SMALL BIZ RALLY HELD

Gjonaj heads City Hall protest for 'mom & pop' shops

Leading chants of "Enough is enough!" and "What do we want?" "Jobs!" "When?" "Now!" Councilman Mark Gjonaj on Thursday, June 28, headed scores of chamber of commerce members and small business owners in a City Hall rally demanding the de Blasio administration stop crushing small merchants with burdensome taxes and regulations.

The 'Protect NYC Jobs and Businesses' rally, was the uniting platform for electeds, chambers of commerce and small business owners from all industries to voice their opinion on the issue.

"All we want is fair treatment and as much as government supports big business, they need to realize how much they should support small business, too," said Bobby Jaen after the rally.

He, along with other small business owners in the Throggs Neck Merchants Association and throughout the borough were part of the entourage that travelled from the Bronx in support of the larger issue.

"The Department of Small Business Services had a \$191 million (fiscal year 2018) budget they're supposed to utilize to support small businesses," said John Bonizio, chairman of the Westchester Square BID during the rally. "Where are they," he continued, in reference to the lack of SBS personal or representatives at the rally.

"Small businesses are the lifeblood of our community and we need to ensure that they are protected," said Assemblywoman Nathalia Fernandez, who stood alongside Gjonaj during the rally accompanied by Brooklyn's borough president Eric Adams and councilman Robert Cornegy, Manhattan Councilman Ydanis Rodriguez, and Queens Councilmen Robert Holden and Paul Vallone.

The rally, however, also acted as a segway for Council

Justice for Junior sees great generosity

In wake of the tragic death of 15-year-old Lesandro 'Junior' Guzman-Feliz that shocked America to it's core, the Bronx is doing all that it can to keep the innocent boy's memory alive.

As the number of candles on the corner of Bathgate Avenue and 183rd Street continue to grow exponentially, as do murals around the Bronx, so do contributions to Junior's family and community organizations.

In wake of the tragedy, Councilmember Ritchie Torres allocated one million dollars to seven police precincts in the Bronx to combat the dangerous rise of gang violence in the borough, those being: the 40th, 42nd, 44th, 46th, 47th, 48th (Junior's home precinct) and 52nd precincts.


"I pushed for \$1 million to be included in the recently adopted City budget and it will go directly to the 48th precinct for 'Cure Violence' gang-violence prevention initiative. This will take a holistic approach that will connect former gang members and violence interrupters with youth who may be at risk of joining gangs, and link them to social services, conflict resolution specialists and legal services as needed," said Torres.

He also partnered with Yeshiva University's Wurzweiler School of Social Work to announce a 'Care Café,' a free psycho-educational presentation that will focus on trauma response and community healing methods.

Growing up, Junior had dreamed of being a police detective, since January he had enrolled in the NYPD Explorers program in the 45th Pre

Sepulveda: Bring Ocasio-Cortez and establishment together

Democrats around the Bronx are still picking up their own proverbial jaws after Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez stunned the political world with her upset victory over 10-term incumbent Congressman Joe Crowley.

The election left many speechless, including Congressman Eliot Engel and Councilmember Ritchie Torres, whom both had no comment when asked about Ocasio-Cortez' affect to establishment Democrats.

Meanwhile, on the other side of the East River in Queens on that fateful Tuesday night, Crowley faced the music that his political career was for the time being on hold, by signing tunes to his supporters, while strumming his guitar.

Crowley later released a statement congratulating Ocasio-Cortez, stating, "I look forward to supporting her and all Democrats this November...This is why we must come together. We will only be able to stop Donald Trump and the Republican Congress by working together as a united Democratic Party."

As far as coming together goes, Senator Luis Sepulveda, whom had supported Crowley, speedily worked his way over to the Ocasio-Cortez victory party in Parkchester to congratulate the democratic-socialist on making history.

"This 28-year-old novice's unique campaign, reaching out with social media across a wide demographic audience with her progressive platform, created a new political lesson for the books. As a dedicated progressive, I am pleased that my agenda of social reform and equality so closely reflects her own agenda," said Sepulveda, who just like Ocasio-Cortez, supported Bernie Sanders during his White House bid in 2016.

While Sepulveda is unsure if Ocasio-Cortez is interested in joining the Bronx Democratic Party, he does want to bring the establishment and progressive sides of the Democratic Party together.

"There has to be an effort on both sides, we should work beyond labels here, sitting down and having a fair and open discussion because at the end of the day you will see that the two movements do have a lot in common," Sepulveda said.

Ocasio-Cortez turned to said powerhouse social media presence as an alternative to major advertisements that were out of her campaign's miniscule budget.

Despite being outspent 18 to 1 per vote by Crowley, her innovative, 'community run' campaign did the job.

Ocasio-Cortez' stunning upset has attracted the attention of national media.

Her campaign narrative of being a 'Bronx girl' is being challenged by many news outlets.

At the age of 4 her family moved to Westchester County. Her father, an architect, purchased a modest home in Yorktown Heights, and its clear that Ocasio-Cortez graduated from Yorktown Heights High School.

She attended Boston University, where she had the opportunity to do humanitarian work in West Africa. She also interned for late Senator Ted Kennedy.

It wasn't until she was 26 that Ocasio-Cortez made her return to the Bronx.

In response to those questioning her credentials as a socialist, she shot back on Twitter "Growing up, it was a good town for working people. My mom scrubbed toilets so I could live here & I grew up seeing how the zip code one is born in determines much of their opportunity."

"I chose to move back to the Bronx," Ocasio-Cortez said.

She bartended and waited tables after her father's death during late 2000s. A former co-worker charged her with gloaming tips at a Cinco de Mayo party at the bar she worked at in 2017, Flats Fix, according to a report in the NY Post.

Come this November, Ocasio-Cortez will face 71-year-old Republican candidate Anthony Pappas in the general election.

Legion Triangle receives fanfare after its renovation

The newly reconstructed Legion Triangle is welcoming City Islanders and visitors alike, with a patriotic salute.

"The triangle size was expended to improve pedestrian and vehicular ciruclation and to better accommodate war memorials sponsored for decades by American Legion Post 156," said a NYC Department of Transportation spokes-

The project was part of the NYC DOT construction project on the City Island bridge, with the triangle located on the island side of the bridge.

With construction on the Legion Triangle starting in the winter of 2017, the project was completed in time for Memorial Day remembrance celebrations

Since then, both the veteran and City Island community have praised the renovations.

"It looks way better than we expected it to," said Peter Del Debbio, commander of the American Legion Leonard H. Hawkins Post 156 on City Island.

Del Debbio said he recalled looking at the initial blueprints DOT presented to them and their main concern was for space for the existing monuments and new space added for future monuments to be added

With the additional square footage, Del Debbio said his American Legion post thought about adding monuments to soldiers involved in the global war on terror as well soldiers involved in the Iraq, Afghanistan and Syria conflicts.

Aside from the obvious size difference, one of the new aspects of the triangle is that it is accessible and has a path that cuts through the center for people to go through and look at the monu-

The path and accessibility ramps. which connect to three crosswalks, one to the bridge, one to City Island Avenue and one to Bridge Street, has also provided an element of safety for pedestrians and cyclists approaching that intersection.

Bordering the path in the triangle is a long granite seatwall, which is now used for those to sit and reflect on the monuments or simply enjoy the warm

"The construction on the triangle caused a lot of traffic congestion, but it came out really nice," said City Island resident John Kehley while sitting on the granite slab for the first.

Aside from those who sit at the triangle, neighbors of it can enjoy the additional green relief it provides, as various plantings of flowers, bushes and shrubs also decorate the space on either side of the path.

"It used to look a little abandoned, but now it's awesome," said Jesse Cintron who lives across the street from the triangle and was outside chatting with his neighbors about the completed project.

The initial triangle was erected more than 70 years ago and prior to its renovation was not accessible and was bordered by a rope fence, according to Del Debbio.

During the preliminary stages of the construction planning phase of the new triangle many City Island residents were concerned about traffic patterns changing, specifically the ability to turn left onto Bridge Street from City

That issue was resolved before construction began in 2017.

CB10 approves DOT's Westchester Square Plaza plan



A plan to construct Westchester Square Plaza was officially approved by Community Board 10.

After a public hearing on the plaza on Wednesday, June 27, the board voted in favor of the NYC Department of Transportation proposal to transform the southwest corner of Westchester and East Tremont avenues into a pedestrian plaza.

"We want people and the merchants to give it a chance," said CB10 district manager, Matt Cruz after the vote.

The new plaza would replace the existing triangle-shaped traffic island that currently provides a slipway for vehicles traveling east on Westchester Avenue, to turn southbound to East Tremont Avenue.

The DOT plan would enlarge the pedestrian area by removing the slipway and the parking spaces in front of the City Marshal's Office, Beyond Barber Academy, William's Café, NY Bronx Pizza, and the U.S. Army Career Center to make the plaza area twice the size and connected to the East Tremont sidewalk.

Expanding this pedestrian area would shorten the crosswalk distance between that corner and the Westchester Square IRT #6 train station and the north west side of East Tremont.

It's design would look similar to other plazas the DOT has designed around the city, which layers a light-colored gravel material on the street to denote the pedestrian section and bordered by flexible delineators, planters, and granite blocks.

The plaza would be a public space and will have removable tables and chairs. The maintenance, security and uses of the plaza would be entirely up to the Westchester Square Business Improvement District.

Director of the BID, Lisa Sorin, said the goal of the plaza would be to draw more business to the stores that exist in the building at that southern corner.

Sorin explained the corner-most building burned down about 10 years ago and after it was rebuilt, the landlord was concerned about the lack of pedestrians on that side of the street.

Most of the merchants are looking forward to the implementation of the plaza.

Miguel Rosales, owner of the William's Café said the plaza would directly help his 3-year-old business, because it would give his customers the option to eat outdoors in the nicer weather.

"When people see our customers eating outside, they'll be more interested to order our food, too," said Rosales.

The owner of Beyond Barber Academy, Rosie Medina, said the plaza would help the business by giving it more outdoor space to do marketing, as well as providing more space to cut hair.

"We've thought about putting a tent out front to offer free haircuts to people walking by," said Medina as she explained her school often does free outdoor haircuts when she and her students are invited to public street festivals.

Opponents of the plaza don't believe the plaza will be utilized the way the BID and DOT predict, and will cost them four parking spaces.

However, DOT said the parking spaces would not be lost.

Instead the four spots would be moved to the right of White Castle, where the NYC Department of Education parking starts.

In addition there is concern the plaza would attract more loitering.

Construction of the plaza is expected to start at the end of the summer and completed before school returns.

As Bronx gun violence spikes, communities are up in arms

Warmer weather spelled out a great deal of trouble for some Bronx neighborhoods. An influx of gun violence and shootings has risen around the borough in recent weeks.

The Highbridge community endured two major shootings in a span of just days in early June.

A double shooting that injured a 13-year-old girl occurred at the Nelson Playground cornering East 166th Street on Thursday, June 7, while a quadruple drive-by shooting took place two blocks away near the intersection of East 166th Street and Summit Avenue just days following on Tuesday, June 12.

The appalled community organized a rally and gun violence awareness walk between the two sites on Tuesday, June 19. Councilmembers Vanessa Gibson and Diana Ayala led the charge on the two-block walk between sites, speaking about how gun violence affected them not only as representatives but as people too.

"This is a really personal is-

sue for me, I witnessed gun violence for the first time when I was five years old and I can tell you I will never forget it and I'm going to be 45 this year," Ayala told the crowd. "When I was 16, I lost my son's father to gun violence. Because of this senseless violence my son grew up without his father, all

because someone stepped on a pair of sneakers," she said.

Ayalya pointed out that the funding in the newly-passed city budget will be targeted to resisting gun violence and to trauma care to aid victims.

"We want to show that we're normal people opposing gun violence that want a save

community," said Gabriela Silverio, one of the walk's organizers with the organization Bridge Builders Community Partnership. "Our community has a lot of positive things to give and we want that to be seen," she added.

do something, we recognize large.

that we have to be aggressive in our approach, we've been working with the 44th Precinct a great deal but everyone has to take a hold and responsibility for what's happening in our community," said Gibson.

"We also want to be a resource of information which is why we've brought together so many community organizations for this walk, we wanted to get together and say no more, we denounce violence in any forms, we want to prevent the next time, we want to prevent the next victim before it happens," the councilmember added.

Gibson mentioned that much of the Highbridge violence comes from those living outside of the community.

Sadly enough, just two days after the walk and rally, a lethal triple shooting claimed the lives of three during the morning hours Thursday, June 21 in Castle Hill. One of the victims was an innocent bystander.

Happy 54th birthday

Dear editor,

Happy 54th birthday to Bronx public transportation.

July, 2017 marks the anniversary of federal government support for public transportation. The success of public transportation can be traced back to one of the late President Lyndon Johnson's greatest accomplishments which continues benefiting many Americans today. On July 9, 1964 he signed the 'Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964' into law. Subsequently this has resulted in the investment over time of several hundred billion dollars into public transportation.

Millions of Americans including many residing in the Bronx today on a daily basis utilize various public transportation alternatives. They include local and express bus, ferry, jitney, light rail, subway

and commuter rail services. All of these systems use less fuel and move far more people than conventional single occupancy vehicles. Most of these systems are funded with your tax dollars thanks to President Johnson.

Depending upon where you live, consider the public transportation alternative. Try riding a local or express bus, commuter van, ferry, light rail, commuter rail or subway.

Most have forgotten that up until the 60s, bus drivers made change and drove the bus at the same time. Nobody would dare bring soda or food on the bus or leave any litter behind.

Fast forward to today. Fortunately we have the Metropolitan Transportation and its various Authority operating agencies, including NYC Transit subway and bus, Metro North Rail Road, Long Island Rail Road, Staten Island Rapid Transit Authority, MTA Bus and Westchester Bee Line Bus.

Using MTA Metro Cards provides free transfers between the subway and bus. This has eliminated the old two fare zones making public transportation an even better bargain. Purchasing a monthly Metro North Rail Road or MTA subway/bus pass reduces the cost per ride and provides virtually unlimited trips.

Elected officials and government employees can turn in their taxpayers funded vehicles and join the rest of us by using public transportation to get around town. In many cases, employers can offer transit checks which help subsidizes a portion of the costs. Utilize this and reap the benefits. It supports a cleaner environment.

Many employers now allow employees to telecommute and work from home.

Others use alternative work schedules which afford staff the ability to avoid rush hour gridlock. This saves travel time and can improve

mileage per gallon. Join a car or van pool to share the costs of commuting.

The ability to travel from home to workplace, school, shopping, entertainment, medical, library etc. is a factor when moving to a new neighborhood. Economically successful communities are not 100% dependent on automobiles as the sole means of mobility. Seniors, students, low and middle income people need these transportation alternatives. Investment in public transportation today contributes to economic growth, employment and a stronger economy. Dollar for dollar, it is one of the best investments we can make.

Additional ferry-stop push for Throggs Neck

Advocates are pushing for ferry service to a second transit-starved east Bronx community.

Ferry service is on the cusp of coming to Soundview this summer, with the Metropolitan Transportation Authority announcing recently that Bx 27 bus service is being expanded to service the Soundview Ferry.

When the ferry opens in Clason Point Park, it will be the first in the borough in recent times, and it already has transit advocates requesting that the line be expanded eastward to Ferry Point Park in Throggs Neck.

After a request for another stop on the same line servicing Soundview was left out of the final FY 2019 city budget, Councilman Mark Gjonaj banded together with colleagues to sponsor legislation that would bring additional ferry stops linking Ferry Point Park to Midtown and the Financial District in Manhattan.

Gjonaj was joined by As-

semblyman Michael Benedetto the day after the proposed legislation was introduced in the City Council at a press conference on Friday, June 29.

The councilman, surrounded by a group supporting the idea, called on the administration to give commuters a faster link to and from Manhattan.

"Just last month, the city announced that it would spend an additional \$300 million to increase ferry capacity, fix existing piers and docks, and a second maintenance port," said Gjonaj. "But somehow, they couldn't find the resources to bring ferry service to these underserved communities. This is unacceptable."

Bringing a ferry to the park would be a common sense approach to solving transportation issues and could turn a two-fare zone into a one-fare zone into Manhattan, said Benedetto.

"It is a no-brainer and I cannot comprehend why the city did not put in their proposal extending the service from

Soundview into Ferry Point Park," said Benedetto.

The assemblyman added: "If you put it in Ferry Point Park, where there's access to a highway and a parking lot, people would come from all over and hop on the ferry to Manhattan."

The plan would keep traffic off overcrowded roads and subways, and make for a faster and enjoyable trip to Manhattan, said Benedetto, adding it could spur economic development in the area. The assemblyman said that the city has a

world-class public golf course at Ferry Point that could be serviced by the ferry.

Benedetto also said that he could envision a scenario in which the park itself was made a destination around the ferry stop, with various attractions.

The councilman believes that the necessary infrastructure for a ferry could be put into place, he said.

Local ferry advocate Dotti Poggi said that a ferry historically serviced the park location, and a recently completed comfort station on the park's west side would be a plus for the proposal.

She also said the Q 44 bus, which runs to West Farms, and the Q 50 coming from Coop City both stop near the park and their routes could be easily reconfigured to service the ferry stop.

Councilman Ritchie Torres, who grew up in Throggs Neck, is one of the bill's co-sponsors.

"I'm absolutely in support of the Bronx getting its fair share of more transportation options, including ferry service," said Torres

man Gjonaj to introduce another piece of legislation, the Micro-Business Transparency Act.

The bill would define a 'micro-business' as a locally owned company with 10 or fewer employees. The measure would also require the city's Department of Small Business Services to conduct an annual survey to identify micro-businesses and the economic sectors in which they predominate to enable the city to develop programs to assist those that are struggling to keep their doors open.

Factors like the presence of national big-box stores, the rise of Internet shopping and escalating taxes and fees have played a role in the increased hardships many small businesses face, according to Gjonaj who chairs the City Council's Small Business Committee.

"The first step in protecting our local mom-and-pop shops is to identify exactly who they are, to develop solutions specific to their needs," he said at the rally.

The Bronx in particular has seen first hand the physi-

cal effects of the new age of business, as the borough has long been considered to far outnumber Manhattan in the number of mom-and-pop

shops.

The increasing number of vacant store fronts in the once economically rich commercial corridors like East Tremont, City Island and Jerome avenues, Westchester Square, and White Plains Road in the last 10 years has surprised both Bronxites and visitors

Census data tells us that 50 percent of all new small businesses in the city close by the fifth year of operation, although businesses with fewer than 10 workers account for 80 percent of all jobs created in the city, according to a handout sheet provided by Gjonaj.

In addition to the bill, Gjonaj said a long-sought hearing for another bill to help mom-and-pops — the Small Business Jobs Survival Act — will be held by his committee this month.

The SBJSA would guarantee all commercial tenants the right to negotiate fair lease terms, the right to renew leases for a minimum of 10 years, an end to oppressive landlord 'pass-along' costs to commercial tenants, and a right to arbitration to stop 'rent-gouging.'

Advocates of the SBJSA led a smaller, quieter rally on the south side of the City Hall Plaza holding signs that called on the mayor and Corey Johnson to support an 'intact' SBJSA.

They argue that laws, not tax breaks, were the answer to saving small businesses.



Couple teams up on bariatric surgery and weight loss

For one Bronx couple, weight loss is truly a team effort.

Married couple Latoya Taylor-Martinez and Terrance Martinez of Soundview have together lost a total of over 160 pounds several months after having bariatric surgery at a local hospital and making changes in their life-

Taylor-Martinez said that she and her husband both underwent bariatric surgery, a procedure that shrinks the stomach by over 70 percent at Jacobi Medical Center around Valentine's

Dr. Ajay Chopra, chief of minimally invasive and bariatric surgery at Jacobi, said the surgery reduces hormonal impulses to eat, and along with lifestyle changes, will typically over time reduce the weight of those who undergo the procedure.

It was the first case he has seen of a husband and a wife having the surgery on the same day, according to Chopra.

It is fairly common for partners to both have the surgery, but typically one does the procedure first and then the other follows, said Chopra.

"We wanted to do it together," said Taylor-Martinez, adding "He could be my biggest support and I could be

Taylor-Martinez said that going through with the procedure simultaneously helped them ease some of the concerns that accompany any surgery that features general anesthesia.

She said that after attending educational workshops on bariatric surgery, they believed they were making the best decision for their family, including four children and two foster children.

diet and eating habits changed...it is like we are all on this journey together," said Taylor-Martinez of life after the surgery, explaining

that the entire family has cut out fried and fast foods, and exercises together at a nearby park.

When the couple completes their weigh loss journey and are at healthy weights, they are going to renew their wedding vows, she said.

In 2006, when they married, she explained, they didn't look the way they wanted to look and could not have the kind of wedding they envisioned.

"Now we can have the wedding of our dreams," said Taylor-Martinez.

According to Chopra, bariatric surgery is usually performed on patients who are morbidly obese, typically those weighing 100 pounds or more over their ideal body weight with or without complications, and sometimes less if they have medical conditions.

Patients who have the surgery, which can now be done in minimally invasive ways through small keyhole cuts, oftentimes suffer from medical conditions associated with obesity including diabetes, hypertension, sleep apnea and high cholesterol, said

Sleeve Gastrectomy, which is the most popular procedure under the bariatric surgery umbrella, takes a stomach that is in the shape of a large pineapple and cuts it into the shape of a banana, said Chopra.

'There is less space in the stomach to hold food," he said.

Another type of surgery known as Gastric Bypass, which has been performed for over 30 years, creates a smaller stomach with a staple. This leads to hormonal changes that decrease hunger.

Gastric Bypass is especially helpful in resolving Type 2 Diabetes, said Chopra, with 85 percent of the patients with the condition who undergo the surgery eventually no longer requiring any medicine, said Chopra.

Bronx Day In Albany 'Historical Powerhouse' awardee: J. L. Mott

The J. L. Mott Iron Works was the recepient of the Bronx Business Hall of Fame 'Historical Powerhouse' award at this vear's Bronx Day In Albany. The Bronx County Historical Society's Angel Hernandez did a wonderful presentation on the awardee during the 'Made In The Bronx' exhibition. The society has provided the Bronx Times Reporter with a piece written about the foundry by Professor Lloyd Ultan, Bronx Historian in 2010.

One of the mostly littleknown people whose actions changed the course of Bronx history is Jordan L. Mott.

His name is preserved in Mott Haven and in a middle school on 167th Street and Morris Avenue. What did he do to deserve these honors?

Jordan L. Mott was born in 1798 in Manhasset, Long Island. Growing up, he displayed a facility for inventing things.

About 1820, he designed a new type of stove that used anthracite coal (the most cleanburning type) instead of wood. But he could not interest the iron founders of the day to produce and sell his new-fangled idea. He decided to go into the iron foundry business him-

Mott experimented with techniques to improve iron quality and manufacture, obtaining more patents for stove improvements than anyone

From 1832 to 1857, he patented stove grates, furnaces, cooking ranges, fireplaces, bathtubs, cauldrons and bathroom plumbing fixtures.

After beginning his J.L. Mott Iron Works in NYC in 1828, Mott needed more room to expand his foundry as his business rapidly grew.

In 1841, he purchased land from the Morris family.

The property north of the Harlem River and west of today's Third Avenue had been

part of the old colonial manor of Morrisania, but was renamed Mott Haven.

He erected simple houses near his foundry for his workers to inhabit, and also more elaborate residences further away for those with more money.

Mott also reasoned that other manufacturers would be looking for land there, and he projected Mott Haven as what would be called today an in-

Mott also donated a strip for the right of way for the New York and Harlem River Railroad to provide access.

He also dug the Mott Haven Canal (now Canal Place) for barges to deliver coal and wood, thus making the canal a site for coal and lumber companies.

In addition, Mott aided a group of skilled workmen to purchase more Morrisania land upon which to create a suburban village that would much to change the Bronx.

enable them to live in the country and commute to the city by railroad. That village is today's Morrisania neighborhood.

Mott thus was the father of modern manufacturing in the Bronx, making the area attractive to other industries.

He was also the man primarily responsible for creating two of the borough's neigh-

The silent disease by Healthy Seniors CliCC

Osteoporosis is a disease that weakens bones to the point where they break easily. It is often called the "silent disease" because you may not notice any changes until a bone breaks.

Osteoporosis is more common in women, but men also have this disease. The risk of osteoporosis grows as you get older. At the time of menopause, women may lose bone quickly for several years. After that, the loss slows down but continues. In men, the loss of bone mass is slower, but by age 65 or 70, men and women lose bone at the same rate.

The good news is there are things you can do to prevent weakened bones:

- Eat foods rich in calcium and vitamin D.
- Include regular weight-bearing exercise in your lifestyle.
 - · If you smoke, stop.
- Limit how much alcohol you drink.

Your bones and muscles will be stronger if you are physically active. Weight-bearing exercises, done three to four times a week, are best for

preventing osteoporosis. Walking, jogging, playing tennis and dancing are examples of weightbearing exercises. Try some strengthening and balance exercises too. Here are two examples:

Hand Grip

This exercise should help if you have trouble picking things up or holding them. It will help you open things like jars and bottles. And, you can do it while reading or watching TV.

- 1. Hold a tennis ball or other small rubber or foam ball in one hand.
- 2. Slowly squeeze the ball as hard as you can and hold it for 3-5 seconds.
- 3. Relax the squeeze slowly.
 - 4. Repeat 10-15 times.
- 5. Repeat 10-15 times with other hand.
- 6. Repeat 10-15 times more with each hand.

Heel-to-Toe Walk

Having good balance is important for avoiding falls.

1. Position the heel of one foot just in front of the toes of the other foot. Your heel and toes should touch or almost touch.

- 2. Choose a spot ahead of you and focus on it to keep you steady as you walk.
- 3. Take a step. Put your heel just in front of the toe of your other foot
 - 4. Repeat for 20 steps.

If you feel unsteady, do this exercise near a wall so you can steady yourself.



Message from Councilman Mark Gjonaj

During last week's City Council meeting I introduced the Micro-Business Transparency Act (Intro 1000), a piece of legislation that would define the term 'microbusiness' as a business that is independently owned and operated, not dominant in its field, with nine or fewer full-time employees or full-time equivalent employees.

In addition to defining what microbusiness is the bill would also require the city's Department of Small Business Services to conduct an annual survey to identify micro-businesses and their sectors to enable the city to come to develop programs to assist those that are struggling to keep their doors open.

This bill is needed because the

mom-and-pop shops that served as anchors to our communities, the stores where you knew the owner and she knew you, and the stores where the entire neighborhood hung out are being replaced by big-box national retailers that have no tie to our community.

A sense of community is what makes the Bronx special. We can't lose that. We must hold on to it.

Despite the fact that local momand-pop shops with less than ten employees are responsible for 80% of jobs in our city, we still do not have a definition for what it means to be a microbusiness. The local neighborhood shops that were once the backbone and engine of our economy are being replaced by empty store fronts that are eye sores and signal a neighborhood decline and declining real estate values.

The Micro-Business Transparency Act will help us identify our local mom-and-pop shops in order to better tailor programs and initiatives to match their needs and help them thrive once again.

American politics has taken a worrisome turn. Those knowledgeable of history will recognize the pattern as one replayed in societies that have devolved from democratic principles into totalitarian regimes.

There are several basic, familiar principles at play: the use or threat of force against rivals, the misuse of governmental powers for partisan political purposes, the disregard for accuracy and truth in public discourse, and finally and most importantly, contempt for basic and fundamental laws.

At times, some of these come into play simultaneously, as it has in the recent actions by a protestor against Homeland Security head Kirstjen M. Nielsen. Allison Hrabar, an Obama-appointed paralegal at the Department of Justice, drove her from a restaurant. (later, the protest extend to Secretary Nielsen's home.) The confrontation, according to the perpetrator, was in response to Admin-

istration actions separating some children from illegal alien parents. In reality, that policy was one also carried out during the Obama Administration. Indeed, some of the inflammatory photos published to illustrate the actions against the Trump White House were actually taken during Obama's presidency. But the truth apparently didn't matter, either to the protester, or to either the media or opposition politicians who are content to ignore the reality that this practice, which they did not object to during the prior administration, was not created by the current White House.

The threat of force by those opposed to Trump's candidacy and subsequent presidency has been a constant. During the campaign, protesters sought to physically block access to his rallies and events, and after election day, engaged in violent actions in several cities, including Washington, D.C. during his inauguration. Response by media, ac-

ademia, and key Democrats, all of whom should have condemned the violence (even if they agreed with political views of the participants) has been inappropriately sympathetic.

Disregard for the law by those meant to administer it has also been largely conducted by the American left, both in the courts and in the halls of government. The IRS's overtly and obviously illegal actions against the Tea Party have gone unpunished. The Federal Bureau of Investigations' stunning bias in the 2016 campaign, which included the refusal to prosecute Hillary Clinton either for her email abuses or for her role in the sale of uranium to the Russians (in return for 'contributions' to her foundation) and the acceptance of individual agents of cash and

jobs for family members during that time period from the Clinton campaign and its allies is only now approaching the question of legal accountability.

That last line of the defense of freedom, the legal system, has also at times and in some areas fallen under the sway of left-wing partisanship. Ninth Circuit judges have issued a number of rulings which are based solely on their personal political views, disregarding the Constitution, existing statutes, and legal precedent. A number of leftist attorneys general have engaged in harassing actions against political opponents, attacks not based on their targets' violating any actual law but merely for having a different point of view. (Former Attorney General Loretta Lynch changed the legal paradigm for the worse when she openly considered prosecuting individuals merely for disagreeing with President Obama on climate change.)

Many of these rather bla-

tant abuses could not have been perpetrated without the willing assistance of a media that remains furious over its inability to persuade the public to agree with its hard-left positions. It has responded by covering up the misdeeds of those it favors and conjuring up untruthful narratives about those it opposes.

After the first two years of the Obama Administration, in which Democrats controlled both houses of Congress, a clearly disenchanted public removed the left from power first in the House, then the Senate, and finally, the White House. Along the way, Republicans also gained control of most state legislatures and governorships.

Failure at the ballot box led the left to abandon fair play, civil discourse and the law, replacing those virtues with violence, emotional appeals based on false narratives, and manipulation of the bureaucracy.

The world has seen this before, and the results have been disastrous.

Weekly insurance tips from John Cerini

Do you have Life Insurance? Are you covered through your employer? Do you know what type of life insurance you have, and when it expires? Do you have family or loved ones you would like to protect financially in the event something should happen to you? Keep in mind the cost of inflation as years would go on after you pass. The purpose of life insurance is to make sure that those who are dependent on you financially would not suffer in the event of your sudden passing. For example, I have four beautiful children. I would want to make sure that they can all attend the college of their choice without being a financial burden on my wife when I am gone. This is one of my many financial goals I would like to have achieved in the event of my passing. Most people would automatically say they would like to have their mortgage paid off upon their passing. These and many other reasons, are why you need life insurance. Life insurance premiums are based on your age, sex and health conditions. Based on your life expectancy, the insurance companies would calculate an annual price for you to pay for the death benefit protection.

There are many types of life insurance policies you can purchase. However, for the sake of this column I will only cover a few which are most common. We will cover the following types of polices: Term (most common). Return of Premium. Whole Life, and Universal Life. Please keep in mind, if you are covered by your employer, the policy usually terminates along with your employent. Therefore, if you quit, get fired, or retire, you will have no coverage at all. Therefore you should always look to get the coverage placed outside your employment. If you have had a loved one pass away and are not sure if they had a life insurance policy. there is a website you can go to and request from New York state a search for any policies which may have been active on the date your loved one passed away. This website address is https://www.dfs.ny.gov/consumer/ lost_policy_find.htm

Term Life insurance is coverage for a specific term of time. You can usually purchase term insurance for 10, 15 20, 25 or 30 years and lock in the price for that term. Depending on your age, you may not qualify for a 30-year term. This type of policy is the most basic and is purely a protection policy. The premiums will be the lowest of all type of life insurance. There are two results, either you pass away and your family gets the death benefit, or you live the entire term and you get no benefit. With this type of policy there is no cash value to the policy. This type of policy is usually a good solution for someone with a 30-year mortgage. You take out the policy with the goal that should you pass, your spouse can pay off the mortgage. If you feel that life insurance is just too expensive and you can't afford any other type of insurance, then start off with a minimal term life policy. You can always add to your coverage later. However, you will have to be underwritten by the company all over again based on your age at that time. Some Term insurance policies have a convertible rider option. This means, you can convert any portion of your term insurance coverage from term to whole life without any medical exams. This is a great feature because based on your medical you may not qualify for the coverage in the future. For example, if you develop diabetes or a heart condition. If you purchase term, it is important to note that after the term period is over, your coverage stops, and if you want to purchase it again your price will be based on your age and health condition at that time. Usually the renewal will be four to five times the premium it used to be.

Whole Life Insurance is more of an investment tool while serving as a life insurance policy as well. If you die, your loved ones will get the death benefit, while if you live the investment should continue to grow each year. Whole Life Insurance has a benefit that it will last your entire life till age 99. The price also never increases. So, you get the benefit of having a life insurance policy well beyond the maximum of the 30-year term, and having the peace of mind to know your price will not change in years to come. This is a great tool for someone to purchase when they are very young. For example, you can purchase this insurance for your children or grandchildren, then when they turn 21 you turn the policy over to them with an extremely low premium which they will be able to afford easily because you had financial wisdom to start it when they were young. Another benefit of the whole life policy is that you can borrow from it if you need money in an emergency. The down side to this type of policy is that the premiums can usually be double or trip the price for the same coverage as the term insurance. Some financial advisors will suggest you purchase term insurance and take the difference in the whole life cost and invest it in to other markets so that you can control your own money.

The best of both worlds when it comes to Life Insurance is known as Return of Premium (ROP) This policy is very appealing because you can have a low premium due to the fact that this a 'Term' policy, but it has the savings feature of the 'Whole-Life' which is not typical of the term policy model. Basically, if you die your beneficiary will get paid the death benefit of the policy. However, should you live the entire term of the policy, you will get all your money back. Usually with no interest or dividends, however you will get your investment back. For example: You purchase a 30-year return of premium policy for \$500,000 death benefit at an annual rate of \$1,000 per year. After year thirty, you are still alive and will receive a check from the insurance company for \$30,000 This is very appealing to consumers who don't want to feel like they are throwing their money away. The price will be a hybrid of the regular term and the whole life policy because of the refund feature. Universal Life is another form of

permanent coverage. This life insurance will provide a death benefit and a cash value component just like the whole life insurance where the funds can grow tax-deferred. Universal life insurance is more flexible than whole life coverage. Simply put this is because the policy allows the policy holder more flexibility to choose how much of his or her premium dollars will go towards the policy's death benefit, and how much will go towards the policy's present cash value. When we refer to the word permanent in life insurance, this indicates the entire duration of your life, not just the short 'term' as in term insurance. Since universal life is a permanent life insurance policy, the policyholders retain access to their cash value account. So, just as with a whole life plan, the cash can be borrowed or withdrawn for any reason - including paying off debt, supplementing retirement income, or even going on a vacation. Univer-

sal life will be a permanent option, however the prices can change year after year, unlike whole-life.

While we don't have time to cover the other types of life insurance policies within the space of this article, you are encouraged to contact your life insurance representative or financial advisor and discuss all your options. Many people who reach retirement age and have the annuity options for their spouses, may opt to have not beneficiary of the pension, and purchase a life insurance on themselves to cover their spouses in the event of their passing. This is a common strategy used by many. However please talk to your financial advisors to make sure this is the right decision for your family. For many Seniors, you have seen the commercials on TV that you can purchase life insurance for pennies a day. This is very low death benefit coverage, barely enough to cover your burial expenses. You need to plan in advance when you are younger so that your family can have a larger death benefit and will be able to live comfortably and not have to continue working late into their retirement because the bread winner of the house did not plan in advance.

We can all agree that death is not a conversation we all like to talk about. However, it is a mandatory conversation you need to talk about. Don't leave your loved ones holding the heavy financial burden of mortgages, students, medical bill, etc. If you have children, you need to have life insurance. If you own a home or other valuable assets, you need to have life insurance. If you are married, you need to have life insurance. Don't be foolish and say, "I can't afford life insurance". ICE Agents Brandishing **Guns Detain RWDSU** Members - Who is Next?

or RWDSU members, the real-world effects of the Trump Administration's almost incomprehensibly cruel focus came into startling view on June 20. At a time when the world was voicing outrage about families being separated at the southern U.S. border, another shocking

miscarriage of justice occurred further north in Ohio. At a Fresh Mark meat processing plant, 146 hard-working RWDSU members were detained and separated from their families during a raid by gun-toting ICE agents.

During what had been a normal workday, workers suddenly found themselves violently shoved to the ground and handcuffed in an egregious, disturbing show of force. Witnesses likened it to a terrorist attack.

Over 100 children in the community suddenly found out a parent wasn't coming home. One hundred forty-six workers who pay their taxes, put in an honest day's work, and contribute to their communities did not go home that night.

And for what?

The community, and the country, is zero percent safer. A busy meat processing plant has suddenly lost a large portion of its reliable workforce and production has been severely disrupted. Families have been torn apart to the detriment of the community. The Trump Administration has pointlessly created a humanitarian and possibly economic crisis in Ohio.

Our union, the RWDSU, is stepping up to help RWDSU members and their families. A task force, including lawyers and worker representatives, was immediately dispatched to Ohio to defend the workers and help aid families with basic necessities including food, diapers, and simply connecting frightened children and spouses with their detained loved ones, many of whom still have not been located.

While our immediate focus is on the events in Ohio, it's clear that this raid and the other events of the past weeks and months raise many troubling issues. With President Trump calling for the illegal, unconstitutional action of deporting immigrants without their dueprocess rights, who is next? It could be your neighbors, or even your family members.

It's striking to see these troubling events occur so close to the July 4 holiday. This is not what America – a land of opportunity that is based upon principles of justice and equality - is all about.

America has always been about the promise that hard work and honest living can bring people – both those born here and those who immigrated - better lives. The U.S. needs to create a path to citizenship for workers who have been contributing to our economy for decades, and to the hundreds of thousands of Temporary Status Holders who will soon be living in the shadows because Congress and Trump have failed to act on their behalf; our country doesn't need more foreign workers coming in with special questworker visas that condone substandard working conditions. We need to give those already in this country an opportunity to change their status and officially become what many will say they already are: Americans.





Edgar Allan Poe sculpture stands in Poe Park

The Poe Cottage and Poe Park have been undergoing extensive restoration work and will soon be opening to the public. Located on the Grand Concourse between 193rd and 194th Streets, the cottage, tended by the Bronx County Historical Society, is home to a bronze bust of Edgar Allan Poe created by Edmund T. Quinn. The original work of art was created in plaster in 1908. A duplicate bronze bust was donated to the City of New York on January 19, 1909 to honor the centenary of Poe's birth.

The plaster cast of the bust was given to the Poe Museum in 1931 and put on display on the grounds of the cottage. It remained there until 1987 when it must have wandered off because police later found it in a nearby saloon. It was seated on the bar at the aptly named Raven Inn with a beer in front of it along with a copy of Poe's poem "The Spirit of the Dead." The police escorted the Poe sculpture back to his cottage on the Concourse and there it remained until it was replaced with a bronze version which was moved inside

the cottage to prevent it from the full size bronze statue of wandering off again. The bust stands 21" high and is mounted on a 6'6" pedestal. The sculpture was fashioned at the Aubry Brothers Foundry and donated by the Bronx Society of Arts and Sciences.

Edmund Thomas Quinn (1868-1929) was a leading sculptor of the day and four of his works adorn the Hall of Fame of Great Americans located at Bronx Community College. They include a bust of Edwin Thomas Booth. Booth was the leading Shakespearean actor of the day who was plagued by the action of his infamous brother, John Wilkes Booth. Nonetheless, he became known as the most popular actor in America. His other works of art at the Hall of Fame include busts of Oliver Wendell Holmes, James Kent and John Quincy Adams, our sixth president.

Edwin Booth dressed as Hamlet. It was sculpted in 1918 and was commissioned by the Players Club. That club took up residence at Booth's home near Gramercy Park. Perhaps that's why the famed park was chosen as the site of the statue which stands in the center of the park. The park is not open to the public and I've only managed to enter it on one occasion for a close up look.

There is another great work of Quinn's by the pond in Central Park. This bust of Victor Herbert was created in 1927 and was commissioned by ASCAP and unveiled by Herbert's daughter, Ella, on November 29, 1927. One of his earlier works, Figure of a Nymph, resides at the Metropolitan Museum of Art and was created in 1912. He also created the Victory Memorial of World War I in Faneuil His most famous work is Park, New Rochelle in 1921.

Other works can be found throughout the country.

The intriguing fact about Quinn is that he was originally trained as a painter and among his many subjects was Attilio Piccirilli, the fa-

mous sculptor. Attilio lived and shared his studio with his brothers at 467 East 142nd Street here in the Bronx. I often wondered whether that oil painting of Piccirilli led to his interest in sculpting.





Bruce and Howard Bendell, owners of City World Automotive also contributed a generous \$25,000 to the Explorers program in the wake of Junior's passing.

"The most important thing is making the donation, we want to lead by example and hopefully have other businesses step up so we can increase the totals of the money contributed, we want to get the word out," said Bruce Bendell.

It costs about \$500 to cover each child or teen's enrollment in the explorer program, so this contribution alone gives 50 children a free opportunity to join for this summer, as spots are still open.









