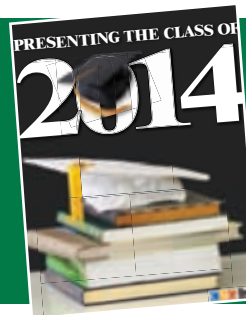

Hepatitis lawsuit hits restaurant

They wanted a taste of Asia, but two customers of a Westchester Square restaurant were served a potentially deadly liver virus, a new lawsuit claims.

David Cohen, a 42-year-old from New Jersey, and 25-year-old Bronx resident Anthony Loreto Jr., both say they became sick in September 2013 after dining at New Hawaii Sea Restaurant in August of that year, according to papers filed by lawyer Bill Marler on June 9 in Bronx Supreme

SCANLAN HAS NEW LEADER

Longtime educator becomes principal

A historic Bronx school is entering its next chapter with a new principal who says he's ready for the challenges faced by Catholic schools in the 21st Century.

Monsignor Scanlan High School appointed longtime educator and former Nazareth Regional High School principal Peter Doran as the school's new chief, and the leader of teachers and students said he plans to use the knowledge he gained at that Brooklyn school as the foundation for his new institution's future success.

"I'm thrilled to be coming to Scanlan," said Doran, who started his career teaching in 1981 and has been an administrator since 1990. "I want to continue the great work done here for 65 years."

Doran arrives at a time when Catholic schools across the city are facing rising tuitions and decreasing enrollment. There are

now 390 students at Monsignor Scanlan, he said, which only fills two of the five buildings on the campus, and he'd like to get that number up to 600 within the next three years.

His strategy for increasing enrollment is two-fold: he'll strengthen student outreach by focusing energy on visiting feeder Catholic grammar schools and increase fund-raising from alumni in order to keep tuition down and offer more partial scholarships.

"We have to help parents out somehow," said Doran.

It's important that alumni connect with the current students at the school, he said, so he would like to host dinners at the school to give students an opportunity to meet the alumni and form relationships.

Doran said similar efforts to increase enrollment at Nazareth

Law will clear way for slower streets

The state is readying a law that will clear a path to 25 miles-per-hour “slow zones” in the Bronx that will also give local community boards the chance to weigh in whenever a speed limit is lowered by 10 ticks on the speedometer.

A bill moving through the state Senate and being supported by state Sen. Jeff Klein (D–Morris Park) gives members of the lowest level of city government the right to say “yay” or “nay” to drops in speed limits of more than 10 miles per hour, allowing the groups to have a hearing on such plans 60 days before a speed limit change takes effect.

The state bill would also allow the city Department of Transportation to lower the default city speed limit from 30 mph to 25 mph, without in-

put from community boards.

State legislators had until Thursday, June 19 to vote on the bill. If it failed to pass by then, the law would be shelved until January.

Popular with boards

Klein said his bill allowed the locals who know their streets best a shot to vet slowdowns in their neighborhoods.

“When making significant changes to traffic law, our community deserves an opportunity to weigh in,” he said.

Community Board leaders around the borough said they were thrilled that the city could soon be slowing down their streets — and that they were involved in the process.

“I love that we now have a formal role in all of this,” said Tony Vitaliano, chairman of

CB11, where he said locals often use Pelham Parkway as a speedway.

The chairman of Community Board 10 said a 25 mph speed limit could help slow down tow trucks zooming through E. Tremont Avenue — but only if police cracked down on the new speed limit.

“You can make all these laws, but when it comes down to it we need enforcement,” said John Marano. “That’s the only way anything’s going to work.”

But it remains unclear just how much Klein’s law will change the community board’s role in the process.

The new law does not give boards power over much of the city’s so-called “Arterial Slow Zone” program, which lowers the speed limit on big thoroughfares — so far including the Grand Con-

course and E. Gun Hill Road in the Bronx — from 30 mph to 25 mph.

Boards would, on the other hand, have a chance to vet the city’s “Neighborhood Slow Zone” program, which lowers the speed limit in less-trafficked residential areas from 30 mph to 20 mph. As always, the boards’ votes would be advisory.

But a spokesman at the mayor’s office said that the Department of Transporta-

tion usually comes before the boards in advance regardless with plans for the Slow Zone programs.

Activist compromise

Most of the city’s safe transit activists supported the bill, though they had originally pushed the city to lower the speed limit to 20 mph citywide.

“Our stance was to go to 20, but we are learning that

politics is a game of compromise,” said Aaron Charlop-Powers of the group Families for Safe Streets.

Charlop-Powers’ mother Megan Charlop was killed in 2010 after being struck by a bus while riding her bike at E. Tremont and Crotona Avenues.

“We think there’s imperfections with the bill,” the Norwood resident said. “But it’s an important step in making the streets safer.”

With her counselor, Gaitri made a plan to cut expenses in order to have money in her account for unexpected emergencies.

Council bill puts more money in senior citizens' pockets

More seniors living on fixed incomes will be getting a break on increases to their rent thanks to a new law passed by the Council.

The limit on income allowed by the Senior Citizen Rent Increase Exemption program has been raised \$21,000 from \$29,000 a year to \$50,000 a year, so seniors bringing that kind of cash who live in eligible apartments will be safe from increase in rents, carrying charges, and other fees. Council members heralded the bill as something that will provide relief to old-timers dealing with the ever-escalating cost of living.

"With rents consistently rising, seniors from across the Bronx and New York City are struggling just to make ends meet," said

Councilman Jimmy Vacca (D-Throgs Neck). "Any financial boost we can provide for them could be vital."

The program affects seniors who live in apartments with rents regulated or controlled by the city where the cost of rent exceeds one-third of a senior's household income.

Positive reaction

Some local seniors were ecstatic when they heard the news of the increase in the eligibility, claiming it

would be extremely helpful.

"A lot of our seniors fell through the cracks, and only by a couple of dollars," said Edith Blitzer, president of the Pelham Parkway South Neighborhood Association. "I know people who have not been able to get SCRIE because of \$10 or \$12."

Vacca said he hopes to extend the relief to disabled residents as well as those who own their own homes by demanding the state increase the income eligibility for the Disability Rent Increase Program and the Senior Citizen Homeowners' Exemption Program.

"Senior homeowners

and disabled renters and homeowners also need relief," he said. "I am very proud to have voted in fa-

vor of this SCRIE expansion, which will help thousands of seniors in our borough, and I hope the

State will increase eligibility for DRIE and SCHE soon!"

These colors don't run at P.S. 304

If they didn't know it before, they know it now: these colors don't run.

Members of a local American Legion post taught elementary school students about the meaning

of the American flag and patriotism during a trip to PS 304 on Friday, June 13.

Nearly 300 youngsters got to learn all about Old Glory from members of the Theodore Korony Post No. 254 one day prior to the too-little-celebrated holiday that honors the Star-Spangled Banner.

"The idea is to give students an understanding of the flag, how to respect it and what the pledge of allegiance means" said Judy Lanci, one of the organizers of the event.

The interactive presentation included questions and answers, illustrated booklets for the kids to take home, and a visit from Uncle Sam himself—Judy Lanci's wife John, who dressed up as the American icon to get kids fired up about learning about the Stars and Stripes.

Among the topics covered were the growth of Flag Day programs in schools in the late-19th Century as part of an effort to

Americanize generations of immigrant children.

"That is so perfect for today because we are becoming a nation, again, of immigrants," she said.

In addition to the Flag Day celebration at PS 304, Korony Post commander Joe Mondello hosted a program at the Pelham Bay and Throgs Neck branches of the public library titled "The

History of the American Flag" that gave a primer on the country from the time of the 13 British colonies ruled by King George III through its evolution into a free and independent nation.

Both programs at the elementary school and libraries are part of an effort of the post to bring Americanism to the local community.

"These are two great

Americanism programs," Legion member Pat Devine. "Both [Mondello and Lanci] have been perpetuating Americanism through Flag Day for decades. People don't always realize how they got their freedom."

Devine pointed out a hard truth that he said kids need to learn.

"Freedom isn't free," he said.

Hydraulic gas drilling

Project Boost — the acronym for "Building Options and Opportunities for Students" — uses state dollars to provide students with cultural experiences outside the classroom that tight school budgets often don't allow, and now 25 Bronx schools can get in (or out) on the action thanks to \$500,000 a local state senator helped secure for the program.

"Delivering a quality education means providing a whole educational experience that offers learning opportunities inside and outside the classroom," said state Sen. Jeff Klein (D-Throgs Neck), who worked behind the scenes to get the dollars.

Supporters of the program say its awesome because it allows school administrators to decide what types of programming they

want to provide.

"Jeff is really empowering the schools to do what is good for their school," said Carl Vinci, director of Student Services for Project

Boost. "It's not a cookie-cutter approach."

Many of the schools use their money to take groups of students to museums, plays, restaurants,

and events at college campuses, said Vinci — experiences most of the students wouldn't have outside of school that gives them a taste of what they could

have if they work hard and got a good education.

"The more you see, the more you want," said Vinci.

Longtime faculty administrators pointed out that

Project Boost has paid for drama club trips to Broadway shows, art club excursions to the Guggenheim Museum, and the chess club competitions across the city that have helped students socially because it gets them out of their community and allows them to interact with different people.

"It's preparing them not just for high school, but for life," said Victor Villegas, assistant principal at PS 105 in Pelham Bay.

And parents say experiences outside the classroom — like trips for tea at Gracie Mansion, learning how to use a sound system at the Paley Center for Media, or fourth graders competing in ballroom dancing, gives kids extra confidence in themselves.

"It's one thing to do something in school or read about it in a book," said Veronica Brugman, the Parent Coordinator at PS 72 in Throgs Neck. "It's another thing to actually do it."

Bronx orange with anger over shootings

They're orange with outrage.

Students in a north Bronx police precinct where shootings have doubled in the last year decked themselves out in orange garb — what they call the “official color of gun violence awareness” — on Thursday June 12 as they joined a local councilman to call for an end to gun-related bloodshed.

“Stop the violence! Increase the peace!” chanted Councilman Andy King (D-Williamsbridge) alongside a pack of local public school kids in front of Baychester Academy at Baychester Avenue and Boston Road.

Shooting spike

The Council has named June “Official Gun Violence

Awareness Month,” with orange as its “official” color. But locals living in the 47th Precinct have been aware of the danger for many years.

The number of people shot in the 47th Precinct — covering Baychester, Eastchester, Williamsbridge, and Edenwald — shot to 25 this year, compared to 12 shootings over the same time in 2013.

Eight people have been killed in the precinct this year — with five killings in May alone, according to the NYPD’s statistics.

New police outreach

The violence spike has inspired the precinct brass to try new tactics. They launched the “Building Bridges” program to create a database of community tipsters who could help

track down offenders.

Cops have also spent the last month knocking on doors to make contact with at least one family on every block in the precinct. Police then send a weekly e-mail to locals with information about crime trends.

That outreach will help create a trust between the community and the police by putting a face on the department, according to the precinct’s top cop.

“It’s important to have a one-and-one with a police officer outside of a 911 call, or someone getting arrested or getting a summons,” said Deputy Inspector Ruel Stephenson. “There’s not one fix, but this is one of the ways we can tackle the increase we’re seeing.”

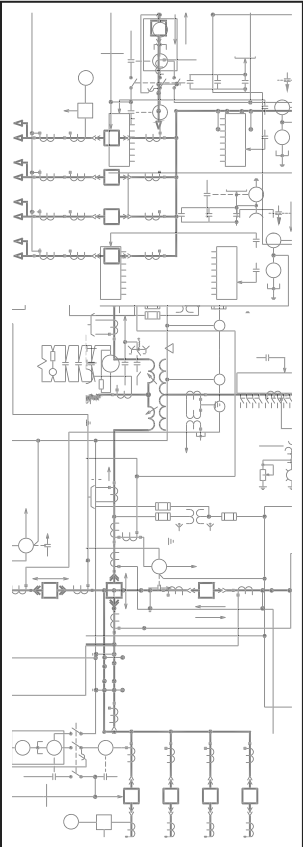
King added that his office would play its part in cleaning up crime by launching a street-cleaning initiative in the neighborhood, embracing the “broken windows” theory of tackling small quality of life issues the city

launched in the 1990s that some say helped dramatically reduce crime.

“One of the things we can do is create an environment that we respect,” King said.

King — who has become

famous for his sartorial styles — sported an orange windbreaker paired with an orange shirt, orange corduroy pants, orange suede shoes and his signature orange bow tie.

Bronx pols push new gun laws

If you're not using your gun, you better lock it up.

That's the message Bronx lawmakers took to the site of a recent West Farms shooting on Friday, June 13, where they announced their push for a new state law aimed at punishing those who don't stow away their unused firearms behind lock and key.

The new law — sponsored by state Sen. Jeff Klein (D-Morris Park) and co-authored by Assemblyman Luis Sepulveda (D-Parkchester) — clamps down on gun owners who don't securely stow away their firearms.

Lock it or pay big

The so-called "Nicholas's Law" is named for 12-year-old Nicholas Naumkin from Sarasota Springs, who died after being shot by a friend who was playing with his dad's gun.

The friend's dad wound up guilty of a misdemeanor and paid a \$250 fine. The

proposed new law would turn a similar incident into a felony punishable by more than a year in prison.

Bronx residents say the new law could save lives at home — if residents abide by it.

"My brother would still be here with us, it's as simple as that," said Belmont resident Alexandra Bodden, whose 13-year-old brother Michael Graham used his father's unlocked handgun to commit suicide in January 2013.

'Luisito' rolling

The new bill isn't the first gun measure pushed by Bronx pols in recent years.

Klein and Sepulveda also celebrated the state Senate's passage of "Luisito's Law," which harshens penalties to gunmen who commit a firearm crime within 250 feet of a playground or within 1,000 feet of a school.

The Assembly has until Thursday, June 19, to vote on the bill if it hopes to pass it this session.

Either way, the two pols say they're sending a message that they are not going to tolerate gun violence of any kind.

"This bill says that if you take aim at our children, we are going to fire right back," said Klein.

That law is named after Luisito Oyola Jr., who was three years old when he was hit by a stray bullet in Vidalia Park after a fight broke out there.

Luisito survived after being shipped to nearby St. Barnabas Hospital. Now four years old, he joined his grandmother Lorine Padilla in praising the senate's passage of his namesake bill, even if she thought its passage wouldn't solve all of the Bronx's gun problems.

"We are not naive to think it will eradicate [the violence]," said Padilla. "But we know that it will deter the next thug that picks up a gun to shoot someone else when they know that there are children in the area."

Month, through the end of the school year.

This year, the students have raised more than \$7,500 for Autism Speaks, she said.

'Build it Back' sets up shop at CB10

The city's "Build it Back" program is there to assist homeowners and businesses affected by Superstorm Sandy, and is now doing outreach in the East Bronx.

The de Blasio administration has taken charge of the Build it Back program, begun during the Bloomberg-era, and making sure that it works for homeowners and businesses looking to get the shovel in the ground and to work on rebuilding, said administration officials.

In March, the first reimbursement checks were received, and the start of construction using funds obtained through program began, according to the administration. The mayor has committed to 500 construction starts and 500 reimbursement checks distributed by Labor Day, and to working to create local jobs in the process.

Build it Back senior staff

members were brought directly to the Pelham Bay community recently, holding office hours by appointment at Community Board 10 three days a week.

"We have set up a temporary office in the Bronx graciously given to us by Community Board 10, to actually process applicants," explained Amy Peterson, the new director of housing and recovery for the program. "This is so people who have registered for the Build it Back program do not have to go to other centers. They can come here, drop off documents, and we have had people move through the process."

Peterson visited the CB10 site on Friday, June 13 and met with district manager Kenneth Kearns. Both encourage people to sign up for Build it Back if they qualify.

"The people who Build it Back are currently helping are the people who were enrolled in the program when

it first began," said Kearns. "There was a change in administration, and the program went into hiatus, and now with the de Blasio administration, they are back in full swing."

A commitment has been made to the people of the Bronx to open Build it Back accounts that had not been serviced, or only partially serviced, and fully service them now, he said.

"Here in Community Board 10, we have people in communities like Edgewater Park, Locust Point, sections of Throggs Neck and City Island who have applied for Build it Back in the past, did not get serviced completely, and now they are getting processed," said Kearns. "We at CB10 are grateful for that and are happy to partner with them to help people who were adversely affected by Hurricane Sandy."

Peterson said that she took a tour of Edgewater Park, a shoreline commu-

nity in Throggs Neck heavily effected by the storm.

She said that typical concerns among the residents she spoke to there were dealing with flooding damage, the need for repair work, and reimbursement if they have done repairs on their own.

More than 200 Bronx residents have registered for the Build it Back program,

and they were called and invited to Community Board 10 to meet with a crew of people ready to help. The CB10 Build it Back team is led by site supervisor Anthony Green.

As of Tuesday, June 17, 282 reimbursement checks have been distributed around the city through Build it Back, totaling more than \$4.25 million. There

were no checks distributed through the program at the end of Dec. 31, 2013, according to city records.

Van Nest gets graffiti clean up

Community leaders in Van Nest who were fed up with the graffiti plaguing their neighborhood after months of constant tagging and 311 calls that weren't yielding results say they are finally seeing improvements now the a state Senator has stepped in.

Staffers of state Sen. Gustavo Rivera (D-Van Nest) contacted with the mayor's office to bring the Graffiti-Free NYC removal program to Van Nest after community leaders raised the issue a few weeks ago.

The program is the same one that responds to 311 calls, but the senator's office was able to call attention to the long list of tagged sites that community leaders had complied. Five sites were cleaned on Thursday, June 12, and more have recently been visited by the program.

"My office was able to ensure that the graffiti issue

in the Van Nest area was quickly addressed," said Rivera. "I will continue to work with the Community Board, neighborhood leaders, and our local government to make sure that we continue to get the necessary resources to address graffiti issues throughout the 33rd Senate District."

Community leaders said they were glad that the graffiti problem was addressed after they raised concerns.

"Everyone was overjoyed that there was an immediate response," said Bernadette Ferrara, vice president of the Van Nest Neighborhood Alliance. "We're just very grateful that something was done and that the mayor's office was involved."

Still, Ferrara said that a clean up a handful of taggings isn't enough to make a difference in the quality of life in the neighborhood, claiming that graffiti is a

chronic problem, and when a spot is clean it is just a matter of time before it is tagged again.

She said one fence on White Plains Road was cleaned a few weeks ago, and has since been re-tagged.

"It's going to happen over and over and over again," she said.

Ferrara said she would like to see more of an effort to catch taggers and to penalize them. She also feels that the city's graffiti removal program should use materials that spray paint won't adhere too, but claims she has been told that it is too expensive.

Whatever the solution, Ferrara said employing new strategies to reduce graffiti would benefit all neighborhoods.

"I hope there is serious thought about how to deter this in the future," she said.

New, old faces named to local community boards

More than 100 new people have been appointed to the Bronx's 12 community boards, but many old-timers remain, despite a push by the Council for term limits at the lowest level of government.

Some council members are pushing community boards — locals' first line of defense on issues such as land use and littering — to adopt term limits to change membership more often, but other borough officials are crowing that the changes they've already made this year are enough.

Borough President Ruben Diaz Jr.'s office is touting the 106 fresh faces it appointed this summer to

Half of the Bronx's 12 community boards now have at least 10 new members — and all but two boards have at least five new volunteers joining the team.

The changes come months after a Council resolution urged boards city-wide to adopt a 10-year term limit and involve an independent screening panel, among other changes aimed at refreshing membership more often to better reflect changing nabes.

But borough officials say they've got the process covered.

"The idea that we aren't

appointing new people to community boards is simply not true," said John DeSio, the Beep's communications director.

One east Bronx board, however, is staying basically the same this time around. Just one new member — Michael Rivadeneyra — was appointed this year to Community Board 11, which covers an area including Morris Park, Van Nest, and Pelham Parkway.

The board includes the city's longest tenured board member, Ruth Burko, who was appointed to the board in 1963.

But the board's chairman stressed that the volunteers still back up the community even in their golden years.

"Ruth is still sharp," said Tony Vitaliano. "We've got some elderly people, but I'll tell you what, they contribute, they show up every month and they voice their opinions."

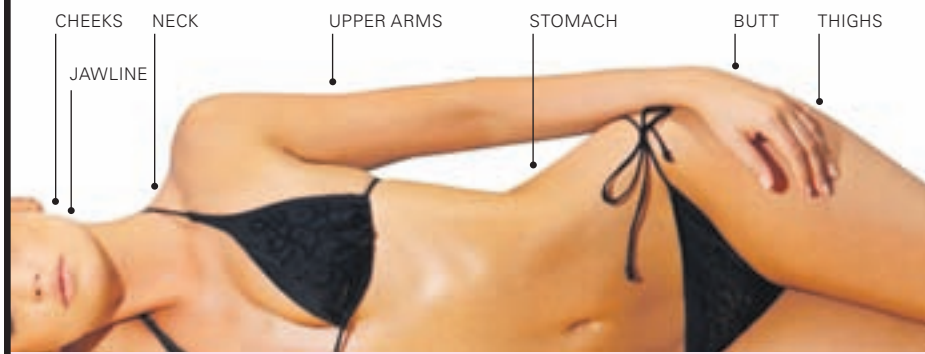

The ultimate community activist finally has a seat on her community board.

Annie Boller, who has been strongly advocating for Waterbury-Lasalle neighborhood for several years, was recently appointed to Community Board 10.

Boller said she initially started attending meetings for the community board and the 45th Precinct Council meetings back in 2011 in order to “raise a ruckus” about the nightclub called Pompeii that she claimed was a nuisance in her neighborhood. Since then, she has been passionate about addressing quality-of-life issues in the East Bronx.

In 2011 she cofounded the Mayflower Block Association, which was later brought into the larger Waterbury-Lasalle Community and Homeowners Association, where she sits on the board. Now she attends meetings for every local community group that she can, including almost all of Community Board 10’s committee meetings, in addition to meeting outside her immediate area, such as the Throggs Neck Homeowners Association.

She said she feels it’s important to know what the issues are in surrounding neighborhoods because the problems aren’t isolated.

“What happens there will happen to us,” said Boller.

In 2012 Boller graduated from the NYPD’s Citizens’ Police Academy, which she participated in to learn more about laws and legal processes.

“I wanted to get more of an idea of how things work, so we know how to fight things,” she said.

Boller says she’s passionate about advocating for her community because she wants to protect the quality of life she feels is declining.

“It’s the little things that matter,” she said. “They will get bigger if you don’t plug the hole.”

Things she’s advocated for in the past include more police for the 45th precinct, traffic solutions, and a reduction of liquor licenses in the community. She said she savors the small victories, like the installation of a traffic

light at Middletown Road and Mayflower Avenue in 2012.

Boller, like many community activists, said she operates on the philosophy that the “squeaky wheel gets the grease.” After attending so many meetings for so long, Boller said she’s looking forward to having more of a voice with the community board, and she feels she’s a good fit for the position.

“I’m not young, but I’m out there and I know what’s happening,” she said.

As for why she donates so much time and energy to meetings, Boller said she’s just trying to better her community.

“I just like helping people,” she said. “If I could clone myself and do more, I would.”

Con Ed awards \$10,000 grant

Con Edison has awarded The College of New Rochelle a grant of \$10,000 to continue its support of the College's Math/Science Living-Learning Community, COSMOS (Creating Opportunities for Success in Math or Science).

COSMOS offers numerous opportunities for students to enhance learning and to develop a sense of community beyond the campus. Additionally, the grant enables COSMOS to fund STEM-related internship opportunities this summer.

Living-Learning communities at colleges and universities are credited with improving student retention, persistence and graduation rates, particularly among minority students, and first generation college students. Union Community Health Center is working with parents to address teen bullying.

It quickly became obvious to Dr. Tahshann Richards that when 14-year-old Maria (name has been changed) complained about abdominal pains and headaches, there was more to it than what any tests would reveal.

"I asked her how she was doing at school and what afterschool activities she was participating in, reiterating that anything we spoke about would be kept confidential, as long as she is not in danger of any physical harm," said Tahshann Richards, DO, MPH, a family medicine physician at Union Community Health Center in the Bronx. "That is when it came out that she felt sad, and did not want to go to school because she was being bullied."

Studies have shown that as many as 30 percent of teenagers participate in bullying — as either bullies or victims. It often involves young teens and can take the form

of physical, verbal or emotional bullying, with data showing that boys are more likely to be physically bullied, and girls to be targets of verbal or emotional bullying. In many cases, it is a case of girls preying on other girls — as it was with Maria — with young female teens often being the target of nasty rumors, often sexual in nature.

"Bullying can affect a person for the rest of their lives," said Dr. Richards. "It can lead to loss of self-esteem, result in depression and cause feelings of suicide. And, it is not likely to quickly go away on its own."

According to Dr. Richards, bullying victims might be overweight, identify as LGBTQ, or there may be cultural differences. "When we speak with parents, they are often surprised to hear that their children are being bullied, and do not think there is anything they can do to stop it."

Bullying, of course, no longer occurs just within the confines of the school grounds. "Cyberbullying also has increased tremendously over the past few years," said Dr. Richards. "In one case, a patient became severely depressed after sexually suggestive photos of her were circulating via texting."

Dr. Richards often speaks to students and parents at middle schools and community events on issues like teenage bullying and depression, as well as one-on-one to school officials concerning specific patients. She stresses to parents that they can stand up for their children and, if necessary, seek expert help.

As a family medicine practitioner, Dr. Richards is in a unique role — she practices the only specialty that routinely treats every member of the family, both children and adults, allowing her to engage with both. She grew up in the Bronx and after going to medical school in New Jersey and obtaining a master's degree in public health from George Washington University, returned to work in the Bronx, where she had completed her residency training.

As for Maria, Dr. Richards worked with her mother to seek the school principal's help. The principal was sensitive to the problem and quickly addressed it. The bullying stopped and Maria soon found a group of friends she enjoyed being with, got more involved in school, and stopped getting those headaches and stomach pains.

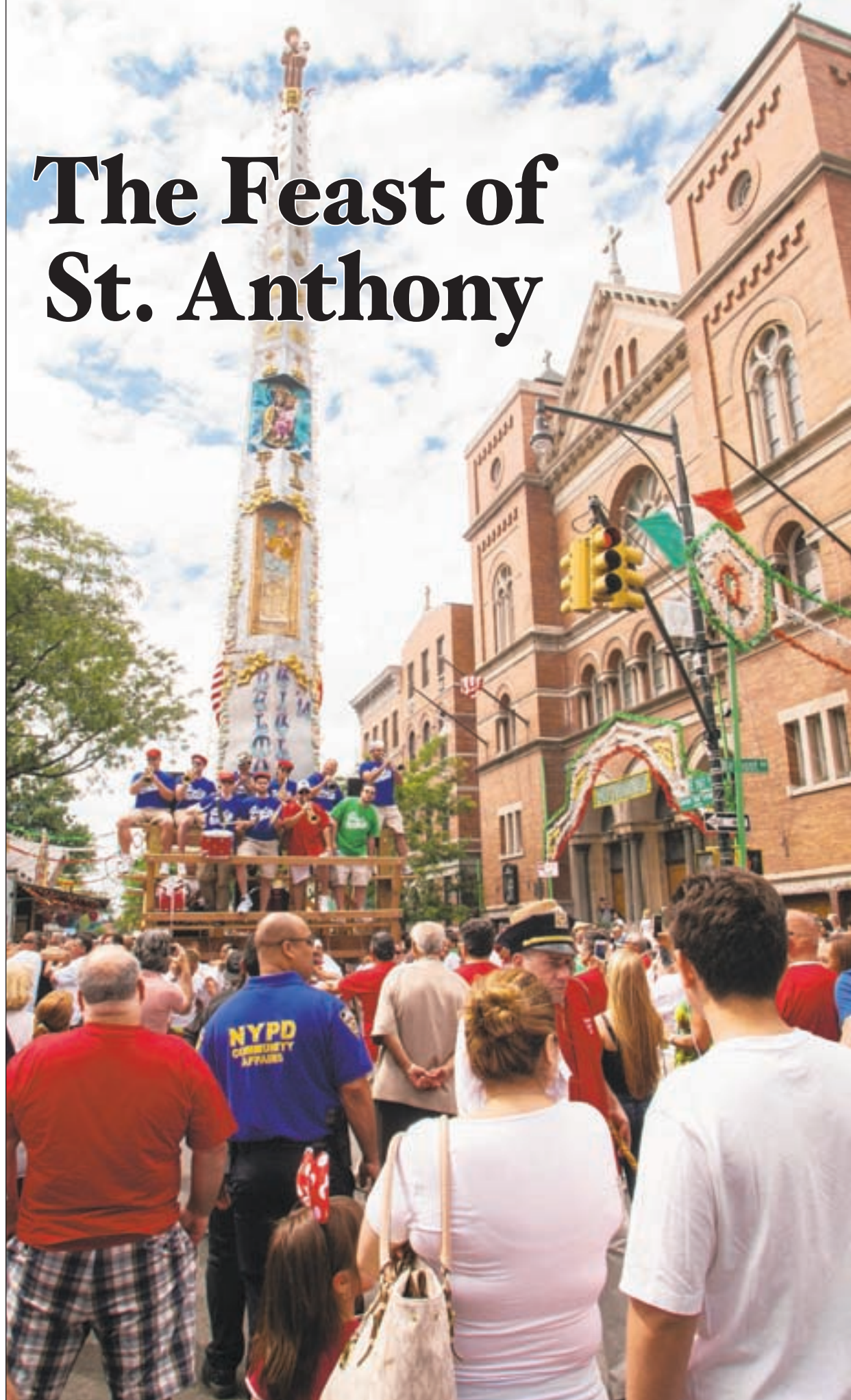

NY Botanical Garden presents Frida Kahlo's Garden

The New York Botanical Garden announces its major 2015 exhibition, Frida Kahlo's Garden, focusing on the iconic artist's engagement with nature in her native country of Mexico.

Opening on May 16, 2015, and remaining on view through November 1, 2015, the exhibition will be the first solo presentation of Kahlo's work in New York City in more than 25 years, and the first exhibition to focus exclusively on Kahlo's intense interest in the botanical world.

Visitors to the Enid A. Haupt Conservatory will walk through a stunning flower show re-imagining Kahlo's studio and garden at Casa Azul ("Blue House") in Coyoacán, Mexico City.

Curated by distinguished art historian and specialist in Mexican art Adriana Zavala, Ph.D., the multifaceted exhibition will include a rare display of more than a dozen original Kahlo paintings and drawings on view in the LuEsther T. Mertz Library's Rondina and LoFaro Gallery at the Garden. Accompanying events invite visitors to learn about Kahlo's Mexico in a new way through poetry, lectures, themed events, tours, a Mexican food market, and an iPhone app.

Visitors will view a re-imagined version of Kahlo's garden at Casa Azul, the artist's childhood home outside of Mexico City where she resided in her later years, transforming

it with traditional Mexican folk-art objects, colonial-era art, religious ex-voto paintings, and native Mexican plants.

Passing through the blue courtyard walls, visitors will stroll along lava rock paths lined with flowers, showcasing a variety of plants native to Mexico. A scale version of the pyramid at Casa Azul—Frida Kahlo, Self-Portrait with Thorn Necklace and Hummingbird, 1940. Harry Ransom Center, The University of Texas at Austin. © 2014 Banco de México Diego Rivera Frida Kahlo Museums Trust, Mexico, D.F. / Artists Rights Society (ARS), New York.

The LuEsther T. Mertz Library's Rondina and Lo-

Faro Gallery at the Garden will exhibit more than a dozen of Kahlo's paintings and works on paper—many borrowed from private collections—highlighting the artist's use of botanical imagery in her work.

This never-before-seen grouping of artworks will include Self-Portrait with Thorn Necklace and Hummingbird (1940); Flower of Life (1944); Still Life with Parrot and Flag (1951); and Self-Portrait Inside a Sunflower (1954).

"Frida al Fresco" evenings during the summer will feature live music, cocktails, and Mexican-inspired dinner menus. V

isitors will be invited to stroll through booths and sample food in the Conser-

vatory marketplace, a version of the Coyoacán market. A self-guided Mexican Plant Tour will showcase the more than 75 plants native to Mexico and located in the various collections throughout the Garden's 250 acres. Developed in partnership with the Poetry Society for America, a poetry walk will highlight the work of three important 20th-century Mexican poets—Pita Amor (1918–2000), Salvador Novo (1904–1974), Octavio Paz (1914–1998), and Carlos Pellicer (1897–1977).

Events will include a day-long symposium entitled Frida Kahlo and Diego Rivera—Mexican Art in the 20th Century; a Mexican film festival; and food and culture festivals.

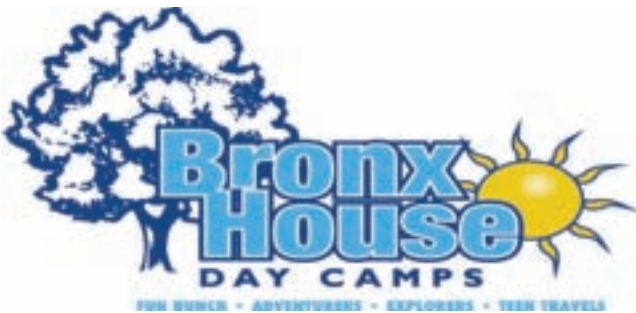

Reserve and was assigned to Fort Benning, Georgia. He would later serve as a gunnery officer in Korea. Alphonso married Arlene Weiss just a year after graduating from Fordham and the couple settled down in Leonia, New Jersey where they raised their three daughters.

One of his big breaks in Hollywood came when he snagged a supporting role in "Gone are the Days" in 1963. It starred Ozzie Davis and Ruby Dee and was a comedy where he played a young man returning to the plantation where he was raised to try to obtain title to it one way or another.

Those interested in his early career and older black and white films can rent it for a few dollars. Running time is only 99

minutes. Since then he's had great roles in over 30 films including "The Aviator" by Martin Scorsese in 2004 for which he was nominated for an Academy Award for best supporting actor for his portrayal of Senator Ralph Owen Brewster.

poses of his own elevation, on the ruins of Public Liberty."

There is an uncomfortable reality facing the nation today. Throughout the Obama presidency, the White House's lack of respect for the law, and indeed, the constitution itself, has been blatant. It began with the refusal to prosecute a clear case of voter intimidation in the 2008 election, proceeded to the harassment of political opponents by the IRS, and was magnified by the practice of only enforcing the provisions of the Affordable Care Act that were politically expedient. It has been evident in matters such as the release of the Taliban 5, an open violation of 22 US Code Section 2371 (assistance to terrorist organizations) Section 8111 of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2014 (prohibiting the use of funds for the release of Guantanamo Bay prisoners) and Section 1035 of

the Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2014 (requiring notification to Congress before Guantanamo prisoner release.) It is manifest in the Administration's failure to enforce portions of the law pertaining to illegal immigration.

The contempt has been evident in Mr. Obama's statements such as "I can't wait for Congress to act" and "I've got a pen and a phone" that he intends to use to further his agenda even if he does not obtain constitutionally-mandated Congressional approval for it.

Other presidents have, at times, violated the law and engaged in constitutionally questionable acts (Richard Nixon comes readily to mind.) But throughout the annals of American history, no chief executive has done so as systematically, intentionally, repeatedly and in areas so vital and substantial as Mr. Obama. His open disregard for the Constitution is unprecedented.

In our adversarial governing system, it is expected that the opposition party or the legislative branch would check the power of the presidency.

But in the poisonous environment of Washington, Republican objections are seen merely as partisan arguing, and the Senate is held by Democrats who appear more loyal to their president than to the Constitution.

This battle for the soul of the nation is often mistaken as disagreements over individual issues. Far too many of those favoring the President's agenda in spending, foreign policy, healthcare or the environment look the other way as he achieves his goals or governs in ways that violate the Constitution.

That is a dangerous path. Once the Constitution has been relegated to a mere suggestion, the protections it has provided for centuries will be endangered forever, and could well become permanently lost. Other nations, including those clearly tyrannical, have constitutions providing rights, and those rights are utterly ignored.

The difference in America has always been that, despite our political differences or disagreements over specific policies, we have always held Constitutional provisions and Constitutional rights

sacrosanct, above the fray of political fighting. As a people, we have, in the past, realized that no one issue or set of issues or even loyalty to a political party or to a president is worth jeopardizing the Constitution.

That treasured and indispensable tradition appears to be disintegrating. As it evaporates, the rights protected at so great a cost since the foundation of the nation will wither and die. The Constitution may be the greatest governing system ever created, but it is, after all, a human institution. It can be and is being destroyed piecemeal, and loyalty to a particular president is the instrument of that destruction. It is time for Americans of every party and political philosophy, who believe in the Bill of Rights, to cast aside their differences and take active steps to restore the rapidly dwindling respect for the Constitution by this White House, before it is too late.

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep.

And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters. And God said, Let there be light: and there was light.

And God saw the light, and it was good; and God divided the light from the darkness." - Book of GENESIS, Chapter I, verses 1 thru 4

It was simple enough for God. The Almighty One merely uttered a thought and light was had. The universe would not dwell in the fear and the unknown of darkness.

Perhaps, matters are not so simple for the City of New York, and specifically, its Department of Transportation (N.Y.C.D.O.T.). Admittedly, it takes a bit more time and effort to bring about light, in this case, on the Major Deegan Expressway between the East 230TH Street and East 233RD Street exits -- as well as on any number of highways and major roadways throughout the City of New York, for that matter -- at night, after the disappearance of God's light from His

Sun that has set.

Admittedly, it is a bit of an enterprise to change burnt-out or defective highway lights. Among other steps, an employee of the New York City Department of Transportation (N.Y.C.D.O.T.) must get a "bucket" in order to lift him/her up to the light bulb several feet above the ground. S/he must then play with the apparatus that holds the light bulb in the process of replacing it with a new one. Finally, the individual must be returned to terra firma. Yes, it is a bit more extensive and exhausting than commanding "LET THERE BE LIGHT!" It is furthermore much more dangerous. After all, the Good Lord did not have to contend with and avoid motor vehicles speeding by Him as He undertook the first of His several steps to bring about His Creation. Municipal workers in the employ of N.Y.C.D.O.T. are taking their life into their hands when engaging in any sort of repair work on a highway. Motor vehicle operators drive much too speedily and irresponsibly these days. They seem almost exclusively focused on their own concern -- viz., getting to where they want to go as quickly as they can get there -- and could care less about

fellow motorists or their well-being. They far too often drive distracted, whether by conversations on BLUE-TOOTH, texting, or deafeningly loud music. Some even attempt to catch a flick or two (2). I am given to wonder whether any of these drivers -- and any of us who drive have certainly encountered their ilk all too frequently as of late! -- would even stop or take care not to hit or to run over God Himself!

This being said, difficulty and danger aside, it is not impossible to keep the lights on the Major Deegan Expressway between the East 230TH and 233RD Streets lit. Hence, the fact that these highway lights are not lit and working begs two (2) very simple questions -- viz., "WHY NOT?" and "WHEN WILL THEY BE?"

The lights of which I speak on the Major Deegan Expressway have been out for so long that I cannot recall when I initially noticed that they were out. Joking aside, it seems as if such has been

the case since the dawn of Creation!

Certainly, they were not working for the longest time during the three-peat term of office of Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg and of his Bicycle oops, I mean his Transportation Commissioner Janette Sadik-Khan. Well, currently we have a new Mayor and Chief Executive in the driver's seat -- no pun intended -- at City Hall, who has appointed a new Commissioner of the Department of Transportation (N.Y.C.D.O.T.). They may be new, but the problem on the Major Deegan Expressway as one approaches Van Cortlandt Park is not! It annoyingly and hazardously remains! The highway lights still out and all one can surmise is: "HOW LONG, O LORD?" (PSALMS: 35)

Maybe, all of Commissioner Sadik-Khan's agency employees were too tied up panting bicycle lanes and building the obstacles accompanying them on our city streets. Maybe, Mayor Mike and his cohorts cared a bit too much about keeping their Manhattan lit up for the tourists and not about keeping us apparently second-class, outer-Borough citizens in the dark. Quite possibly, casting drivers into the void

of darkness devoid of incandescent light was His Honor's revenge against drivers who vociferously opposed his cockamamie proposal for "Congestion Pricing" in Midtown and Lower Manhattan. Then, again, as well, Mr. Bloomberg took public transportation every day, although he was driven to a subway station some distance from his townhouse in an N.Y.P.D. S.U.V. for a rather short train ride from Columbus Circle to City Hall every morning. Was the Mayor attempting to tell all of us that we should ride public transportation instead of driving, even if the subways were running at over one hundred percent (100%) of capacity?

In any event, that was then and this is now and as I just said, the lights on the Deegan are still out. Yes, this is a nuisance, but it is, more seriously, a menace. Surely, the cost of labor and materials to keep these highway lights lit is nowhere near that of a serious accident entailing damaged property or, worse yet, God forbid, the loss of light! Can such tragedy be measured in the expenditure of a relatively paltry expenditure dollars and cents?

The Prophet Isaiah in the ninth Chapter of the Book in the Bible bearing his name opines that "those in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone!" May these words of Isaiah speak to the rescue of nighttime motorists on the Major Deegan Expressway between the East 230TH Street and East 233RD Street exits one day soon. With any luck, Mayor De Blasio and Transportation Commissioner Polly Trottenberg will do right by drivers and return them to the light. I hope that getting the lights back on will not have to take an act of God!

Up to two of three Queensbound lanes at the Throgs Neck Bridge will be closed during overnight hours for a total of seven weekends this summer in order to replace 90,000-square-feet of binder and asphalt overlay.

Beginning the weekend of June 20-23, one Queensbound lane will be closed from the Bronx toll plaza south to the Bronx Anchorage of the bridge from 10 p.m. Friday through 5 a.m.

Monday. During daytime hours on the weekend two lanes to Queens will remain open.

"The work is being done overnight on weekends when traffic is lighter so we can minimize the impact to the driving public," said Throgs Neck Facility En-

gineer Edmond Knightly. It also will help minimize conflicts at the Bronx-Whitestone Bridge, which is undergoing a \$109 million project to rehabilitate and reconstruct the Queens approach roadway.

All work is heavily dependent on good weather, and as a result the work may not be done on consecutive weekends. The contractor cannot apply new asphalt in rainy weather or in extreme humidity. "We will be watching weather

forecasts and will make a decision each Thursday afternoon," Knightly said.

Director of Bridges East Raymond Webb, who oversees operations at the Throgs Neck and Bronx-Whitestone Bridges, urges motorists to sign up for MTA e-mail or text alerts at www.mta.info, download MTA Bridges and Tunnels free Drive Time app for smart phones and iPads, or check the MTA Service Status box to get the most up-to-date information.

During the weekend work at the Throgs Neck Bridge, motorists should also consider using the Robert F. Kennedy Bridge or the Bronx-Whitestone Bridge, which will have three lanes open southbound to Queens.

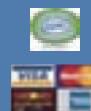

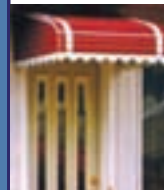

Possible landmark decision

J. Brady McCollough (Pittsburgh Post-Gazette) is covering Ed O'Bannon's suit against the NCAA for using his image on a video-game without his permission. He reported that "the room was mostly quiet as the tall man in the tan suit jacket waited on Judge Claudia Ann Wilken to make her appearance."

But O'Bannon, 41, who sells Toyotas in Las Vegas less than a decade after his professional basketball career ended overseas without the glory he imagined as a youth growing up in Los Angeles, would soon be put to work. As the face of this lawsuit aiming for injunctive relief that would free current and former college athletes of the restrictions the NCAA's eligibility rules placed on players' ability to sell their own names, images and likenesses while they are in school, O'Bannon would give his testimony first. There would be no opening arguments, only the announcement by attorneys to Judge Wilken of a huge development in a case that was once tied directly to O'Bannon's: The lawsuit brought by former Arizona State and Nebraska quarterback Sam Keller accusing the NCAA of conspiring to use college ath

Bronx Science rally falls short

Bronx Science was just a few feet away from a city baseball title as Ben Kravitz tagged up from third base, preparing to score what could have been the game-winning run in the bottom of the seventh inning.

Instead Kravitz was cut down at the plate by a perfect throw from Beach Channel centerfielder Antonio Moccia. The PSAL Class B baseball title game headed to extra innings. It took until the ninth for No. 9 Beach Channel to score twice to claim a 7-5 victory over the No. 5 Wolverines in the championship game at at Yankee Stadium June 12. Despite the tough defeat, Bronx Science took solace in reaching the final and playing in the home of the Yankees after losing in the semifinal a year ago.

"We did what we had to do,"

said Wolverines ace pitcher Glen Price. "We got to Yankee Stadium. It was a great experience. It would have been better coming out on top, but just the thrill of playing was enough for us."

The Wolverines (17-4) fought to keep their season alive after heading into the bottom of the seventh and trailing 5-3 against Beach Channel ace Kely Aponte. Singles by Kyle Shultz and Kravitz and a walk to Simon Lehrer loaded the bases with one out. Daniel Bonfiglio, who had two hits, three RBIs and two runs scored, lined a two-run double to tie things up at 5-5. The ball went off the glove of a leaping Moccia in center.

"I wasn't really feeling the pressure that much," Bonfiglio said. "I've been in big situations before. I really like pressure. I feed off of it. I was waiting for a

fastball because that's basically what he was throwing. When I saw it and I made contact, I know I hit it pretty good."

Alex Grun also thought he got enough of the ball to bring a runner home when he flew out to shallow center, but it didn't keep Moccia from making a game-saving throw. Two innings later a high throw to first after a strike-out allowed Aponte to reach second. Beach Channel (17-2) took the lead on a bases loaded walk and got an insurance run on a double by David Polanco to make it 7-5 against Bronx Science reliever Michael McLaughlin.

Price, who started the game, was the Wolverines' rock on the mound all season. He dominated in the first three innings by striking out six and allowing just one hit. Price began to struggle with his control in the

fifth. Five straight walks and a two-run single by Aponte off Bronx Science reliever Kyle Cas-sara helped Beach Channel grab a 4-0 lead. Bronx Science made it 4-2 in the bottom of the frame thanks to RBI hits from Bonfiglio and Price.

"He's been lights out all year, even his bad outings," Bonfiglio said of Price. "I think he had his stuff today. He just stumbled."

Falling in the title game was just one defeat in an overall successful season for the Wolverines. They won their division for the second-straight year and reached the championship round for the first time in school history. The final milestone just wasn't in the cards for Bronx Science.

"We had a great season," Bronx Science Coach Michael McGrath said. "We just came up short today."

Taft's Bryan receives award for courage in cancer battle

Donte Bryan's tears were still noticeable as they dried on his cheek.

The Taft basketball standout had just relived his two-year battle with cancer as he accepted the Edvard Nogay Award for Strength and Courage at the PSAL Wingate Award dinner June 9 at the Brooklyn Marriot. The award was named for Nogay, who played boys' volleyball at Fort Hamilton High School in Brooklyn through sarcoma and the amputation of his arm before dying in June 2013. For Bryan, who first heard of Nogay's story at the PSAL dinner, the honor was further validation of his fight for his life.

"This award means a lot to be me because a lot of times I felt like giving up throughout the hard days," the senior said. "My mom always told me that I would have to be strong. It paid off."

It was a long road back for Bryan.

He was cut from the Golden Eagles' junior varsity team as a freshman, before making the squad as sophomore. He was all set to start on the varsity as a junior in November 2012, but 10 days before the opener, he was limping and complaining of a pain in legs. A series of tests revealed he had non-Hodgkins lymphoma. Taft Coach George Diaz said Bryan didn't fully understand the severity of his situation. Bryan thought he could take pill and he'd be better.

His coach and his teammates visited him constantly in the hospital, but Diaz said it was tough to keep their spirits up as they watched the 6-foot-2, 185-pound Bryan whittle down to 125 pounds. Bryan admitted there were moments through his treatment when he felt like he wouldn't have the strength to go on.

"Plenty of times I just felt like giving up," Bryan said. "I thought it was the last me and it wasn't"

But Bryan kept going. He cheered for his team dressed in uniform and with no hair, providing inspirational support during its run to the PSAL Class A semifinals in 2013.

His return to full-time action was a long process. When the scrappy, defensive minded forward came back, he'd go up to try to dunk, but could barely make a layup. He was winded quickly.

"It was tough for us," Diaz said. "There were a lot of tears. There was a lot of crying. When he broke down we stayed up; we stayed strong [for him]."

Bryan was back on the court this season for Taft and will play next year at Sullivan Community College. He averaged 3.0 points and 2.4 rebounds in 14 contests. Kim Tolve, Nogay's coach at Fort Hamilton,

made sure to shake Bryan's hand. She choked up telling him how happy she was the that award was going to "such a great young man." It's something that all at Taft already knew.

"It showed everybody in the school you can achieve pretty much anything," Diaz said.

Even Bryan doubted that at one point, when things were at their lowest. But the

tough times were worth it, leaving him grateful for every moment since then, he said.

"I'm blessed," Bryan said. "I look at the hard times and look at me now."

letes' likenesses in video games without compensation had been settled for \$20 million.

"That I do have experience in."

Fisher's speech is even marbled with many of the same themes Jackson touches on when he's at

his Zen Master best. Buzzwords and phrases like "commitment," "accountability," "re-establishing a culture of success," "embracing the challenge" and "living greatness daily" all came up. Jackson said Fisher excels at speaking to other players' "spirits and hearts" and Fisher said the Knicks job was "an opportunity that spoke to me right away."

worked while he was there, with enrollment increasing from 525 students to 635 students over five years.

But on top of strengthening the school in the long term, Doran faces the more immediate challenge of building his school's trust in the fall.

Doran said he'll start by projecting a no-nonsense exterior in order to gain respect, and he has high expectations that kids follow the rules. But he said he doesn't want his Catholic schools to be a considered a place with harsh consequences.

"I want it to be a place where they learn discipline, not be disciplined," he said.

And while he can be tough but fair, Doran said he likes to joke around with his students. It is important to meet the students on their level, he said, that way they feel comfortable coming to you with problems.

"You have to show the kids you have a heart," he said.

Court.

Cohen claims he visited New Hawaii for a surprise birthday party on Aug. 10 and started feeling symptoms on Sept. 8, the suit charges. The volunteer firefighter experienced abdomen pain, a 103-degree fever, and a swollen liver, before being diagnosed with hepatitis A days later.

Loreto Jr. experienced similar symptoms after eating take-out from New Hawaii on Aug. 11. His order included a spicy tuna roll, pan-fried wontons, Hawaii steak and lo mein, court papers state.

The victims have not said how much money they are seeking for damages, but their lawyer claims the going rate for hep-A is \$100,000 per person to cover medical bills, loss of wages, and physical and emotional distress.

"These gentlemen basically had the worst flu you could ever imagine, and then had it for two or three months," said Marler.

Hepatitis A is normally not life-threatening, but Marler said that New Hawaii was lucky that none of the alleged poisoned victims needed a liver transplant.

"It could have been a lot worse," he said.

Panic last fall

The Department of Health closed the restaurant on Sept. 19, 2013, after five of the eatery's patrons and one worker were diagnosed with the liver virus.

Hepatitis A is spread by eating food that has been contaminated by traces of fecal matter from someone infected with the virus. A source close to the investigation told the Times-Reporter in September that the culprit in this case was one of the restaurant's waiters.

Those contaminated feel the first symptoms anywhere from 15 to 50 days later, according to the Health Department. There is no cure once the virus sets in, but getting a vaccine within 14 days of exposure can combat the disease's onset.

Lines around block

Health officials urged anyone who ate at the restaurant from Sept. 7 to Sept. 19 to get vaccinated for Hepatitis A.

Nearly 2,800 customers then heeded city's warning, lining up for hours for free vaccinations at Lehman High School. The line often snaked around the block.

The restaurant was cleared to reopen Sept. 21, 2013 after the city examined the restaurant and vaccinated its workers.

The once neighborhood institution re-branded itself two months later as Kai, an Asian fusion eatery that opened that December.

Owners of the former New Hawaii Sea Restaurant could not be reached for comment.

More legal tussels

The two lawsuits filed this month are not the only legal action taken against the restaurant.

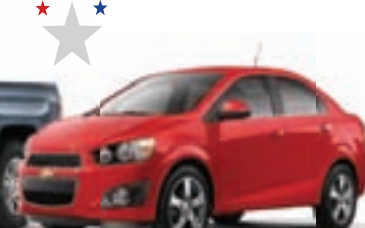
