number of jobs he had as a teenager with his establishing a track record of success and a strong work ethic that he built on during his time in the service and afterwards.

"I totally enjoyed the service," he said, adding that he would recommend a tour of duty in one of the branches of the U.S. Armed Services to a young person who isn't sure of what he or she wants to do with their life.

"You met people from all over the country, and you cannot get that experience anywhere else," said Doonan, adding that the interactions with people from different parts of the country broadened his outlook.

During his year of military service he resupplied troops by Huey helicopter who were actively engaging the enemy.

On one occasion he risked his life to save a solider who needed immediate medical attention during a battle near Landing Zone Vagel, the A Sau Valley and Hue in Vietnam in a low visibility situation where he used an improvised maneuver to reach the wounded solider.

For this effort, where he had to rely on his memory of the valley because of heavy cloud cover, he earned the Air Medal with a V.

Doonan said that many Vietnam nizers said.

veterans did not come home to a fitting welcome, so that parades like the veterans parade on the 18th in Throggs Neck are especially important.

Carolyn Engeldrum, chairperson of United Veterans Parade Committee of Greater NY Inc., which hosts the parade said that the committee would continue its 'adopt a block' program for schools from around Throggs Neck and neighboring communities that want to participate.

"Our goal with the parade in the past couple of years has been to include a little education and our youth," said Engeldrum.

The parade will continue to highlight the issue of veteran suicide with a procession of 22 folded flags at the start of the parade, symbolizing the roughly 22 past and present service members who take their own lives daily.

This years pre-parade breakfast for marchers will be sponsored by Councilman Mark Gjoanj, who picks it up from Senator Jeff Klein who hosted the event in previous years.

Gjonaj plans to keep the pre-parade breakfast tradition going to pay special tribute to veterans service, organizers said.












TAPCo raises \$500k funds for student TV production studio

A local school is fundraising to build a state of the art television production studio.

The Theater Arts Production Community School in Fordham is in the process of raising funds and forming an ongoing industry partnership needed to build the television production facility for students that will complement a rooftop garden with an outdoor stage that is currently under construction.

Principal Ron Link said the school has formed a partnership with non-profit Hispanic Information Telecommunications Network that should provide the technical expertise TAPCo needs to construct a new television studio space, as well as a new control room, video editing room, classroom specifically for television production and an outdoor soundstage.

Assemblyman Victor Pichardo visited the school on Friday, October 26 and provided TAPCo with a \$500,000 check towards their television production effort.

Pichardo said that when he was first elected he visited every school in his district, and shortly after visiting TAPCo, he was able to connect them with HITN, which had been looking to partner with borough schools as part of its educational mission.

The partnership between HITN and the school has been underway for about three years, said Pichardo, with Link saying that they HITN is providing students with learning opportunities, such as their Film Critic Bootcamp, at their Brooklyn headquarters.

Pichardo said that the television studio would be a continuation of the emerging partnership, and would give students the 21st century digital media skills that will directly prepare students for future jobs in the field.

"Our children deserve the best of of other programs, said Link.

the best," said Pichardo. "We need to make sure that they are learning with the most updated technology of this field."

Link said that he envisions using a rooftop garden, that is currently under construction and being funded by Councilman Ritchie Torres, as an outdoor soundstage with cameras, expanding on the possible uses for the sustainable outdoor oasis.

Design classes at the school came up with the renderings for the control room, classroom, soundstage in the garden with outdoor cantilevered cameras controlled from inside, and a studio.

"We will be the first school in the city – public or private – to have this for our students," said Link, adding it its most appropriate for the TAPCo, a performing arts school.

Currently if TAPCo students want to learn how to be camera operators, videographers, editors or be on-air personalities, they are afforded the opportunity either as a part of HITN television station internships or are fed through a pipeline by HITN to a score of other programs, said Link.





How seniors can preserve their brains

hysical activity and proper diet and nutrition can help people age 50 and older maintain their physical health. But there are also ways aging men and women can preserve brain health in an effort to prevent or delay the cognitive decline that affects millions of seniors across the globe.

It's easy to overlook the importance of keeping the brain healthy. However, a decline in brain function can result in poor concentration, memory loss, and a host of other issues. Sometimes, by the time symptoms present themselves, it may be too late to reverse any damage.

Research suggests that a combination of nutrition and mental, social, and physical activities may have a greater impact with regard to maintaining and improving brain health than any single activity. Harvard Medical School also states that volunteering, caring for others, and pursuing hobbies may benefit the brains of older adults.

A study published in the Archives of General Psychiatry found participants who reported higher levels of purpose in life exhibited superior cognitive function despite the accumulation of abnormal protein depositions (amyloid plaques and neurofibrillary

tangles) in the brain, a hallmark of Alzheimer's disease. Having a purpose also may help those who do not have Alzheimer's disease.

In addition to the suggestions mentioned above, those who want to boost brain health can consider these strategies:

Start exercising the brain early on. A study published in 2012 in the

British Medical Journal examined cognitive function in people ages 45 to 70. Researchers found evidence of cognitive decline in the 45-year-old participants as well as the older participants. It's never too early to put a brain health plan into motion.

Read more books. Reading can open individuals up to new vocabulary and scenarios that promote a stronger

brain and recall ability. Enrolling in an education course at a local college, community center, or online also may be beneficial.

Hit the gym. Several studies suggest an association between physical activity and reduced risk of cognitive decline. This could be because exercise elevates heart rate, which pumps more blood to the brain and body.

Supplement with DHA. DHA is an omega-3 fatty acid that is dominant in the brain. Adhere to a Mediterranean diet, which is generally high in natural sources of omega-3, including fish and mono-unsaturated fats from olives, olive oil, nuts, and seeds. Supplements also may help, but individuals should consult their doctors about which products to take.

Challenge the mind. Men and women can engage in challenging activities that stray from their routines. Puzzles, strategic games, jigsaw puzzles, or difficult hobbies can benefit the brain.

Keep a close-knit group of friends. Regular conversation and social interaction is a key component of any brain health wellness plan.

Slowing cognitive decline and promoting greater brain health should be a priority for adults of all ages.





Museums at Hebrew Home for the Aged

Aged is located at 5901 Palisade Avenue just south of the College of Mount Saint Vincent in Riverdale.

Among their many amenities for both residents and visitors are outdoor and indoor art galleries containing a wide variety of art forms including works by Pablo Picasso, Frank Stella, Andy Warhol, and noted abstract painter Joan Mitchell, along with massive outdoor sculptures by such artists as Michael Poast, Leonard Ursachi, and others too numerous to name here.

The home, by the way, is a member of the American Association of Museums. Their collection continues to grow and now contains over 5000 quality pieces of art including paintings, sketches, prints, photo-

The Hebrew Home for the graphs, sculptures and even a unique antique doll collection.

Since it is difficult for the aged residents to get out to museums, the Hebrew Home has brought the art to them.

The home was actually founded when the Beth Hemedrosh Hagodol Synagogue opened a shelter for homeless men in 1915. It soon became apparent that the needs of the homeless far exceeded their resources, so two years later, on May 10, 1917, they opened a separate facility at East 105th Street in Harlem and it was incorporated that same year. That was the start of something grand.

The needs of the homeless continued to grow and it became obvious that their response to those needs would have to be expanded.

the Colored Orphan Asylum, which incidentally once provided temporary housing to Ella Fitzgerald, on the bank of the Hudson River closed in 1946, they looked into purchasing that 19-acre site and this was effected in 1948.

The Hebrew Home is a nonsectarian geriatric center catering to over 3000 seniors with its varied programs. The Defner Judaica Museum was named for the late Helen and Harold Defner, benefactors of the home and opened on May 6, 2009. The museum is among the prime attractions for visitors from around the globe.

It is open Sunday through Thursday 10:30 am to 4:30 pm except on holidays and admission is free and open to the public and certainly well-worth a visit.

The outdoor art is open on a daily basis during the same hours. The chief coordinator is Susan Chevlowe who is largely responsible for its tremendous success and has held that post


since March 3, 2008.

The Michael Poast huge outdoor steel sculpture titled Windy Voyage' is what first attracted my attention. Perhaps it was the bright red color or the odd interconnected shapes, but it certainly gave me cause to look a little closer and appreciate his creative effort. It was crafted in 2006 and presented to the Hebrew Home in 2010. Its positioning on a grassy lea

overlooking the Hudson River and the Palisades seems to make it even more attractive.

Poast holds a Master of Fine Arts degree as well as an MMA and BA and is on the faculty of both St. John's University and Pratt Institute.

The next time you're in the vicinity of the home, stop by the museum and you'll be surprised at all they have to offer.

It is not merely coincidental that California Senator Diane Feinstein was the center of the Kavanaugh controversy. In September of 2017. she vehemently opposed the nomination of Notre Dame law professor Amy Coney Barrett to the Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals, for a very inappropriate reason. In a stunning round of questioning, Senator Dick Durbin asked the nominee "Do you consider yourself an Orthodox Catholic," a query which was followed by the even more offensive comment by Senator Feinstein that "The [Catholic] dogma lives loudly within you, and that's of concern."

George Parry, writing for the American Spectator noted that "Questioning of judicial nominee's Catholicism by Feinstein and Durbin would make the Klan proud. Article VI of the Constitution prohibits a religious test for public office.

Nevertheless, last week in the Senate Judiciary Committee, Democratic Sens. Dick Durbin and Diane Feinstein grilled a judicial nominee about the depth of her Catholic faith and made clear was 'too Catholic' to hold office.' Noah Feldman wrote in

Bloomberg last month that "Feinstein's anti-Catholic questions are an outrage. Senator Dianne Feinstein owes a public apology to judicial nominee Amy Coney Barrett — and an explanation to all Americans who condemn religious bias. The media, concentrating solely on the uncorroborated allegations made by Ms. Ford, ignored the extremely controversial issue that Kavanaugh was targeted for his faith.

James S. Robbins, writing in USA Today, reported "We've seen anti-Catholic bigotry hurled at Supreme Court justices before from groups like the KKK. Now it's coming from the modern that, in their estimation, she left...These days liberals have with politicians from both

CNN contributor Dean Obeidallah maintained that "there are people who want to impose Christian Sharia law in this country." It was an ironic comment since progressives would be thrilled to support a Muslim court nominee whose jurisprudence was informed by actual Sharia. And the Daily Beast tells us that President Trump is 'carrying out the agenda of a small, secretive network of extremely conservative Catholic activists."

'In February 1990, agitated by statements by Cardinal O'Connor and New York auxiliary bishop Austin Vaughan critical of Governor Mario Cuomo's record on abortion, the well-known historian Arthur M. Schlesinger, Jr. informed readers of the Times's op-ed page that O'Connor and Vaughan were doing their best to verify the fears long cherished by

the No-Nothings [sic] in the 1850's, the Ku Klux Klan in the 1920's, and a succession of anti-Catholic demagogues that the Roman Catholic Church would try to overrule the American democratic process.

"During a debate over school-choice legislation in Pennsylvania, 'Jack Grier, the teachers' union president in Easton, Pennsylvania, told the local school board that 'The enemy to public education in the state of Pennsylvania is the Catholic Church. If the Catholic Church were to cease to exist and disappear today, it would be better for all of us."

Emma Green reported in The Atlantic that Michael Wear, the former director of Barack Obama's 2012 faithoutreach efforts, found that "The administration was unnecessarily antagonistic toward religious conservatives..."

The anti-Catholic bent of the Democrat Left is not restricted to that one faith. The rejection of Evangelicals, and the acceptance of anti-Israel and anti-Semitic beliefs on the part of that party has become a major issue, even if the media refuses to acknowledge it.

The first year of the Market at Preston was a rousing success. Thanks to everyone who joined us week after week, especially our vendors. Kudos to Preston High School

for giving us this opportunity and we can't wait to come back next year even bigger and better.

Along with my partners, Sherrill Cropper and Lourdes Gamez, we are busy planning a Holiday Craft and Food Festival on Saturday, December 8 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Confetti Party Place, 3190 Westchester Avenue in Pelham Bay. We're also working on a series of winter markets from January to May at the same location; I'll share that information once we confirm our details.

The CSA is still going strong. Last week I arrived at the distribution site to get ready for the truck's arrival. My friend Sherrill, whose driveway we are using for the CSA, came out to help me set up. She let me know that she had a friend visiting from West Virginia, a fellow Mushroom Hunter, and that she had invited another mycological enthusiast buddy over and that they were all going for a forage – would I like to join them? Of course, I said, even though I had a list of things to do that day.

As it would happen, my phone battery ran out as soon as we got to the foraging spot and I found myself in an unusual situation: in an old growth forest without any connection to the internet. We spent four hours walking through the woods, encountering deer while they roamed peacefully, with nothing but the sound of the breeze through the trees to accompany us.

It was amazing how the lack of stimulation allowed me to see so clearly, spotting all sorts of specimens as we wandered and meandered on and off the beaten path.

I found a few edible varieties and was gifted a beautiful hen of the woods from Sherrill's West Virginia friend. you want to see in the world.



She referred me to a recipe for Mushroom Jerky, which I went home and started making that night. The first step was to boil the cleaned and trimmed mushroom for ten minutes before put-

ting it into the marinade overnight. I used my Roast Apricot Curry Catsup for the marinade. I saved the water after boiling as it was a delicious mushroom stock, which inspired me.

I thought about the bunch of other mushrooms and another hen of the woods that was a little past its prime and sort of dried out, all sitting in my fridge. Last weekend, my husband and I made 27 quarts of Chicken Bone Broth, so this weekend we decided to make a batch of Mushroom Stock for our vegetarian and vegan friends. We took all the mushrooms and tossed them in a sheet pan with some olive oil and salt and pepper. We added a few cloves of garlic and a shallot and roasted them at 425 degrees for 20 minutes. We added the vegetables to the stock pot, threw in the water from the mushrooms we boiled for the jerky plus more water to fill the pot, and 24 hours and nine quarts later, we are definitely ready for winter soup season.

We purchased a case of sweet potatoes for the market and were left with about a half case, so we also spent some time roasting and processing potatoes. We had to roast them in two batches. One and a half of the batches was peeled and put through the food mill for use in pierogi and puddings over the winter. The rest were frozen whole and will be used with kale and feta in tortes.

We've got three more weeks of CSA left, but our freezer is filled with frozen vegetables and tomato sauce. The fridge is filled with jars of stock, jams, chutnevs and pickles.

This coming weekend, we're heading up to DIG Farm for a Friendsgiving celebration. Looking forward to the holidays In the meantime, be the change

Vaccines for the older adults

It is that time again – flu season. A perfect time to talk about the importance of vaccines for adults who are 65+. As we age, our immune system does not work as well as it did when we were younger, which puts us at risk for getting illnesses like the flu, pneumonia, and shingles. Our age and weakened immune system makes us more vulnerable to complications from these illnesses. These complications can range from mild to severe disease, disability, hospitalization, and possi-

Influenza (also called the" flu") is a viral illness that is contagious and that affects your respiratory system. Medical conditions such as diabetes, asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), heart disease, sickle cell disease, and kidney/liver disorders can increase the likelihood of potentially serious health problems from the flu. The best way to protect your health is to get a yearly flu vaccination.

Pneumonia. Pneumonia is a type of pneumococcal disease, and pneumococcal pneumonia is the most common type of this illness contracted by adults. The CDC estimates that approximately 900,000 Americans get this illness each year, and that between 5-7% of people who have to be hospitalized as a result die. There are two types of vaccines used to prevent pneumococcal diseases; PCV13 is given to all adults 65+; and for those adults 65+ that have certain health conditions that put them at greater risk, they also get PPSV23.

Shingles (also known as herpes zoster) is a type of viral disease that shows up as a painful, blistering skin rash. It is caused by the same virus that causes chicken pox, the varicellazoster virus. Those older than 50 are more likely to develop shingles. There are two types of shingles vaccines, RZV and ZVL. We recommend that you speak with your health care provider to find out which one is best for





the city is sent to Rodman's Neck to be analyzed.

"Usually the bomb squad will take the device apart first to identify where

each of its components was either purchased or created which often helps track down a suspect," Beider said. "A good amount of the time the bomb squad finds finger prints, powders, and other pieces of evidence that can

link to a suspect," he also mentioned.

In this case, the bomb squad is investigating two pipe bombs, each mailed in a thick, yellow envelope with no post-marking except for six American Flag stamps and return address to Florida Congresswoman Debbie Wasserman-Schultz.

The bomb mailed to CNN was intended for former CIA director John Brennan, although the packaging was addressed to 'John Brenan.'

The device itself, which police believe mirrored all others recovered nationwide contained a roughly six-inch cylinder connected to black and red wires wrapped in electrical tape and was connected to a detonator.

Rodman's Neck won't be the final stop for these explosives, however. Following an NYPD analysis and investigation, the pipe bombs will be shipped off to an FBI facility in Quantico, VA.

prior to her Thursday, September 13 primary win.

Biaggi also ran on a platform of progressive change and again and again called Klein out for forming the now-disbanded Independent Democratic Conference, saying that the IDC blocked progressive legislation at a time when Washington was in the hands of the Republican opposition; convincing the voter that voting alongside Republican issues was a "betrayal to the party."

In addition to being endorsed by her anticipated colleague Ocasio-Cortez, she had also counted on the support of elected officials from outside of the borough such as New York's junior U.S. Senator Kirsten Gillibrand and NYC Public Advocate Scott Stringer, who had both used this race to raise their 'progressive' credentials.

All-in all only 5% of the enrolled voters of the congressional or senate districts have cast their vote for either of the primary day winners up to this

Anthony Pappas, the Republican party candidate and Crowley will face off against Ocasio-Cortez, while Biaggi will be opposed by GOP-candidate Richard Ribustello and Klein on the Independence Party line. The Republican organization in both the Bronx and Queens recently withdrew their support for Pappas after learning he had been accused of domestic violence against his former wife.

Ocasio-Cortez, a former Bernie Sanders organizer has made some po-

litical blunders along the way including her referencing Israel as "occupiers of Palestine" during an interview, barring the press from her town hall meetings and embellishing her 'Bronx roots;' neglecting to mention that her family left the borough for Westchester during her early childhood.

Biaggi stirred some controversy as well with her supportive stance for the NYC Department of Transportation's proposal to install a 'road diet' plan on Morris Park Avenue. Community Board 11 and the Morris Park Community Association, as well as Klein, vehemently oppose the plan.

Fellow senator, Luis Sepulveda, a Crowley and Klein supporter, discussed the necessitity of bringing the establishment and progressives together in efforts to reunite the divided Democratic Party.

"There has to be an effort on both sides, we should work beyond labels here, sitting down and having a fair and open discussion because at the end of the day you will see that the two movements do have a lot in common," Sepulveda said.

He faces Republican challenger Patrick Delinces this election day following his special election to the 32nd

Senatorial District.

Sepulveda's old 87th Assembly seat is also up for grabs come Election Day. Democrat Karines Reyes will face Republican Alpheas Marcus in the general election.

Reyes, a registered nurse at the Montefiore Einstein Hospital had received Sepulveda's endorsement prior to primary victory against Farah Despinges and John Perez.

Following that primary, Reyes, the Bronx County Democratic Committeebacked candidate addressed healthcare issues that face the borough.

"We know that the Bronx is the most unhealthy county in the state, I believe it's important we start looking at our troubles through a different lens," she said.


